who inspected beached Japanese tanker.

Embarked R.M.S. party and proceeded to Credner Is. 17th Located two Japanese mines on beach. Landed R.M.S. party who found mines had already beeen rendered safe. Returned to Rabaul.

Proceeded to Karavia Bay with Commanding Officer 2351 "Barcoo" aboard, who inspected tanker.

23rd Lead Japanese aircraft-carrier and cruiser to respective anchorages in harbour.

Towed water barge out to and watered M.V. "British 24th Ambassador"





Submitted in accordance with N.O.97/43 and C.C.N.O.19/45
2. On 1st January ship arrived at Torokina from Rabaul.
Approx. 24 tons of rice was carried for the Army.

3. Departed on 3rd January with H.M.A.S.Air Faith in tow for Alexishafen, via Jacquinot Bay and Langemak, arriving at Alexishafen on 10th January.

4. From 12th to 31st January ship was at M.L.Repair Base Alexishafen for top overhaul and remedying of various minor defects.

- 5. Health of ship's company is satisfactory; morale could be better than it is at present. As mentioned in my two previous reports, the non payment of hard lying money is a constant source of discontent. No potatoes or fresh vegetables have been obtainable over the past month, but this appears general in the area. The mail position over the past six weeks has been most unsatisfactory and cannot be entirely explained by the fact that the ship has been to Rabaul and back.



MEME GUINEA. Submitted in accordance with NO97/43 and CCNO19/45.

On the 3rd November sailed from Torokina to Langemak via Jacquinot Bay. Cargo was carried from Jacquinot Bay to Gasmata. Arrived Langemak 8th November. Departed 15th arriving Madang following day.

On 16th November Sub Lieutenant W.C. Anderson RANR assumed command vice Lieutenant A.C. McAllister, RANVR.

Since 16th November ship has been in Madang harbour. On 25th November with G.P. V. 953 towed H.M.A.S. "TOLGA" to Alexishafen and back.

Health and morale of ship's company is satisfactory. Discontent is felt that hard lying money is not paid for these craft and it is considered that living conditions are worse than in B class Fairmiles, which are paid this allowance.



Main Engines Very satisfactory W/T satisfactory Auxiliary Batteries - 2 replacements required. Good. However wood borers in main cross beam and one stringer of hold are spreading rapidly. These were in the wood when ship was built. Mr. Garland Commissioned Shipwright, advised that this beam and stringer need replacing, but as it is part of the main structure, local repair facilities are inadequate to remedy defect. Both freshwater tanks are leaking. All seams need welding and tanks need cement washing.

Submitted in accordance with N.O.97/43 and C.C.N.O.19/45

- 2. On 10th Dec. sailed from Madang to Dreger Harbour with cargo, arriving there the following day. Left on 13th Dec. arriving at Madang the following day.
- 3. While returning from Dreger Harbour heavy seas were encountered and approximately 30 sq.ft. of copper sheathing was torn from hull. On 17th Dec. ship was slipped at Alexishafen and sheathing replaced.
- 4. While at Alexishafen part of main cross beam affected by wood borers was cut away and top stringer of port side of hold treated with copper naphthalene. Both fresh water tanks were welded.
- 5. On 20th Dec. sailed for Rabaul via Langemak and Jacquinot Bay, arriving there on the 24th. Cargo for the army was carried from Jacquinot Bay to Rabaul.
- 6. On 29th Dec. sailed from Rabaul for Torokina to tow H.M.A.S.Air Faith to Alexishafen. Returned to Rabaul that night with a sick rating; departed again on 30th arriving at Torokina on 1st Jan. A cargo of rice was carried for the Army.
- 7. Health of ship's company is satisfactory. As mentioned in my last report, discontent is felt with the non-payment of hard lying money for these craft; this has been increased by granting this allowance to M.S.Ls. As these craft are engaged in exactly the same work and living conditions are the same, Navy Board's attitude is considered highly inconsistent and not calculated to inspire confidence or satisfaction with the Service. It is apparent from the fact that men serving in A.M.Ss receive more money than men in these vessels that the living conditions in these ships is not understood by the authorities responsible for withholding this allowance.

 Batteries. W/T satisfactory. Auxiliary Batteries 2 replacements required.
 Hull. Good but starboard fuel tank leaking.
