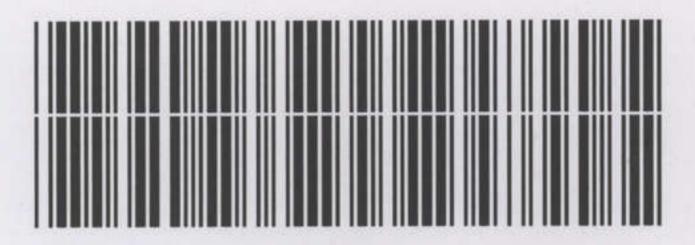

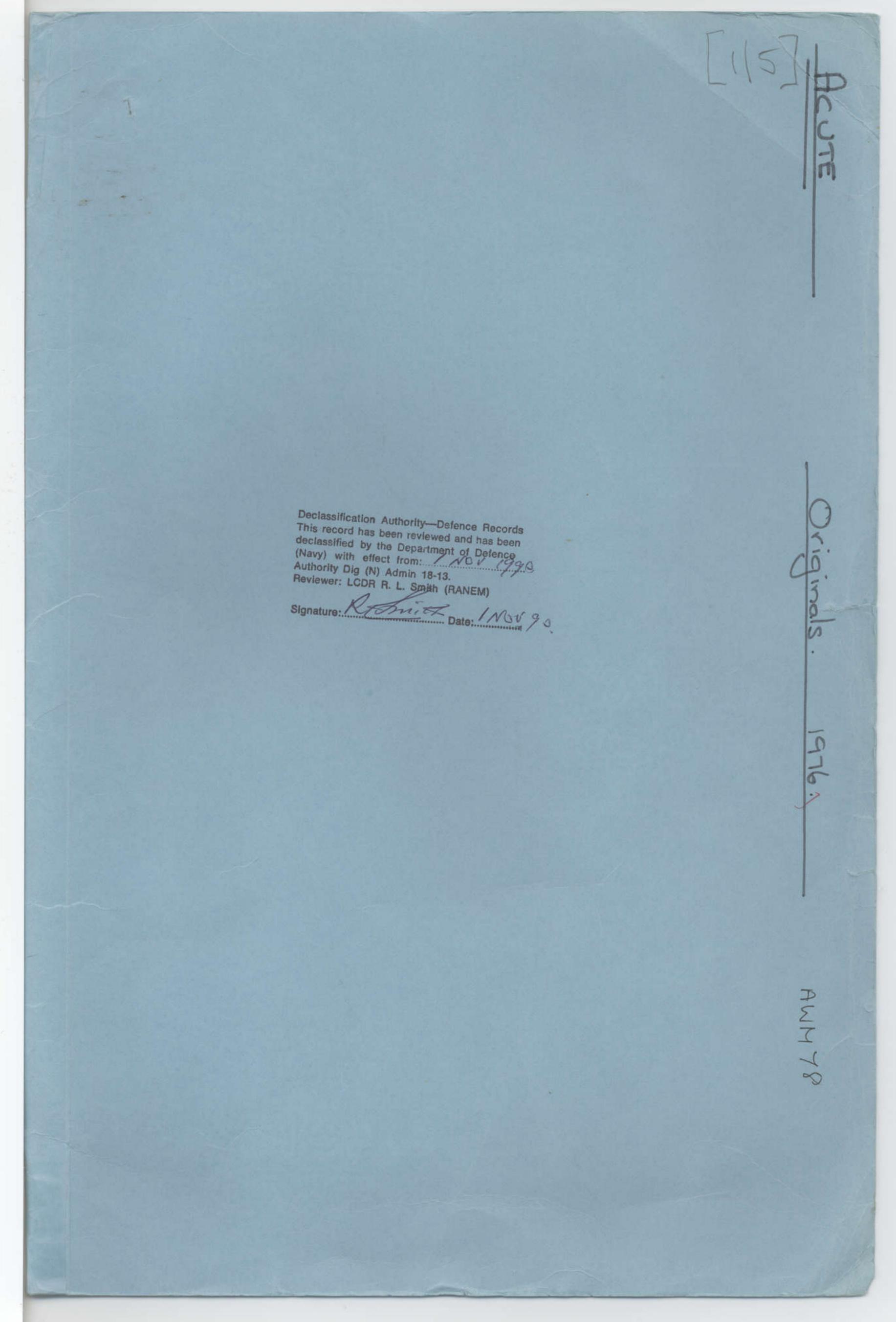

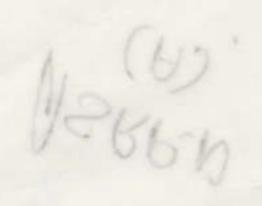

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS OF HMAS ACUTE ACT 1/76 -24TH APRIL - 7TH MAY 1976

Sir,

I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMAS Acute, under my command for the above period.

The ACT was a 13 days cruise for RANR personnel covering some North West Ports for the first week on fisheries surveillance followed by surveying duties of the Lancelin area in the second week.

The ship's company joined on Sunday 25th April at 8730H, consisting of 3 officers, 15 RANR sailors and one PNF, AB MTP. The ship's complement complying with ANO 412/69.

After storing and fueling ship, HMAS Acute slipped from HMAS Leeuwin boat shed and proceeded to C Berth, Fremantle Harbour to load ammunition. Having completed ammunitioning, the ship slipped Fremantle at 1600H and proceeded to North West Cape, a two day passage, in ideal weather conditions.

At 1900H on Monday 26th April, whilst 10 miles to seaward of Zuytdorp Point, a radar contact was made with two vessels some 12 miles to seaward of our position. On investigation they were identified as Taiwanese trawlers engaged in pair trawling:

CHIN HONG 11 CT6 0485 REG. PORT KAOHSIUNG CHIN HONG 12 CT6 0486 " KAOHSIUNG

These two trawlers were of a much larger type than sighted on previous fisheries patrols. They were of approximately 400 tonnes, with superstructure amidships and a catwalk from the bridge over the forward well deck to the forecastle. (Appendix B attached summarises all sightings and positions.)

On Tuesday April 27th, a further four sightings were reported at 1315H. These were:-

When intercepted the four trawlers were steaming 190° at 8 knots in loose lime ahead.

These four stern trawlers were identical with the larger type trawlers reported on previous fisheries patrols. They were of approximately 300 tonnes, superstructure well forward, a large well deck amidships with two sets of sampson posts aft.

