Artlands is a national biennial event presented by Regional Arts Australia and hosted by a regional venue. This year Red Earth Arts Precinct (REAP) was selected as the WA Regional Hub.

The Artlands 2021 program will offer a series of critical narratives across industry, research and academia that reflect current emerging trends and case studies as well as respond to challenges and opportunities experienced throughout regional Australian arts practice.

Artlands 2021: The Space Between will become five regional 'in-person' gatherings, held together by the digital infrastructure that also allows for at-home viewing. All sessions in the digital program will be streamed live and can be attended at one of the regional hubs in TAS, QLD, NT, WA or SA.
