Report of proceedings for month of March 1945

During the entire month H.D.M.L. I339 was at Hollandia engaged on Pilot duties.

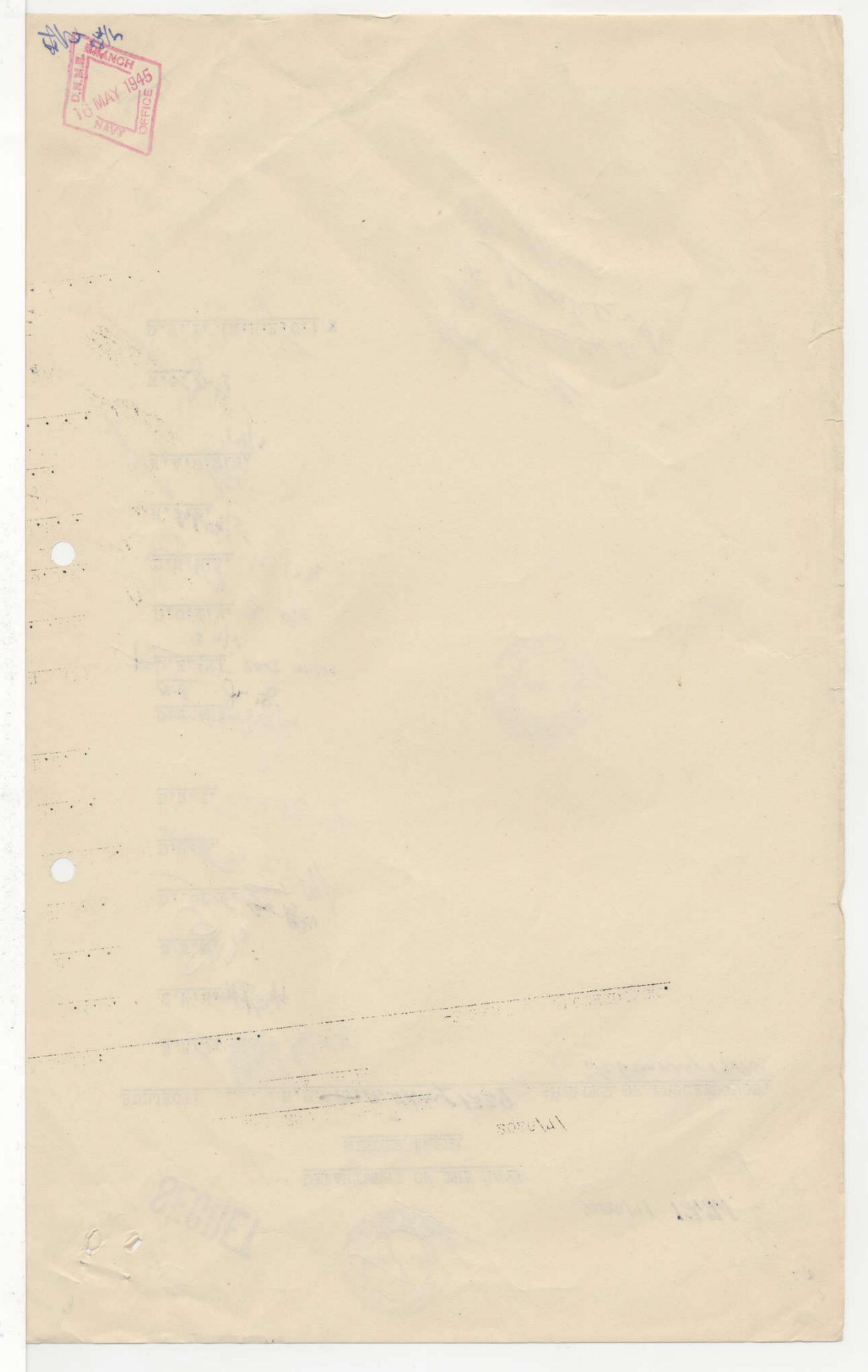
Since taking the ship over on the Ist March 1945 considerable trouble has been experienced, the ship was in very bad condition throughout & living conditions, due to faulty batteries (condemned in November 1944) extremely hard. A verbal report was made by me to the P.D. Hollandia but nothing was done. I then requested that a signal be sent to N.O.I.C. Madang asking for a survey, this was refused. On the 24th march an official inspection of the ship was carried out by the Assistant P.D. Lieut Commander Gasking & a report was sent to N.O.IC Madang telling of the bad condition of the ship. I was then instructed by the Assistant P.D. to have the ship in top line in six days, when a further inspection would be carried out. In a superficial way, this was done but the real condition of the ship was unchanged. It is submitted that this ship will experience a major breakdown unless a complete overhall of main engines, batteries, hull, auxiliary engine, bridge structure, electrical system, & all working parts, be carried out with all expediency.