During the afternoon full power trials were conducted from 1400H - 1430 H with satisfactory results. The ship secured alongside Port Murat Wharf, North West Cape, at 1805H. Due to investigating fishing contacts en route north, the ship's arrival was 2 hours late on the planned ETA. On arrival we were met by Leut. G. Linning RAN. As weather conditions were very calm, this ship remained alongside Pnt. Murat Wharf overnight, after refuelling.

Wednesday the 28th April saw a continuance of the excellent weather pattern. The ship slipped from Pnt. Murat Wharf at 0700H sailing for the Monte Bellos Islands to the north. During the Wednesday a further six Taiwanese trawler sightings were reported. These were:-

All six trawlers were pair trawling when sighted. The trawlers were the type with the superstructure forward and of approximately 300 tonnes.

The ship arrived in the Monte Bellos area late on the Wednesday afternoon and as no further sightings or radar contacts were made, the ship anchored in the lee of North East Island at 2000H in 15 metres.

During the forenoon of Thursday 29th April at 1888H an RAN Tracker aircraft No. 8848 flew over the ship, and on establishing radio contact reported nil sightings in the area of the islands. The balance of the forenoon was spent in static training on board, including a 40/60 MM. shoot. At 1238H the ship weighed anchor and proceeded southward to patrol an area south of Sharks Bay. On the southward passage, four of the trawlers reported the previous day were resighted.

The ship required refuelling before proceeding on further patrol work and was routed to Carnarvon for fuel. The overnight passage was calm and without further contacts or sightings. Radar reception during this period was excellent and shipping was painting up to a range of some 30 miles.

. 3 .

