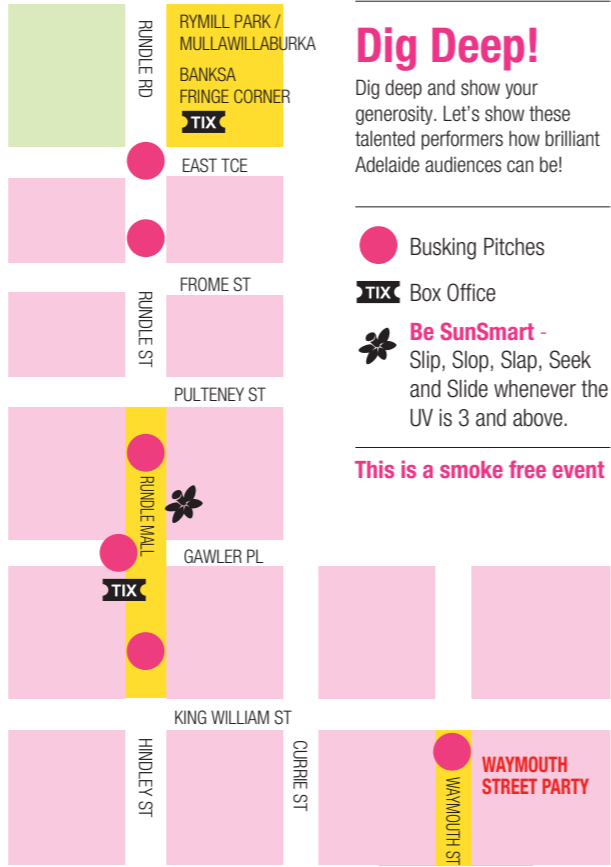

## The Sirens

(Aus)

In Greek mythology, Sirens were dangerous yet beautiful creatures who lured nearby sailors with their enchanting music and voices. In this world premiere, Adelaide Fringe has created six giant Sirens to perform an amazing street ballet. Each a different colour, you will be entranced by their dazzling dresses of a thousand sparkling lights.

## Acrobuffos presents Waterbombs!

(USA)

A hysterical water balloon gladiator show with comic antics, flying water balloons and loud opera music. Seth and Christina deliver a gut-busting show that has thrilled crowds in 18 countries.

## Kiki Bittovabtsch in The Great Kazadorian Fountain of Hope

(AUS)

Kiki, a very funny contortionist, acrobat and real life princess lost her country of Kazador (she literally can't find it!). Kiki now travels the world as the self-appointed Kazadorian Kultural attaché spreading joy and laughter with a shovel.

## The Mr. Spin Show

(AUS)

Don't miss the hilarious Mr. Spin as he mixes madcap antics and an incredible sense of fun with amazing juggling. His riotous show culminates with him jumping on to an eight-foot zigzag unicycle from which he juggles three baseball bats while balancing a glass of water on his head.

## Les Dudes

(Switzerland/Canada)

Flying with a pocket teeterboard, playing with muppets, and juggling fire on top of someone on a unicycle - nothing can stop these two crazy acrobats, ready to make you smile.

## Billy Kidd

(Canada)

Billy Kidd, one of the worlds' few female magicians, turns paper into money, finds cards in unexpected ways and performs her Houdini-inspired comedy escape routine.

## GAZZO

(UK)

Gazzo's fun filled show mixes comedy with some of the most astonishing magic you will ever see. Witness his superb manipulation skills right before your very eyes.

## Red Chocolate

(Portugal)

Each show is a new adventure where Enano transforms the street into his own home and the audience into his family.

## Funny Bones

(UK / Japan)

A rich mix of magic, mime, dancing and puppet imitations, Funny Bones is a hysterical 120% physical performance felt down to your bones

## Pete Anderson's Unstable Acts

(UK)

Britain's Pete Anderson is a Rubik's Cube solving knife master. His signature move is scaling a 3 metre free standing ladder, backwards, in a kilt.

## Scarlett and her trunk of tricks

(UK)

Scarlett is a very funny charming English clown who escapes from handcuffs and pops balloons with her whip whilst balancing high on a ladder.

Feathered flamingo showgirls create larger than life scenery, in every shade of pink!
