Fairfield station construction update

| During April 2021, the UNITY Alliance will continue construction activities in your local area.

Details of work

The following activities are scheduled to occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday, during April 2021, weather and construction conditions permitting:

- General station works including survey and visual inspections
- Identification and relocation of public utilities (water, sewer, communications and electrical)
- Overhead electrical line inspection and construction works
- Track and maintenance works in the rail corridor between Fairfield and Yeronga stations.

Out of hours work

The following activities will occur outside the project's normal working hours, but are timed to take place within planned weekend track closures, as outlined below:

Fairfield station	Intermittently over the Easter long weekend between 2:00am Friday 2 April and 2:00am Thursday 8 April 2021	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Extended works over the Easter long weekend and school holidays • General station works including survey and visual inspections • Service relocation works, including excavation and cable installation at Fairfield station • Track maintenance works including low impact vegetation clearing in the rail corridor.
Fairfield station	Intermittently between 2:00am Saturday 10 and 2:00am Monday 12 April 2021	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Track lowering preparation (e.g. survey) and track maintenance works • Overhead electrical line installation works • General station works including survey and visual inspections.

What to expect

During these works you may notice some intermittent disruptions such as:

- Delivery of plant, materials and equipment to the project corridor
- Light vehicles, trucks and machinery including excavators, frontend loader, mobile cranes, vacuum excavation truck, small power tools, drills, saws, minor vibrating equipment and mobile lighting towers to light work areas at night
- Changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel
- Some noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery and equipment
- Placement of temporary fencing around construction areas.

Cross River Rail is Queensland's largest rail infrastructure project. Works are outside of peak times to minimise disruption, so if travelling on weekends, or after 9pm on weeknights, plan your journey at translink.com.au, or call 13 12 30.