On Friday morning the 30th April, the ship anchored one mile south of the Carnarvon wharf at 1000H awaiting the pilot for entry into the new fishing harbour. The pilot, Captain P. Everly, boarded HMAS Acute at 1030H and the ship secured alongside the fishing wharf at 1050H.

The new fishing harbour at Carnarvon offers excellent facilities for patrol boats. Whilst the wharf is small and crowded, prior notice should secure a berth for servicing of patrol boats. The wharf is situated 1/2 mile north from the town of Carnarvon and fuelling and watering facilities are readily available. It is very well sheltered from any type of weather.

At the completion of refuelling the ship proceeded to sea at 1300H to continue fishing surveillance patrolling.

During the evening of Friday 30th April the area north of Bernier Island (Shark Bay) was patrolled with no sightings. However to the south several radar contacts were made indicating a large fishing fleet. The first of these contacts was identified at 2310H and the next several hours were ones of high activity in identifying the large fleet. This continued into the forenoon of Saturday 1st May. These identifications are listed below:-

Most of the group, all in close proximity of each other, were drifting with no signs of fishing activity or processing being carried out. All were of the class with superstructures forward and of approximately 300 tonnes, with the exception of HONG HAI HUI No's 1 and 2, which were the larger class with the superstructure amidships. These two trawlers were steaming in a northerly direction at 12 knots, having showed aggression when approached in an attempt to identify. On each approach to either trawler to identify their registered numbers, they were turned towards HMAS Acute on a collision course. Rather than hazard the ship for closer inspection, names only were noted.

Sea conditions during the Friday night and Saturday morning were quite uncomfortable with a fresh wind from the south west with a large swell and moderate seas.

Proceeding south further contacts were made and identified and these are listed below:-

All of the above vessels were pair trawling.

Amongst the Reserve personnel on board was LS QMG J. Lillburn whose civilian occupation is a Fishing Inspector with the State Government Fisheries & Fauna Dept. Two of the above trawlers were observed pulling their nets and the bulk of their catch being identified as schnapper. The trawler was pulling in a depth of 100 metres.

Following the last reported trawlers, HMAS Acute then proceeded to Geraldton, securing alongside the Geraldton wharf at 1922H on the Saturday evening May 1st.

On Sunday May 2nd the survey party detached from HMAS Moresby and joined HMAS Acute at Geraldton at 1800H. The party consisted of Leut. P. Hardey, SBLT J. Patterson and AB.SR Barr. Following the installation of Hi Fix equipment, HMAS Acute sailed from Geraldton at 2100H the same evening.

On the southward journey to Lancelin a rough passage was experienced overnight, with Acute arriving in the Lancelin area at 0700H on Monday 3rd May.

During the forenoon Leut. Hardey transferred to a MSL and returned ashore to the Hi Fix Master Station. SBLT Patterson and ABSR Barr remaining on board HMAS Acute.

The balance of Monday 3rd and Tuesday 4th May was spent in continual survey work, but unfortunately continuous breakdown of the Hi Fix equipment seriously hampered progress.

On the morning of Wednesday May 5th at 0300H HMAS Acute sailed from the Lancelin area for Fremantle to refuel, refuelling alongside Fremantle at 0800H, returning to the Lancelin area the same afternoon. The ship continued with the survey work, but once again continual faults with the Hi Fix equipment considerably slowed down the progress of the work.

HMAS Acute returned to Fremantle on Friday 7th May securing alongside Leeuwin boat shed at 0900H. Ship's company, after de-storing and cleaning ship, secured ship at 1530H.

The ACT covered a great deal of sea time, but was excellent training and experience for the RANR personnel, and moral of the ship's company was extremely high for the entire ACT. It was also pleasing to note that all on board took a very keen interest in the latter part of the ACT when on survey duties.

The ship and all associated equipment gave excellent performances throughout the ACT and only two minor malfunctions were experienced. The overall appearance of the ship, both internally and externally is excellent.

Report of Proceedings - HMAS ACUTE 9th to 21st May, 1976.

Sir,

I have the honour to submit this report of proceedings of HMAS ACUTE under my command from the 9th to the 21st May, 1976.

