In accordance with C.C.N.O. 97/45 the following report of proceedings of M.L. 1352 for July 1945.

- 2. 1st 2nd In harbour.
- 3. 0830H/3rd Slipped and proceeded to vicinity of Hall Bank Buoy, transferred S.O.M.Ls to M.L. 815. Then carried out A/A and surface shoot. On completion returned to harbour.
- 4. 1530H/4th Slipped and proceeded to Hall Bank Buoy released sea-birds and returned to harbour.
- 5. 5th = 9th In harbour.
- 6. 0930H/10th Embarked S.O.M. Is and Flotilla officers and proceeded to Rottnest Is. to investigate anchorages. On completion returned to harbour.
- 7. 11th 14th In harbour.
- 8. O815H/15th Proceeded to Hall Bank Buoy and assumed A/S guard ship duties. Owing to unfavourable weather returned to harbour P.M. and remained at immediate notice. At O600H/16th proceeded to Gage Roads and carried out A/S sweeps in Company with M.Ls 815, 812. Returned to harbour 1900H.
- 2 17th In harbour.
- 10. 0815H/18th Proceeded to Hall Bank Buoy and took over A guard ship duties from M.L. 815. Relieved by M.L. 1340 0830H/19th. Returned to harbour.
- 11. 0825H/20th Proceeded to Hall Bank Buoy and relieved M.L. 1340 on A/S guard ship duties. P.M. carried out A/S sweeps in Gage Roads. On relief returned to harbour 0800H/21st.
- 12. 0815H/23rd Proceeded to Hall Bank Buoy and assumed A/S guard ship duties. Returned to harbour on relief 0835H/24th.
- 13. 25th In harbour.
- 14. 1530H/26th Proceeded in company with M. L. 824 to a position Oll deg. Rottnest Light 5 miles and carried out search for damaged target. This was unsuccessful and the M. Ls returned to harbour at dusk.
- 15. O815H/27th Proceeded to same position and continued search for target in company with M.L. 826. The target was located by M.L. 826. about noon and towed into harbour. At 1400H assumed A/S guard ship duties at Hall Bank Buoy. Returned to harbour on relief 0845H/28th.
- 16. O815H/29th Proceeded to Hall Bank Buoy and relieved M. L. 1340 on A/S guard ship duties. Returned to harbour on relief 0830H/30th.
- 17. 0645H/31st Proceeded to a position approx. 6 miles due North of Rottnest Island Light. Rendezvoused with H. M. Submarine "TURPIN" and escorted her into Fremant le harbour arriving at 1355H.





- 2. At 1345H May 1st, M.L. 1352 slipped and proceeded to Gage Roads where sherelieved M.L. 824 on A/S Patrol. At 1545 the supercharger on the starboard motor broke down and the patrol was maintained on one motor until 1750 when because of adverse weather M.L. 1352 was ordered to return to harbour.
 - 3. May 2, 3 and 4 were spent in harbour.
 - 4. On 5th May after having a supercharger unit from M.L. 1340 fitted to the starboard motor, M.L. 1352 carried out basin trials. During these trials the intermediate bearing onthe port shaft overheated and the shaft began vibrating badly.
- May 6th was spent in harbour and on 7 M.L. 1352 was slipped at the M.L. Base for inspection and unslipped on the 8th May. May 9th was spent in harbour and at 1200H/10th, M.L. 1352 proceeded to sea and relieved M.L. 812 on Standby Patrol at Hall Bank. M.L. 815 took over the patrol at 0845 on 11th, M.L. 1352 returned to base.
- At 0930H on 12th, M.L. 1352 took over the Standby Patrol from M.L. 812 who returned to harbour for repairs. At 1215 the same day, M.L. 812 resumed the patrol and M.L. 1352 returned to harbour and secured M.L. Base at 1255. The 13th May, was spent in harbour.
- 7. At 0900H/14 M.L. 1352 assumed Standby Batrol at Hall Bank. At 1600H/14 M.L. 1352 weighed and proceeded to carry out a continuous A/S Patrol which was maintained until 0930/15 when, after being relieved by 812, M.L. 1352 returned to narbour.
- 8. May 16th was spent in harbour.
- 9. At 0845/17, M.L. 1352 relieved M.L. 812 on continuous A/S Patrol in Gage Roads. At 1620/17 A/S watch was ceased and M.L. 1352 reverted to Standby vessel, anchoring at Hall Bank until relieved by M.L. 826at0830 on the 18th. M.L. 1352 returned to Base and secured at 0945H.
- 10. M.L. 1352 was in harbour on the 19th and took over Standby Patrol at 0840H on the 20th. After being relieved by M.L. 815 at 0830/21st, M.L. 1352 returned to Base and secured at 0855H.
- II. From May 21st to 25th, M.L. 1352 was on the slip at the M.L. Base during which time the port intermediate, stern tube and "A" Bracket bearings were all renewed and port snaft alignment rechecked.
- M. L. 1352 was unslipped at 1600H/25 and spent Saturday 26th in narbour. At 0845/27 M. L. 1352 relieved M. L. 824 on Standby Patrol. At 0900/28, M. L. 1352 weighed and proceeded to sea in company with H.M.A.S. "GYMPIE", M. L. 815, 812 and 824 to carry out surface shoot. At 1108, M. L. 1352 opened fire with both 50 calibre and 20 m/m guns at approximately 1000 yards range. Cease fire was ordered at 1115H and the ships in company returned to harbour; M. L. 1352 secured alongside M. L. Base at 1221H.

13. At 1330/28, M.L. 1352 was slipped for imspection and it was found that the port motor was out of line and would have to be reseated. The vessel was unslipped at 1650 the same day and work commenced on the re-alignment of the port motor and propellor shaft.




