## Boggo Road station construction update

Rock anchor installation, excavation and site establishment activities continue at the Boggo Road station site as part of the Cross River Rail project in August.

### Construction activities

Throughout August, activities on site will include:

- Demolition of the Boggo Road busway retaining wall to enable construction of the station box. Some work will be undertaken at night to minimise impacts to busway operations
- Installation of a capping beam to secure piles
- Installation of rock anchors and ground support
- Excavation of the station box and earthwork activities
- Removal of excavated material from site by trucks
- Machinery and equipment deliveries
- Environmental monitoring and water treatment plant installation
- Removal of sheet piles.

### Survey, service and ground condition investigations

Throughout August, workers may be seen around Dutton Park station and Boggo Road precinct as they survey, locate and inspect inground services and utilities including power, water, sewer and telecommunications. This includes Peter Doherty Street, Railway Terrace, Dutton Street, Rawnsley Street, Pound Street, Kent Street, Cope Street, Noble Street, Sampson Street, Dutton Park station, Annerley Road near Cornwall Street in Dutton Park and Ipswich Road in Woolloongabba.

Investigation activities will include:

- Survey, CCTV inspections and pressure cleaning of water and sewer infrastructure
- Geotechnical investigations to take samples of ground/soil conditions
- Utility investigation and reinstatement activities.

Construction equipment to be used during this work will include vacuum excavation trucks, road saws, small excavators, tipper trucks, compactors, truck-mounted geotechnical drilling rigs and specialist CCTV vehicles.

### New temporary car park

**From late-August**, work will start to construct a temporary car park at the back of the temporary Outlook Park for use by construction vehicles. The car park will be secured with a boom gate and be in place for the duration of the project. [See map overleaf.](#)

Activities will include:

- Creation of a new driveway access point off the northern side of Boggo Road
- Removal of vegetation
- Minor excavation and shaping of the car park area
- Installation of a temporary surface and line marking.

Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists and pedestrians around the works. All efforts will be made to reduce any impacts on the school drop off and pick up times during construction of the temporary car park.

### Railway Terrace – Electrical work

**From mid-August** for approximately six weeks, work will be intermittently undertaken to install an electrical unit in the cul-de-sac at the northern end of Railway Terrace. This electrical unit will provide power for the road header during cavern excavation.

Work activities will include:


- Removal of vegetation and work area establishment
- Excavation of a small pit using an excavator
- Installation of a pre-cast culvert and small concrete slab
- Installation of a high voltage power switch and electrical cabling
- Reinstatement of the work area.

Access to Leukaemia Foundation and pedestrian access from Railway Terrace to Peter Doherty Street will be maintained at all times.

## Water main pressure testing

In late August, pressure testing will be carried out at a number of locations on Annerley Road, Tamar Street and Kent Street at Dutton Park, and on Ipswich Road near O'Keefe Street, Woollongabba. This work will be undertaken at night. Nearby residents will be notified ahead of the works.

## What to expect

During August, nearby businesses and residents can expect:

- An increase in construction workers and vehicles in the area
- An increase in truck movements to and from the Boggo Road station site
- A potential increase in noise, dust and vibration
- Intermittent maintenance activities including refuelling of equipment and machinery
- Trucks removing and delivering machinery and materials to the work site. Some of these deliveries will be made outside of normal construction hours
- Temporary changed pedestrian access and temporary changed traffic conditions including lane closures.

Work is subject to relevant approvals and suitable weather conditions. Workers may arrive onsite one hour prior to the work start times to prepare for the shift's activities.

## Work hours

Work will generally occur **between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday**, weather and construction conditions permitting. Some work may be required at night due to traffic restrictions and to maintain the safety of the community and our workers. We will notify nearby residents of night work.