The original intention of commencing the survey on Sunday the 9th May was changed after consultation with CO MORESBY and HMAS ACUTE slipped from the Boatshed 091000 H May 1976 to proceed into Cockburn Sound for a workup, returning to berth astern of MORESBY in Fremantle Harbour PM of the same day.

After embarking the Senior Surveyor off the MDRESBY, LEUT GLEX P.A. HARDY the ship sailed in the early hours of the 10th May to arrive at the Lancelin Survey Area by 0645. The ships company consisted of 1 PNF and 2 RANR officers plus 3 PNF and 15 RANR sailors.

The Hi Fix Equipment malfunctioned during most of the Monday and when the fault was finally traced to a corroded Earthlead in the Aerial cable, adverse atmospheric conditions prohibited further surveying during the night.

The Survey got under way properly in the early hours of Tuesday 11th May and LEUT Hardy was transferred to the MORESBY Boatcamp the same day where he remained until the completion of the survey.

In order to compensate for the loss of time, the remainder of the survey was carried out using both engines, weather permitting. Also the scheduled visit to Geraldton on Wednesday 12th was cancelled and ACUTE returned briefly to Fremantle for fuel.

On Friday 14th May the weather deteriorated rapidly during the afternoon and the ship once again returned to Fremantle for fuel and shelter - cancelling the Geraldton visit; overnight leave was granted to the ship's company and when the weather was still found to be adverse on Saturday, further leave was granted.

On completion of overnight leave the ship proceeded to the survey area arriving off Lancelin at 1230 on Sunday the 16th and continued to carry out surveying. During late afternoon however, the echo sounder fitted for the survey became defect and after a successful attempt to launch the SMB through a heavy surf personel from the boatcamp endeavoured to repair the defect equipment. This was unsuccessful and since the SMB had to return before darkness the survey was continued by using the ship's Echo sounder which required only minor modifications to make it suitable.

On passage to Fremantle for fuel HMAS ACUTE rendezvoued with HMAS MORESBY South West off Rottnest in the early hours of Tuesday the 18th May tootransfer a replacement control unit for the defect Echo Sounder. After a brief refuelling stop the ship arrived off Lancelin the same evening to carry out the remainder of the survey.

By late Wednesday evening the weather once again deteriorated and since the majority of the survey had been completed and HMAS MORESBY had retrieved the two reference beacons that same afternoon, permission was requested and obtained from CO MORESBY to return South and anchor in Sulphur Bay early Thursday morning.

During Thursday, Power of Command test for promotion were carried out and passed by three Able Seaman and one Leading Seaman. Three Helmsman's Certificates were awarded and after Captains Rounds, Officer of the watch manoeuvres were carried out in Cockburn Sound, returning to the anchorage at Sunset for a combined party in the junior Sailors Mess.

The ship secured alongside the Boatshed at 211000 H May 1976 and commenced destoring. The ship's company mustered for payment at 1330 and was dismissed at 1400, completing ACT 2/76.

Morale amongst the ship's company during this ACT was of the highest order and even though weather conditions and the continuous surveying at high speed requiring fixing every 1½ minutes must have been a strain, it was felt that this was preferred to the periods of inactivity that occured due to equipment malfunction. A sense of achievement in completing 1406.9 miles of actual survey was felt by every crew member.

