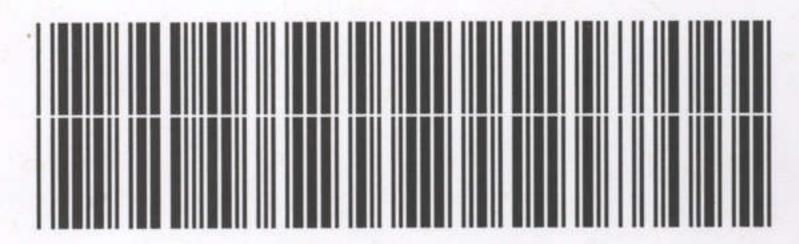

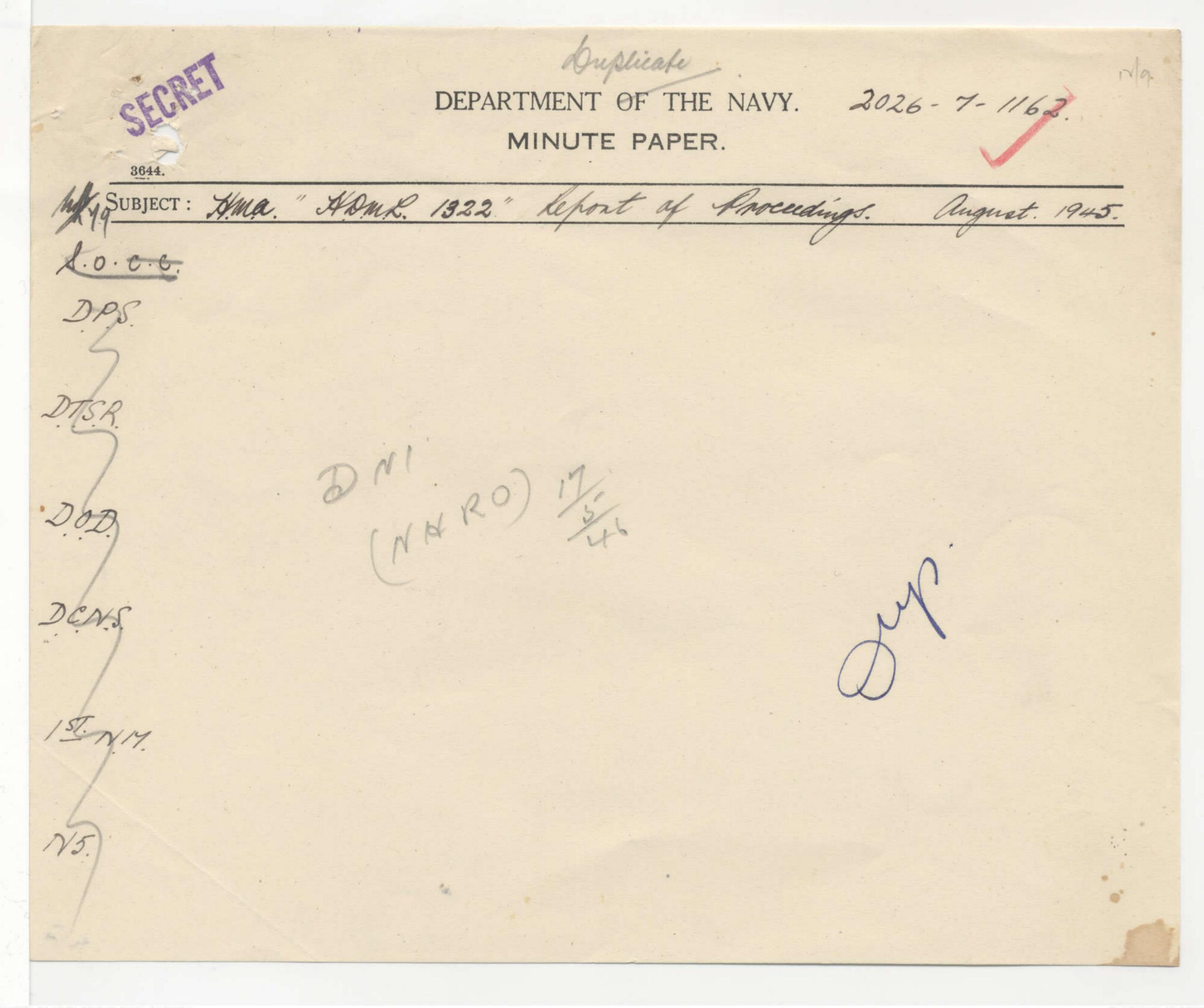

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR AUGUST 1945.

