

Dear Sir you ask for any particulars regarding  
our deceased son Pgt. Arthur Oswald Stewart  
750. 25<sup>th</sup> Battalion. very little information came  
through to us. but we know from the men in his  
company that he did his work thoroughly & was  
liked by both officers & men. We heard from  
several of the men, that he had received his  
commission & we know it had been promised  
him. his Colonel assured us, that had he come  
through Pozieres he would have got it, & when  
we asked if his name had gone for it. he said  
that was true. Colonel Walker was his name.  
In a letter written by Captain Dornish who was  
killed later, he said that Pgt. Stewart got his  
men splendidly away & although an officer  
was present. Pgt. Stewart was practically in charge.  
we have the letter here & would gladly send it. if  
assured that we could have it returned  
he had spent about 11 weeks in Hospital after his injury  
on Gallipoli & in writing says I would love to see you all  
but every man will count in his fight & I must go on.