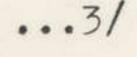
Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMA Ship under my command from 9th 17th June 1976.
- 2. As a result of the increased Taiwanese presence in the Shark Bay area ACUTE was programmed to conduct Fisheries surveillance patrols through that area during mid June. To accomplish this ACUTE sailed from HMAS LEEUWIN's boatshed at 0800 am Tuesday 10th June and after embarking ammunition in Fremantle harbour proceeded north.
- 3. ACUTE's original programme was to be short lived however when on receipt of your signal KBG 110127Z Jun 76 the ship by passed its scheduled visit to Carnarvon and proceeded direct to North West Cape. At 0800 on Saturday 12th ACUTE secured alongside Point Murat wharf to embark fuel and fresh provisions. The unpredictable weather conditions experienced in this area deemed it unadvisable to remain alongside and at 1200 that day ACUTE cast off and proceeded south in Exmouth Gulf. At 1245 the ship came to anchor off Exmouth Town Beach in the vicinity of the two Taiwanese fishing vessels that were to become our charges for the next five days. YIH TAI No.1 and YIH TAI No.2 had previously been arrested by HMAS ADROIT on charges of illegally processing fish in the Australian declared fishing zone and were escorted by ADROIT to North West Cape. Following the preliminary Magistrates hearing the Captains of these vessels were remanded for trial. The remoteness and lack of facilities at North West Cape hindered the continued custody of the Taiwanese in that area and ACUTE stood by to escort these vessels to a safe haven.
- 4. On receipt of instructions to escort the Taiwanese to Geraldton preparations were made to embark two Commonwealth Police Officers and two Naval personnel on each vessel to act as guards during the passage south.

- 5. Difficulties arose when it became apparent that all navigational charts held onboard the Taiwanese had been confiscated and sent to Perth by members of the Department of Fisheries and Wildlife, to be used in evidence at a later date. Although it is appreciated the relevant chart being used at the time of arrest would constitute essential evidence it is considered that the confiscation of all navigational charts left not only the Captains YIH TAI No's 1 and 2 at a serious disadvantage in the safe navigation of their ships but also put additional burden on the escort vessel which not only has a communication difficulty but which may well have been called upon to conduct some other task during a temporary absence from the escort. These charts, minus the essential ones for evidence, could of been held in the locality by the local authorities and re-issued to the Taiwanese shortly before departure. In this instance the problem was alleviated to a degree by loaning the No.1 vessel extremely small scale charts from ACUTE. Although these gave the Captain of YIH TAI No.1 some indication of course it did not present detailed navigational dangers and ACUTE was forced to maintain a close watch on all three vessels navigational positions. The dangers of navigating without charts became acutely apparent when the Taiwanese vessels entered Geraldton harbour, after sunset and without charts or the assistance of a Pilot. The speed differences between the Taiwanese and a Patrol Boat do not allow a "follow the leader" situation.
 - 6. Local weather conditions delayed the loading of personnel and stores to the Taiwanese and the departure from North West Cape was delayed until 1200 on Sunday 13th. The passage to Geraldton was both calm and uneventful with the boarding party onboard the Taiwanese reporting close co-operation from both the Captains and crew of those vessels. Heaving line transfers of fresh provisions were carried out with both vessels at 1630 on Monday 14th. A request from the Captain of YIH TAI No.1 to be allowed to stream and clean dead fish from his nets before entering Geraldton was granted for 1000 the following morning. At 1300 that day all three vessels came to anchor in Champion Bay. Shipping movements and blasting operations in the approaches delayed the ships entry into Geraldton until 1800 that evening when YIH TAI No.1 secured at No.4 berth Geraldton harbour. YIH TAI No.2 secured outboard of No.1 and ACUTE secured forward of these vessels and remained there overnight.
 - 7. ACUTE cast off and proceeded at 1140 on Wednesday 16th and after leading the Taiwanese out of Geraldton harbour set course for Fremantle. Continuing fine weather and good co-operation from the Taiwanese made the overnight passage to Fremantle uneventful. The entry into Fremantle the following morning was delayed and all three vessels came to anchor in Gage Road at 0900.



- 8. A Pilot boarded YIH TAI No.1 at 1300 that afternoon and that ship proceeded alongside No.1 berth Fremantle harbour. Shortly after a Pilot led YIH TAI No.2 alongside and both vessels were handed over to the custody of the Commonwealth Police. ACUTE proceeded outboard of HMAS DIAMANTINA and on completion of de-ammunitioning proceeded up river to HMAS LEEUWIN's boatshed where it secured at 1420.
- 9. Morale amongst the ship's company for the period was very high and can be attributed to the welcome break from shore duties for the majority of them.
- 10. The appearance of the Ship throughout the period remained satisfactory. Mechanical and Electrical equipment proved most reliable and considering the usage, without fault, the Ship has had in the last six weeks reflected well on the PNF maintenance staff.