In accordance with C. C. N. O. 97/43 and A. C. B. 0238 Section 2 (4) TReport of Proceedings of H. M. A. " H. D. M. L. 1322" for the month of August.

Darwin Boom Patrol duties were carried out for twenty four hours commencing at 1700ik on the following dates

August 4th., 6th., 9th., 13th. and 17th.

On 11th. August at 1030IK slipped and proceeded with pilot and N. C. S. documents to No. 1 Buoy. At 1200IK embarked pilot onboard U. S. Tanker Cornell and delivered N. C. S. documents. Returned to harbour and secured alongside Main Jetty at 1415IK.

On 19th. August at 0950IK embarked C. S. O. and Captain's Secretary from the Refitting Jetty and proceeded to Darwin Boom for trial Duke and Duchess of Gloucester run. At 1100IK landed party at Main Jetty steps.

On 20th. August commenced engine top overhaul.

On 27th. August top overhaul was completed. Proceeded on engine trials at 1545IK securing alongside Main Jetty at 1630IK. Trials were satisfactory. During top overhaul a party of four ratings were sent on four days leave to Adelaide River. These ratins returned P. M. on the 27th.

The health, welfare and conduct of the Ship's Company have

been good. Full oppurtunities were made of the VP holidays.

The general condition of the ship is good A new Diesel stove was fitted during the overhaul. This stove is now working well, but with present ventilation makes the Messdeck extremely hot.