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1944. Subject

Submitted in accordance with C.C.N.O. 97/43, and A.C.B. 0235 Section 2 (4) (9), the following report of proceedings for month of November, 1944, of H.D.M.L. 1339.

ML.1339 was at Milne Bay completing fitting out until 16th November. This period of fitting out at Ladava had occupied from 12th September, and during these two months majority of shipwrights and engineering defects and A. &. A's were attended to, although lack of facilities caused a number to be held over.

- 2. Whilst at Milne Bay two trips with recreational parties were made. On Sunday 5th November, vessel slipped at 0800 with First Lieutenant, H.M.A.S. "Ladava" and party, and after visiting Kwato Mission, and Rogera Island, returned to Ladava at 2010. The following Sunday, Commanding Officer, H.M.A.S. "Ladava" and party were taken to Rogera. Vessel leaving at 0800, and returning at 1915.
- 3. On Monday, 13th November, vessel proceeded at 1045 to Army Slipway at Balasana, slipping taking place at 1415 the following day. Ships bottom was cleaned and painted with anti-fouling compound. On 15th vessel left slip 1530, proceeding at 0600 on 16th to Ladava, which was reached at 0845. Frequent slippings of this vessel are considered necessary, owing to iron fastenings used in ships construction, making sheathing of bottom impracticable. To date regular slippings have been arranged, but it is considered that when operational duties are commenced oportunities for docking may not be so frequent.
- 4. At 0620 on 17th November, M.L. 1339 slipped for Hollandia via Langemak and Madang. Langemak was reached at 1330 on the 18th, vessel proceeding for Madang at 1640 on the 19th. Madang harbour was reached at 0635 on 20th November.
- 5. During the Voyage no reception was received on w/t set won owing to interference from ship. This was a repitition of previous troubles, Milne Bay's attempts to reduce it having been unsuccessful. For the remainder of month vessel has remained at Madang to enable Base Staff to eliminate interference. Base A/S staff are completing installation of A/S equipment.
- 6. H.D.M.L. 1339 was landed at Milne Bay on May 5th, and commissioned on 15th June, but is still not completely fitted out for operational duties. When vessel was landed there were many defects in all departments, others have developed since, and whilst many of these have been remedied, major items still outstanding include interference to w/t and faults in ships electrical system and batteries. Batteries have been condemned by E.O.M.L.'s, Madang, and a new set has been ordered.

7. Stores position is also most unsatisfactory. No first supply of permanent and consumable naval stores was received on commissioning. Some consumable and essential permanent commissioning. Some consumable and essential permanent stores 6/2:201-3738 have been drawn in New Guinea, but supplies are limited, and many necessary items are unobtainable in the area.

- 8. No establishemit list of stores for this type of vessel is available in the area, so that exact deficiencies sannot be assessed.
- 9. Maintenance in Eggine Room, particularly has been difficult as staff have had to work with makeshift set of tools and equipment and few spares can be obtained. All departments have been handicaped similarly to some degree.

Foregoing brief remarks will indicate that despite the seven months period since the arrival of this vessel from America, it cannot be considered to be operationally efficient.