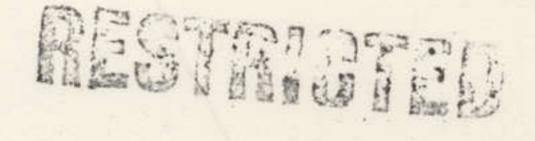

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS OF HMAS ACUTE ESCORT DUTIES GERALDTON TO FREMANTLE FRIDAY 30TH JULY TO SUNDAY 1ST AUGUST

Sir,

I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMAS Acute, under my command for the above period.

A full complement of RANR personnel joined the ship at HMAS Leeuwin Boat Shed at 1830H on Friday 30th July with the one exception of the Charge POMTP from Leeuwin staff.

The ship had been victualled and made ready for sea by PNF personnel during the day. This greatly facilitated getting the ship to sea, as most of the ship's company had to come straight from their places of employment.

HMAS Acute slipped from HMAS Leeuwin Boat Shed at 30/2000H and proceeded through the Harbour en route for Geraldton. The weather conditions were calm with a slight south wester and good time was made on the overnight passage, arriving alongside Geraldton Harbour at 31/0830H.

On arrival, I endeavoured to contact the Managing Secretary of the Port Authority, Mr. R. Clarke and the Harbour Master, Captain Bennett without success.

At 0900H Captain C. Hartley (Harbour & Lights Department, Perth) called on the ship and kindly offered the use of their office and telephone facilities. From here he suggested that was aground.

On arrival, I was introduced to Captain Bennett, the Geraldton Harbour Master, and Mr. I. Bogle, Chairman of the Geraldton Port Authority, Mr. R. Clarke, Managing Secretary of the Geraldton Port Authority, Mr. W. Newbold of the Geraldton Tug Co. and Mr. J. Gross of the Caltex Oil Company.

At this stage, pumping was in progress from the Fu Long 11 to a 3,000 gallon holding tank on the beach, which was then to be transferred to road tankers. It appears that this had been arranged by Mr. Newbold in conjunction with Mr. Gross of Caltex. It was planned to endeavour to pump 60 to 70 tons

from the Fu Long 11 to transfer by road tanker to Fu Long 12. As pumping had just commenced through a 3½" pipe, it would appear that some 20 hours would be required to remove the necessary amount of fuel.

I informed Mr. Clarke we could stay no longer than 1600H that same day. At this point there was nothing further one could do but return to HMAS Acute and await the progress of the fuel transfer.

At 1300H, Mr. Tim Shao, a social worker in Geraldton acting as interpreter, came aboard HMAS Acute with the Captain of the Fu Long 12. I explained to him that it was required of HMAS acute to be an escort to Fu Long 12 to Fremantle. He then informed me that he would have to call Mr. S. Chew, solicitor the current situation, and he would meet me again at 1530H with an answer.

At 1500H the first tanker arrived alongside Fu Long 12 and commenced pumping some 3,000 gallons of fuel. This was followed shortly by a similar tanker with a further 2,000 gallons.

At 1530H Mr. Shao arrived on board Acute and informed me that Mr. Chew required that I accept full responsibility for Fu Long 12 before sailing for Fremantle. I then asked Mr. Shao would he be kind enough to phone Mr. Chew back again and emphasise the following points (as I have known Mr. Steven Chew personally for some 4 years).

- 1. Under no circumstances would the Navy accept any responsibility for Fu Long 12.
- 2. Advise Mr. Chew that I would personally be in charge of the escort.
- 3. That a qualified officer would be placed on board Fu Long 12 to carry out the navigation south, complete with charts and instruments.
- 4. HMAS Acute would supply a radio link between both vessels and maintain a regular schedule.
- 5. HMAS Acute would advise our officer on board Fu Long 12 of the ship's position every 1/2 hour as Fu Long 12 was not fitted with equipment capable of taking a fix nor was its radar serviceable.
- 6. Supply of a spare anchor from HMAS Acute and our towing hawser as an added precaution as Fu Long 12 no longer carried any serviceable anchors.
- 7. That all navigational equipment in Acute was fully operational.