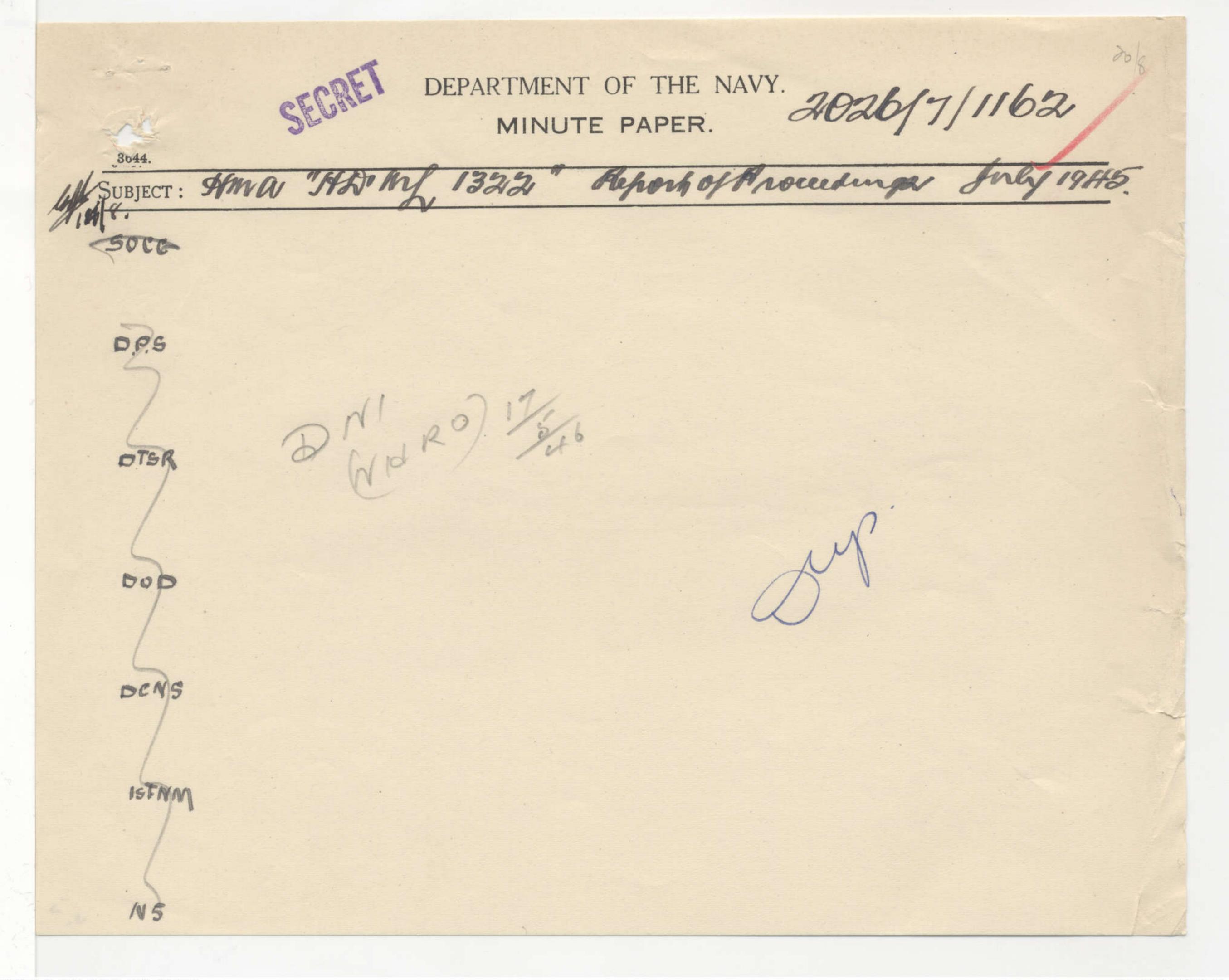

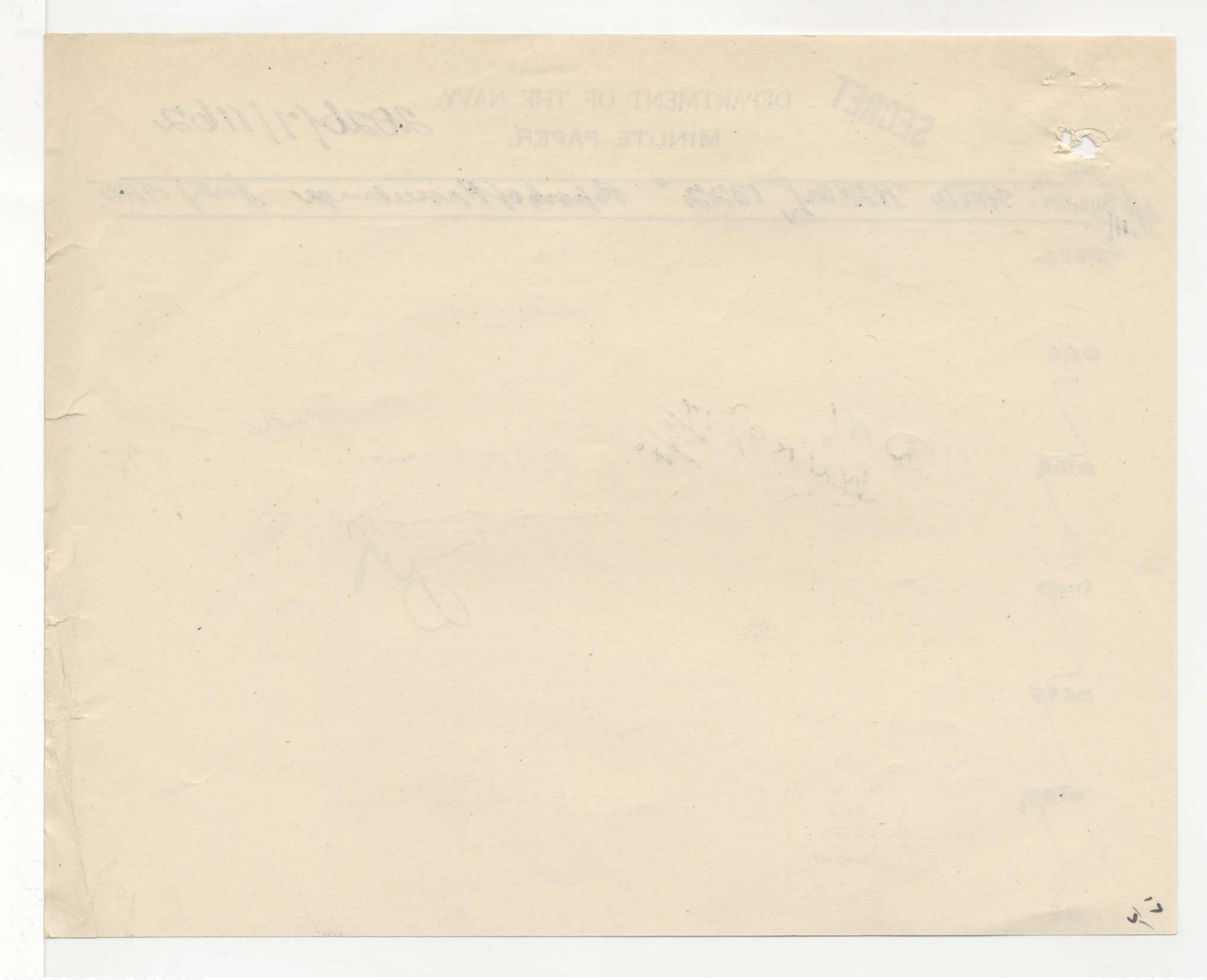

Subject: Report of Proceedings for July 1945.