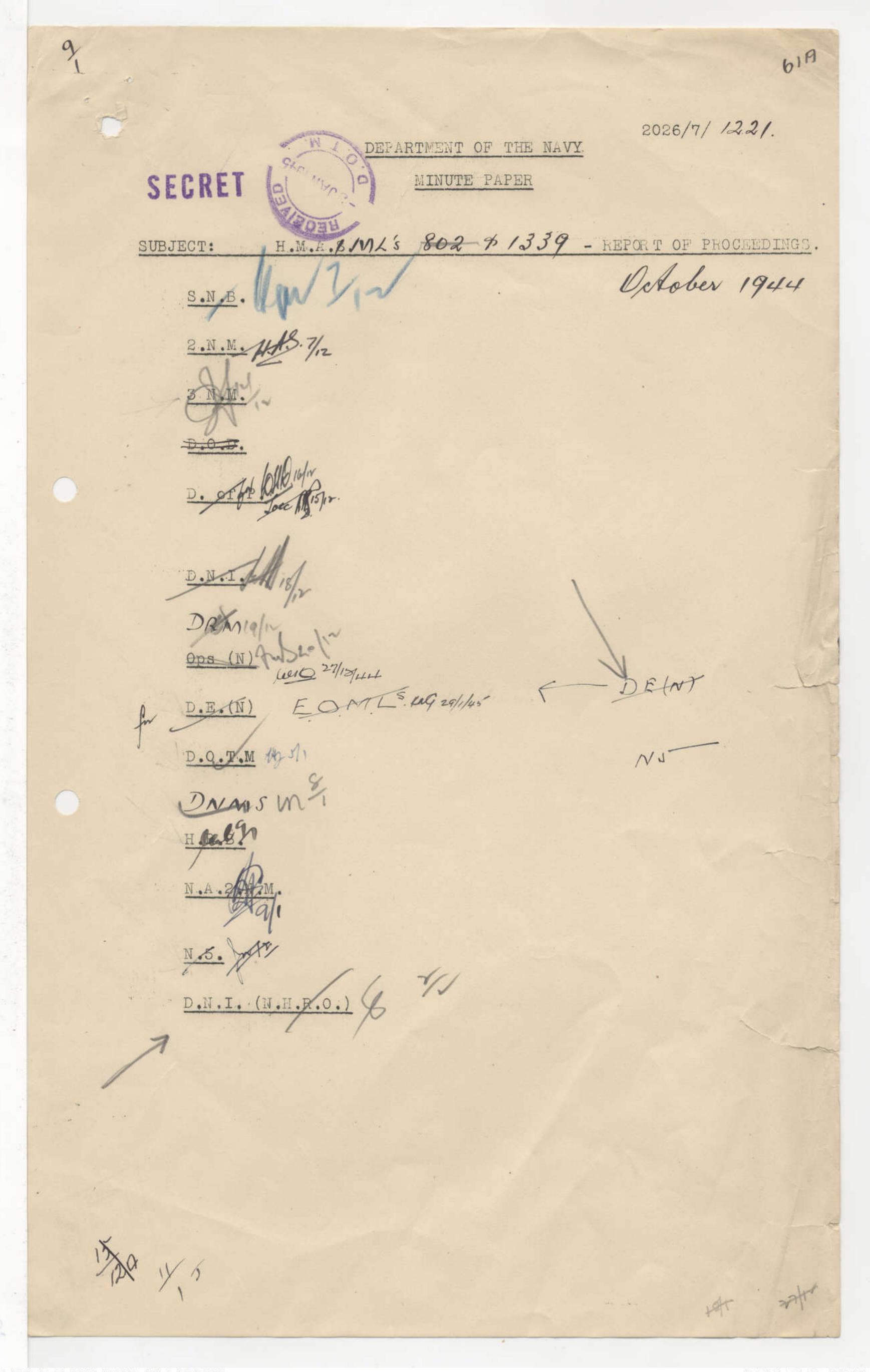

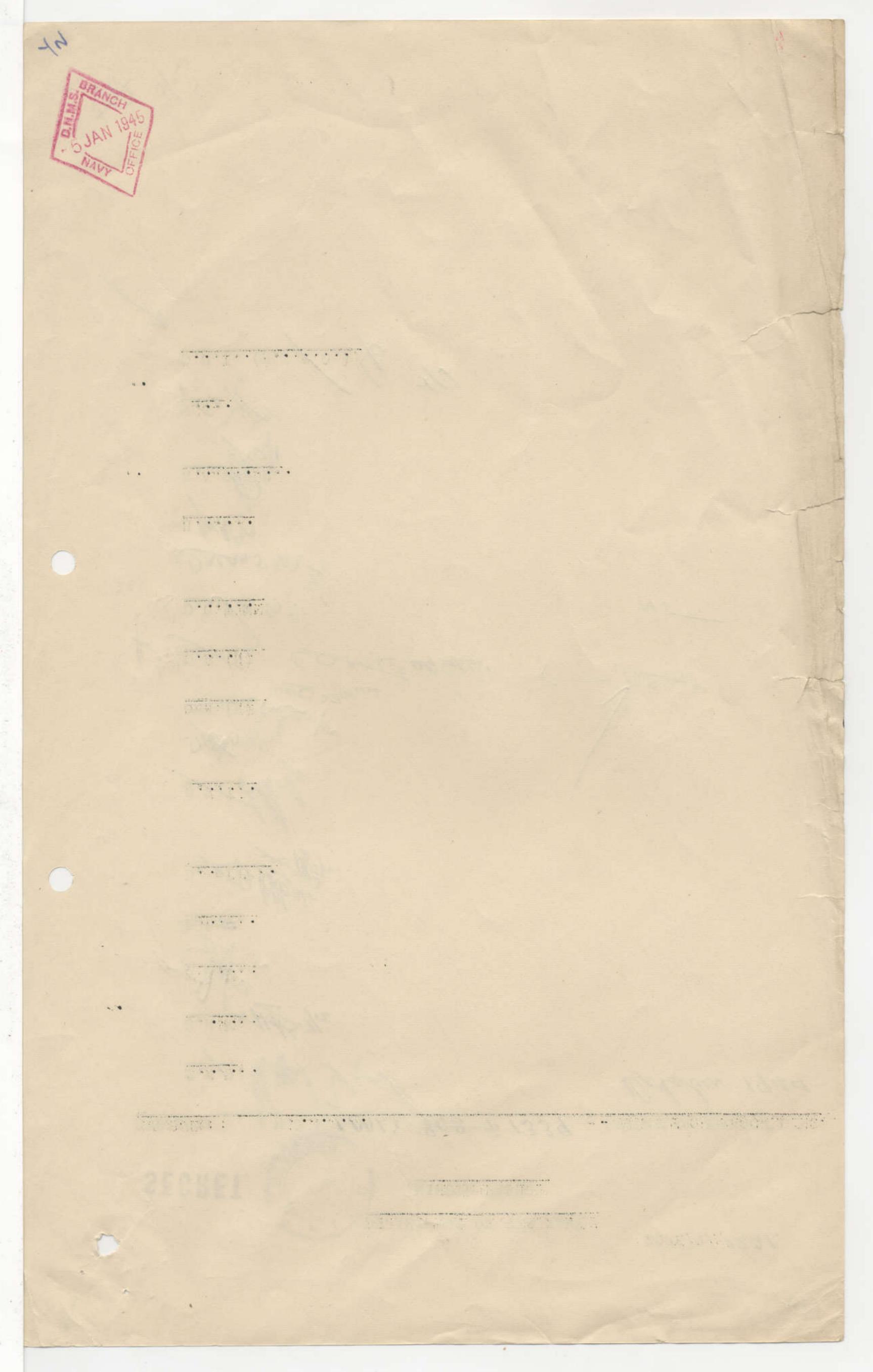
Excessive w/t interference was experienced on this vessels arrival at Madang, which had not been reported by Ladava, either during or on completion of her refit there.