Mr. Shao informed Mr. Chew of these points and returned at 1545H advising that Mr. Chew was satisfied with these arrangements.

5 minutes later Mr. Clarke advised me that some 7,000 gallons had now been pumped into Fu Long 12 and arrangements had been made for the remainder to be stored in a holding tank at Geraldton. He then expressed considerable concern that once Fu Long 12 had sailed, no radio link would exist between the stranded vessel and the shore (in spite of the Port Authority being most anxious for the departure of Fu Long 12). As numerous two-way sets were in use during the transfer of fuel, I suggested that perhaps one of these could be left on board Fu Long 11. With that Mr. Clarke informed me that he was quite happy for the Fu Long 12 to sail at 1600H.

Leut. J. Burnett RLEX and Seaman Diver N. Burong were placed on board Fu Long 12 with the navigational equipment required. Radio contact was established and both Acute and No. 12 sailed from Geraldton Harbour at 1605H.

Passage South was uneventful with calm seas from Geraldton to Fremantle. Acute and No. 12 arrived 1½ miles from the Fremantle Heads at 31/1700H and awaited the Port Authority Pilot. Once he had boarded at 1725H, Acute lay alongside Fu Long 12 and embarked the officer and seaman placed aboard and their equipment. Acute then proceeded up river and secured alongside Leeuwin Boat Shed at 1800H.

Without the help of Captain Hartley, I am sure the situation could have been considerably complicated at Geraldton. He extended every co-operation and greatly facilitated the requirement for the escort duty south.

It was also pleasing to note that several Reserve personnel who were not rostered for this weekend, volunteered their services at short notice to make up the crew for the passage. This type of exercise is always excellent value for Reserve Training, as most of the junior sailors feel that they have accomplished something worthwhile in their sea training.

This type of exercise is always excellent value for Reserve Training, as most of the junior sailors feel that they have accomplished something worthwhile in their sea training.

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - HMAS ACUTE - ACT 3 15TH - 28TH AUGUST 1976

I have the honour to submit the attached Report of Proceedings HMAS ACUTE ACT 3 1976.

The Ship's Company joined at 0800H on Sunday 15th August 1976. The crew comprised 12 RANR and 6 RAN personnel.

The ship sailed at 1000H on the same day into the tail end of a winter gale.

Two minutes after leaving the North Mole the radar became unserviceable. At the Outer Fairway Buoy the ship became exposed to the full effect of the weather and repairs to the radar impossible. The ship turned back to the shelter of Sulphur Bay, anchoring at 1130H.

At 1730H the ship's technical staff reported that repairs to the radar were beyond ship's capability. ACUTE returned to FREMANTLE until repairs were completed midday the following day.

At 1300H Monday 16th August, 1976 ACUTE sailed for Geraldton. During the night the rader and gyro became unserviceable. The ship secured alongside at Geraldton at 0230H Tuesday 17th August, 1976.

A local radar contractor worked on the radar for most of the day and into the evening. The cause of the fault was eventually tracked to a cracked solder joint. The ship sailed at 0400H Wednesday 18th August, 1976.

The programme was now too tight to patrol as far north as Dampier and then return to Carnarvon by Saturday 21st August, 1976. It was decided to change the programme and concentrate the patrol on the Shark Bay area.

The ship anchored in Turtle Bay in 28 feet of water at 1800H on 18th August, 1976.

The following morning the ship sailed at 0645H on the first day of the intensive patrol of the Shark Bay area. A total of 10 West Australian fishing boats were intercepted during a box search covering the area Cape Inscription East to Cape Peron then north to Carnarvon West to 12 miles to seaward of Cape Ronsard, and then southwards towards Cape Inscription.

17 miles to seaward of Cape Inscription two Tiawanese fishing boats the HOUN YE 11 and HOUN YE 12 were intercepted just before sundown. Both ships had their nets down and were steaming at 3 knots towards the coast.