Submitted:

In accordance with CCNO 97/43 and A.C.B 0238 Sect.2 (4) J Report of Proceedings of HMA ML 1322 for the month of July.

- Darwin boom patrol duties were carried out for 24 hours commencing at 1700IK on the following dates:-July 6th, 10th, 14th, 19th, 24th, 28th, and 30th.
- 3. July 9th. At 0130IK slipped and proceeded to No. 1 buoy with NGS documents for U.S tanker "CROSS KEYS" and "SANDY CREEK". Arrived at No.1 buoy at 0330IK stopped engines and drifted. NCS documents were delivered to the "CROSS KEYS" at 1415 IK. Proceeded to harbour and secured alongside C.T Jetty at 1620IK.
- 4. July 14th. At 0825IK slipped and proceeded in company with ML 1324 for A.A and surface target shoot. Commenced firing at 0945IK in a position approximately two miles to the north of Middle Ground Buoy Ceased fire at 1037IK and returned to harbour securing alongside at 1259IK. The shooting was good and all guns worked well.
- 5. July 16th. At 0930IK Engineer Capt. Carr commenced and inspection of fire fighting and damage control equipment on board. Fire stations were exercised. At 1424IK slipped and proceeded to No. 1 buoy with pilot and NCS documents. At 1600IK pilot embarked on board from U.S tanker"DEQUESNE" and NCS documents were delivered. Awaiting arrival of "COTTONSWOOD" until 2145TK ship not sighted so proceeded to harbour securing alongside at 2312IK.
- 6. July 22nd. At 1356IK slipped and proceeded to No. 1 buoy with pilot and N.C.S documents. Pilot boarded U.S tanker "BUNKER HILL" and N.C.S documents were delivered at 1250IK. Proceeded to harbour and secured alongside at 1717IK after delivering N.C.S documents to U.S tanker XXXXXXXXXXXXX "CASTLE PICKERING" laying in harbour at anchor. At 1830IK slipped and proceeded with pilot and N.C.S documents to No.1 buoy. Pilot boarded U.S tanker "PEROTE" and N.C.S documents were delivered at 1955IK. Proceeded to harbour securing alongside at 2155IK.
- July 24th. At 1602IK slipped and proceeded to No. 1 buoy with pilot and N.C.S documents. Pilot boarded H.M.A.S

"KATOOMBA" AND N.C.S documents were delivered at 1740IK. Proceeded to boom and assumed boom patrol at 1850IK.

- 8. July 28th. At 1502TK slipped and proceeded with N.C.S documents were delivered to H.M.A.S "KATOOMBA" at 1640TK. proceeded to boom and assumed boom patrol at 1743TK.
- 9. The health and welfare of the ship's company has been very good and conduct also has been good. The ship requires slipping badly. More than half a knot in speed has been lost owing to the dirty condition of the bottom.

In accordance with CCNO 97/43 and A.C.B 0238 Sect.2 (4) J Report of Proceedings of H.M.A "ML 1322 for the month of June.

Darwin boom patrol duties were carried out for 24 hours commencing at 1800IK on the following dates, June 2nd, 5th, 9th, 13th, 16th, 20th, 22nd, 26th, and 30th.

June 2nd. At 0515IK slipped and proceeded to No.1 buoy with NCS Officer who boarded and delivered instructions to U.S tanker "Wellesley" at 0745IK. Secured alongside C.T Jetty at 0920IK.

June 4th. At 0424IK slipped and proceeded to No.1 buoywith pilot to await the arrival of the "Alfred C. True". At 1725IK ship not sighted, instructed to return to harbour. Secured alongside C.T Jetty at 1915IK.

June 5th. At 1055IK slipped and proceeded to have new compass adjusted. At 1120IK compass adjusted, secured alongside C.T Jetty.

June 7th. At 1417IK slipped and proceeded with NCS Officer and pilot to No.1 buoy. At 1507IK NCS Officer boarded U.S tanker "Hadley" and at 1605IK boarded U.S tanker "Kenya" with instructions. The pilots from both tankers were taken on board. At 1655IK proceeded to Abbott Shoal being instructed to disembark pilots to "Southern Cross". At 2314IK pilots were disembarked and at 2355IK proceeded on passage to No.1 buoy.

