Demolition activities

From mid-November 2019, the UNITY Alliance will commence demolition of buildings adjacent to the rail corridor between Roma Street and Exhibition stations, to prepare for construction of the Cross River Rail project.

Details of work


The following staged activities are scheduled to occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday between November 2019 and February 2020:

- Placing temporary fencing and environmental controls as required
- Establishment of site access gates into the rail corridor
- Dismantling the Queensland Rail storage and repair shed buildings, and the former Queensland Health building adjacent to the rail corridor
- Loading demolition waste and removing it from site.

Stage 1 Rail corridor between Roma Street and Exhibition stations (see map over the page).	From early November to December 2019, Monday to Saturday 6:30am to 6:30pm.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dismantling the rail wagon repair shed • Removing material from site via existing rail corridor access and access road (Gregory Terrace).
Stage 2 Adjacent to the rail corridor between Roma Street and Exhibition stations (see map over the page).	December 2019, Monday to Saturday 6:30am to 6:30pm.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dismantling the former Queensland Health building • Removing material from site via existing access road (Gregory Terrace).
Stage 3 Rail corridor between Roma Street and Exhibition stations (see map over the page).	From early January to February 2020, Monday to Saturday 6:30am to 6:30pm. To ensure worker safety some intermittent works will be required after the last train service and before the first (typically between 11:00pm and 4:00am) when no trains are running. Nearby residents will be notified of this activity.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dismantling the rail storage shed • Removing material from site via existing rail corridor access • Removing roof sheets and roof trusses around overhead lines • Disconnecting overhead lines • Removing material from site via existing rail corridor access and access road (Gregory Terrace).

Construction activities will involve:

- Light vehicles and trucks for removal of material from site
- Machinery including excavators, mobile cranes and trucks
- Small power tools, drills, power saws, minor vibrating equipment and mobile lighting towers to light the work areas at night when required.



What to expect

During demolition works, you may notice some minor disruptions such as:

- Increased levels of localised noise and dust from the use of machinery and equipment.
- Increased construction vehicle movements on local roads and within the project corridor.

Workers may arrive onsite one hour prior to the planned start time to prepare for the day's activities. Every effort will be made to keep disruption to a minimum for residents and businesses in close proximity to the project site.
