Yeronga station construction update

During April 2021, the UNITY Alliance will continue work within the rail corridor in preparation for the extended closure of Yeronga station from 19 April 2021 for approximately six months. Yeronga station is being rebuilt to increase accessibility and create a better transport experience for all customers.

Details of work

The following activities are scheduled to occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday during April 2021, weather and construction conditions permitting:

- Commence foundation works for the temporary pedestrian overpass spanning the rail corridor
- Removal of redundant service conduits, inspection pits and platform furniture (e.g. electrical masts and light poles)
- Continuing platform 1 retaining wall demolition, and construction of new retaining walls including installing formwork, steel tying and concrete pours
- Installation of temporary sheet piles to commence construction of the elevator pit near the Lake Street station entry
- General station works including survey, visual inspections, and site fencing installation.

Out of hours work

Additional activities will occur outside the project's normal working hours but are timed to take place within a planned weekend track closure, as outlined below:

Signage will be in place to direct motorists, pedestrians and cyclists around works areas. Please observe the directions of traffic control while passing through the area.

What to expect

During these works you may notice some intermittent disruptions such as:

- Single lane southbound closure on Fairfield Road between Kadumba Street and Yeronga Street
- Temporary closure of Yeronga commuter car parking on Lake Street
- Light vehicles, trucks and machinery including excavators, mobile cranes, small power tools, drills, saws, vibrating equipment and mobile lighting towers to light the work areas at night
- Changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel
- Noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery and equipment.
