Albert Street station construction update

In May 2020, the Cross River Rail Tunnel & Stations contractor will increase work on the Albert Street construction site. On Lot 1, demolition is finished and piling will start. On Lot 2, excavation of the tunnel shaft will commence, while piling finishes and construction of the acoustic shed continues. Out-of-hours work will continue throughout May.

Mary Street footpath closures

Until the end of June 2020, the Mary Street footpath will be closed alongside Lot 1 (southern side of Albert Street). This closure is required to enable piles to be constructed within Lot 1 next to the footpath. Traffic controllers will facilitate safe pedestrian access around the closure, with one lane of traffic open in each direction. See map over page for more details.

From May 2020, the Mary Street footpath will be closed alongside Lot 2 (northern side of Albert Street). This closure will remain in place until 2022 and is required for safety reasons due to the large volume of truck movements in and out of the acoustic shed that is being constructed on the site. During this footpath closure, a temporary crossing will be available for pedestrians between The Westin and Quest River Park Central. Signage will be installed around the footpath closure to assist pedestrians. See map over page for more details.


Out-of-hours work for site investigations and utility works

In May 2020, out-of-hours work for site investigations and utility works will continue across the Albert Street underground cavern alignment (see map). This work includes:

- Geotechnical investigations
- Service locations and relocations
- CCTV investigations
- Installation of survey equipment.

Due to traffic permit requirements, this work will be carried out at night or on weekends. Nearby residents and businesses will be notified ahead of out-of-hours work.

During the work, there will be temporary traffic changes, including lane closures and pedestrian diversions. Traffic controllers will be on site to assist motorists and pedestrians around the changes.



Excavation commences

Excavation of the tunnel access shaft at Lot 2 will start from early May 2020. This work includes:

- Rock breaking
- Removal of excavated material
- Ground stabilisation and retention works such as shotcrete and ground drilling
- Installation of support services.

Excavation will occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday. This work is expected to be noisy.

Acoustic shed construction

In May 2020, construction of the acoustic shed on Lot 2 will continue. The acoustic shed is designed to reduce noise and dust. Construction of the shed includes:

- Ground preparation for concrete works to construct the slab (base of the shed)
- Installation of steel platform for site amenities
- Installation of the steel frame of the shed and precast concrete panel walls.

Piling continues

Piling on Lot 1 will continue in May 2020 and is expected to be completed in June 2020.

Piling will occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday. This work is expected to be noisy.

Out-of-hours work

Due to traffic permits, safety requirements and construction methodology, some work will be required at night or on weekends. This may include:

- Delivery and removal of oversized equipment and materials
- Minor earthworks
- Concrete work including large concrete pours
- Construction of the acoustic shed
- Site investigations
- Shaft excavation, ground stabilisation and installation of essential support services.

Nearby residents and businesses will be notified ahead of high impact out-of-hours work.

What to expect


As construction continues to ramp up at the Albert Street station site, nearby residents and businesses can expect:

- An increase in truck movements around the project work area
- A potential increase in noise, dust and vibration. We are committed to making every effort to manage and minimise the impacts of construction on the local community and the environment
- Minor traffic delays due to lane and footpath closures.

All work is subject to suitable weather conditions.
