 - ✓ Encouraging community members to make the shift from being consumers, customers and clients of services and programs, to co-producers and citizens.
- An introduction to the processes of asset mapping and hosting conversations.
- An awareness of ABCD tools and resources.
- Opportunity to reflect on the application of the ABCD approach within Workshop participant communities.