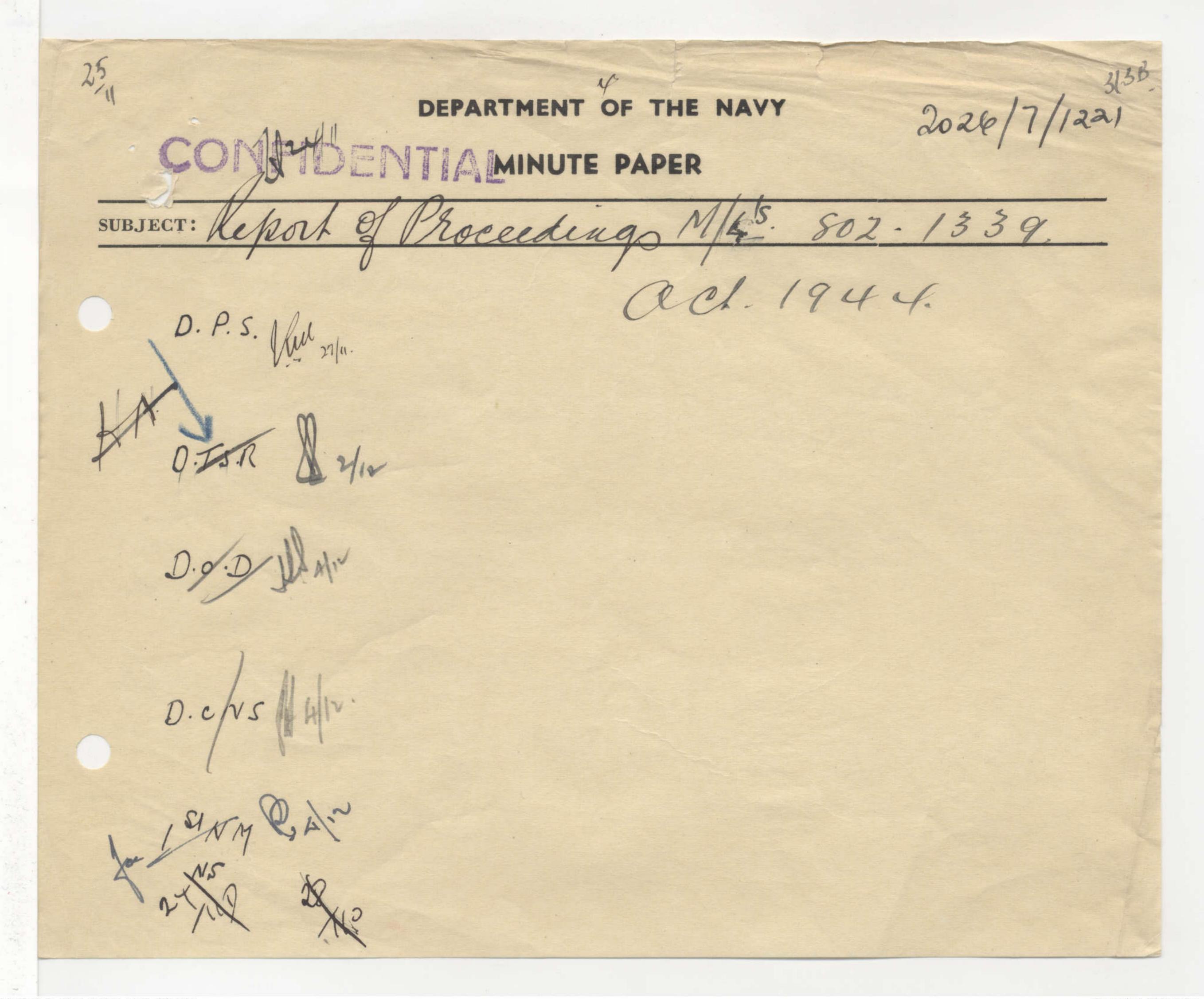
To date it has not been possible to eliminate this fault, although numerous remedies have been tried.

First supply stores or spares have not yet dome to hand from Sydney, also spare propellors demanded by Ladava last September. The propellors at present fitted are four bladed propellors supplied to us by the U.S.N., and do not give maximum efficiency.

Submitted in accordance with Confidential Commonwealth Navy Order 97/43 and A.C.B. 0235, Section 2 (4)(9), the following Report of Proceedings for month of October, 1944.

During the entire month H.D.M.L.1339 has been fitting out at Milne Bay. This fitting out is still in progress.

The only run made during the month was on Friday 13th, when vessel slipped at 1555 and proceeded to East Cape, where an overdue L.C.A. had been reported. On arrival it was found that the L.C.A. did not require assistance, and the return journey was commenced at 2005, vessel securing at Ladava at 0010.

Submitted in accordance with C.C.N.O. 97/43 and ACB 0235 Section 2 (4) (g) the following report of proceedings of HMA HDML 1339 for the month of September 1944.

(2) HDML 1339 was alongside at Madang from 1st. to 5th. September. On 5th. vessel slipped at 0905 and proceeded to Alexishafen with mails for U.S. Navy, and Engineer Officer in charge of RAN slipway, and after calling at U.S.S. Otus, slipway, and U.S. Post Office, returned to Madang at 1330.

on 7th. September at 1505 vessel slipped and proceeded on moeuvres and gunnery exercises in company with M.L. 806. These were completed and vessel secured at M.L. wharf at 1710.

