Construction update Exhibition station

During February 2021, UNITY Alliance will continue construction activities in your local area.

Details of work

The following activities are scheduled to occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday during February 2021, weather and construction conditions permitting:

- Rail corridor widening and micropiling beneath O'Connell Terrace bridge is due for completion in late February 2021. This work includes the use of an excavator with a hydraulic hammer and micropiling drill rig
- Demolition of existing platform 3 at Exhibition station to allow for construction of the new Exhibition station building.
 Two excavators with hydraulic hammers will be used to undertake these works, while trucks will be used to remove material from the site via O'Connell Terrace, Bowen Hills
- RNA Showgrounds rock cutting and removal followed by retaining wall construction will take place between mid-February and October 2021. Once sections of rock have been removed, retaining walls will be built which require the installation of soil nails into the rock face and will be finished with shotcrete (a spray concrete finish)
- · Relocation of public utilities (water, sewer, communications and electrical) within the RNA Showgrounds precinct
- Construction of 33 piles parallel to the existing Exhibition station to create a solid foundation for a 130 metre long twin track bridge that will sit up to four metres above ground level
- Site preparation including earthworks for a electrical feeder station adjacent to Bowen Bridge Road
- · Installation of mast foundations for overhead electrical lines, cable routes and pits within the rail corridor
- Demolition of a retaining wall and piling adjacent to Bowen Bridge Road in preparation for pier protection works
- Surveying and investigating underground services, such as water, electricity and gas.

Out of hours work


Additional activities will occur outside the project's normal working hours but are timed to take place within a planned track closure, as outlined below:

RNA Showgrounds precinct	Intermittently between 2:00am Monday 15 and 2:00am Sunday 21 February 2021	 Demolition of the existing Exhibition station platform 3 (day and night works) Micropiling works beneath O'Connell Terrace bridge (day and night works) Removal of an advertising billboard adjacent to Bowen Bridge Road which will require lane closures and traffic changes on Bowen Bridge Road and the Inner City Bypass (night works) Overhead mast foundation installation, signalling and track work within the rail corridor (day and night works).

What to expect

During these works you may notice some intermittent disruptions such as:

- Light vehicles, trucks and machinery including excavators, mobile cranes, small power tools, drills, saws, minor vibrating equipment and mobile lighting towers to light the work areas at night
- Use of large machinery such excavators with hydraulic hammers to demolish the concrete platform at Exhibition station and load material into trucks for transport
- Changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel
- Delivery trucks and workers' vehicles entering the RNA Showgrounds via O'Connell Terrace and the rail corridor via Lanham Street and via Gregory Terrace and the existing Victoria Park access road
- · Increased levels of noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery and equipment
- Water trucks will provide dust suppression during the demolition activities.