June 8th. At 0610TK arrived at No.1 buoy, instructed to await arrivel of "Edward F. Johnson". At 1315TK NCS Officer boarded "Edward F. Johnson" and delivered instructions. Proceeded into harbour and secured at C.T Jetty at 1433TK.

June 10th. At 2307IK slipped and proceeded in search of man overboard from Army launch in vicinity of Emery Point.

June 11th. At 0035IK man overboard not sighted, instructed to return. Secured alongside C.T Jetty at 0059 IK. At 1540IK slipped and proceeded to No.1 buoy with NCS Officer. At 1655IK NCS Officer boarded U.S tanker "Cayuse with instructions. Awaited arrivel of the E.W Sinclair until 2137IK, ship not sighted so proceeded back to harbour. Secured alongside C.T Jetty at 2310IK.

June 15th. At 1126TK slipped and proceeded to No.1 buoy. At 1315TK NCS instructions delivered to U.S tanker "Esso Petterson". Returned to harbour and secured along-side C.T Jetty at 1525TK.

June 16th. At 0920IK slipped and proceeded to Naval slip and at 0940IK took ML 1329 in tow. Secured her alongside C.T Jetty at 0957IK.

June 18th. At 1110IK releived ML 807 on boom patrol

At 1535IK ML 807 resumed boom patrol. Returned to harbour and secured alongside CT Jetty at 1655IK.

June 19th. At 1229IK slipped and proceeded to No.1 buoy with pilot. At 1412IK NCS instructions delivered to U.S tanker "Wagon Box" and at 1523IK NCS instructions delivered to U.S tanker "Klamath Falls". Pilots from both ships taken on board. Instructed to await the arrival of the "Cape Spencer"

June 20th. At 0517IK the "Cape Spencer" not sighted so proceeded back to harbour, secured alongside C.T Jetty at 0719IK.

June 26th. At 0219IK slipped and proceeded to No.1 buoy. At 0637IK NCS instructions delivered to U.S tanker "Kings Kanyon" proceeded back to harbour and secured alongside C.T Jetty at 0843IK. The health welfare and conduct of the ship's company has been good. The general condition of the ship is good although mess deck and galley flats require painting.

Sect. 2 (4) (J). Report of Proceedings of H.M.A "ML 1322" for the month of May.

At 0800IK 1st, May weighed anchor and proceeded from anchorage in Stokes Bay, Stanley Is. on passage to Darwin. H.M.A.S "Daraween" passed at 1320IK headed south. Anchored inside Might Is. for the night at 1650IK.

May 2nd.

At 0700IK proceeded on passage through squally weather. Owing to heavy rain anchored off Sherwood Is. From 0850IK until 1030IK. Secured alongside jetty at Portland Roads at 1350IK the visibility still being bad.

May 3rd.

At 0742IK proceeded, M.V "Wandana" passed south bound and at 0900IK passed T.L 45 bound for Thursday Is. RAAF Launch 033-4 and S.S "Marramah" passed at 1030IK, both southbound. Anchored inshore of Bushby Is. at 1735IK.

May 4th.

At 0700TK proceeded. Weather still being very squally secured to Town Jetty Thursday Is. at 1535TK. Remained along-side the Jetty fuelling, watering, and provisioning until PM Monday the 7th.

May 7th.

H.M.A.S "Seasnake" for onward passage to Darwin. The speed of advance was 8 knots. "Seasnake" being under sail as well as power.

At 1700IK proceeded to take station astern advance was 8 knots. "Seasnake" being under sail as well as power.

May 11th.

At 1600IK secured alongside C.T. Jetty at Darwin and remained alongside until Thursday the 17th, May. During this time four depth charges and schutes were fitted to ship b. Base Staff. Boom patrol was carried out for 24 hours commencing at 1800IK on the following dates. May17th, 19th, 21st, 24th, 27th, and 30th.

May 28th.

At 0805IK proceeded from boom patrol to No.1
buoy where U.S tanker "Pile Springs" lay at anchor, embarked mikek
Naval pilot from tanker and transferred him to ML 1329 on arrival
at boom gate. At 1015IK resumed boom patrol.

May 31st.

At 1535IK proceeded in company with ML 813 on Air Sea Rescue duties to Clarence Strait. At 1915IK a signal stating the airmen were safe was received by ME 813. Proceeded in company with ML 813 to Darwin boom. At 2310 secured alongside at CT Jetty.

The health, welfare and conduct of the ship's company has been good.