At 1035 on 9th. September M.L. 1339 slipped and proceeded to Milne Bay via ports. Extremely rough weather was encountered outside Madang, and it was necessary to slow down, then heave to for approximately two hours. Superficial damage was done to upper works by the sea, including a broken window in wheelhouse and a ventilator and box carried away, whilst mess deck and galley were flodded. Vessel anchored at Saidor at 0630 on 10th. September and remained there until 1620, when she departed for Langemak.

Langemak was reached at 0740 on 11th. when M.L.1339 secured alongside U.S.S. Mesquite, and after fuelling resumed passage at 1100. At 0750 following day vessel secured alongside wharf at Tufi, resuming passage at 1730 to reach East Cape at daylight. Bad weather was again encountered, necessitating a reduction of speed, and East Cape was reached at 0910. Rating from War Signal Station, Mei Mei Ara, was there embarked for Ladava, which was reached at 1242 on 12th. Sept.

On 15th Sept. E.O. M.L's was embarked and vessel proceeded to Kiwaro at 1055, returning to RAN wharf at 1800.

At 0930 on Sunday 17th. Sept. vessel was docked in U.S. Navy Floating Dock, and bottom was antifouled, vessel undocking at 1040 on 20th. Sept.

Whilst in dock commencement was made on ships refit. During remainder of month this refit has been continued, work in hand includes mainly shipwrights' work on upper and 'tween decks uncompleted from first fitting out, stowages, approved A&A's and some defects developed since commissioning.

On Sunday 24th Sept. E.O. M.L.'s was embarked for Army slipway at Balasana and Kwato, vessel leaving Ladava at 0805 and returning at 2005.

Rubber impellor in saltwater circulating pump in port motor became defective on 27th. Sept. and this is being replaced by Ladava/ Impellor in starboard motor has already been replaced at Madang, the rubber impellors originally fitted appear to be unsatisfactory, as the rubber perishes and then splits. H.D.M.L. 1338 has also had this trouble in this area.

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR MONTH OF AUGUST, 1944. SUBJECT

Submitted in accordance with C.C.N.O. 97/43, and A.C.B. 0235 Section 2 (4) (g) the following Report of Proceedings of H.M.A. H.D.M.L. 1339 for the month of August, 1944.

On 2nd August from 0710 to 0810 HDML 1339 was employed 2. clearing Madang Harbour of boats to enable a Catalina aircraft to take off.

At 1205 on 3rd August vessel slipped and proceeded alongside U.S.S. "Rigel" at Alexishafen, with store party aboard returning at 1630.

On 4th August rubber impellor in salt water pump in starboard engine split, and pump was taken aboard H.M.A.S. "Whang Pu", to be repaired. This work is still in progress. Vessel has run on port engine during the entire month.

On 19th August vessel slipped and proceeded alongside U.S. Navy Floating Dock, and docked at 1130. Both propellers were changed and bottom painted, ship undocking at 0130 on 20th Starboard propellor hadbeen damaged when vessel struck a submerged object on 28th July.

After undocking M.L. 1339 lay at anchor until 0905 on 30th August, when stores party from H.M.A.S. "Whang Pu" was embarked, and vessel proceed to U.S.S. "Gold Star" at Alexishafen, where arrangements were made for stores to be collected by barge same night. H.D.M.L. 1339 secured at Madang at 1245.

The following day safe hand mail was taken to U.S. Navy at Alexishafen, vessel left Madang at 0945 amd returned at 1215.

During the month sporting and other contests have been organised aboard. These have assisted in maintenanting the morale of the ship's company, which is always adversely affected by periods when no operations by are being carried out, such as experienced during August. This period was apparently brought about by difficulty in obtaining priority for comparitevly small engine repairs.

It might be mentioned that the beer ration introduced in this area during the month is proving a powerful factor in maintenance of morale.

First establishment of Naval Stores for this vessel has not been received .- minimum of essential stores has been supplied by N.S.O. H.M.A.S. "LADAVA" until such time as complete establishment comes to hand. Armament and Loan Clothing stores also are incomplete at this stage.