After ACUTE had circled, the boats altered direction and headed seawards, their stern winches recovering their nets.

ACUTE returned to Turtle Bay in worsening sea conditions anchoring at 1937H in 22 feet of water. During the night the wind increased with gusts to Force 6 from the SE.

On Friday 20th August, 1976 the ship sailed for Meade Island at 0705H and dropped enchor at 1000H in 20 feet water 12 miles from the Dirk Hartog Station Shearer's quarters. The Manager of the station, Mr. John Sallinger, invited the ship's company to a barbeque on the lawns of the burntout homestead, a very pleasant two hours was spent cooking chops over coals of dried bubiala and draftwood. The ship technical staff repaired a station alternator before the boat ferried the crew back to the anchored ship.

On Saturday 21st August, 1976 the ship weighed and proceeded at 0400H for Carnarvon. A Pilot, Captain P. Everling brought the ship up the channel arriving alongside 1000H. Minor damage was sustained to the bow when knuckeling the ship alongside against a stiff south easterly.

On Sunday 22nd August, 1976 the ship sailed to Nanga Station navigating the Useless Loop Salt Channel and the Denham trough. The persistent easterly winds since the 19th August had blown a large mass of water out of the Freycinet Inlet and check soundings off Denham indicated that the level of the water was at, or near, chant datum. The ship arrived at Nanga before sunset. Finimum depth on the passage was 20 feet.

The following morning boarding party stations were exercised off White Island. The ship enchored while hands were at dinner. One sailor, SINCIP THOMESON, fishing during the dinner hour put a fishing hook through his hand. The ship sailed to Denham for medical assistance arriving mid afternoon. After the sailor returned from the Silver Chain Nurses Surgery (Sister Officelly), ACUTE weighed and proceeded to the Abrolos. The strong easterly of the previous few days had dropped to a calm. Navigating the Denham Channel a strong flood was observed returning into the Prevoinet Inlet.

At sundown a group of 15 fishing boats were encountered near Cape Inscription and identified as Australian prawming fleet.

After sunset the easterly wind freshened to force 5 and ACUTE had to reduce speed in difficult sea conditions on the passage south from Cape Inscription. The ship anchored in the Pidgeon Island lagoon, Walabi Island in the Abrolos at 1015H on Tuesday morning.

Advantage was taken of a day at anchor to clean up the ship for the Geraldton visit.

The ship reached Geraldton at 1600H on Wednesday. On Thursday two groups of school children were shown over the ship through an arrangement with Mr. J. Trevaskis, Headmaster, Geraldton Senior High School, and the afternoon group was taken to sea for a small arms demonstration. The sea conditions were too rough during the forencon to take the other group to sea.

On Friday a third group of school children were taken to sea. In the evening official guests from the Geraldton Town Council, Chapman Valley and Greenoch Shires, Geraldton Port Authority, and other prominent Geraldton business people were entertained.

Included emongst the guests were Mr. & Mrs. Ian Bogle, Chairmon of the Port Authority, Mr. Reg Clarke, Captain Bennett, Mr. & Mrs. David Horwood, Mr. & Mrs. Collib Thorpe and Mr. & Mrs. Jim Lilburne.

The reception to the Ship's Company on Tuesday 17th August, 1976 was friendly enough from the persons in the street. However, the local Newspaper 'The Geraldton Guardian' and the ABC both sent reporters onboard. Their attitude was extremely anti Navy during discussions although, hearing at second hand, their stories were more or less factual.

On our return to Geraldton on Wednesday 25th August, 1976 preparations were beginning for the Sun City Festival and public interest was concentrated on the festivities. We did at this time establish a better relationship with the Port Authority and they invited the Captain of ACUTE to witness with them the successful refloating of the Fu Long 11.

On Saturday 28th August, 1976 the ship sailed at 1200H and after a rough passage secured alongside the Boatshed at 0800H Sunday 29th August, 1976.

The A.C.T. proved to be a successful fisheries patrol, despite the adverse wind and sea conditions. The crew settled down to an effective team that performed well both at sea and ashore.
