Construction update Dutton Park station

From late August 2021, UNITY Alliance will commence early works in preparation for construction activities at Dutton Park station.

Details of work

The following activities are scheduled to occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday from late August 2021, weather and construction conditions permitting:

- Geotechnical investigations for underground rock and soil conditions involving the use of truck-mounted drill rigs adjacent to the rail corridor
- Access to 15 Cope Street, Annerley property car park for daytime geotechnical investigations
- General station and track investigations including survey and locating services.

Out of hours work

The following activities will occur outside the project's normal working hours but are timed to take place within planned weekend track closures, as outlined below:

Location	Date and hours of work	Type of work
Kent Street and Noble Street, Annerley	Intermittently between 7:00pm and 5:00am for 1-2 shifts August-October 2021	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Geotechnical investigations on Kent Street and Noble Street adjacent to the rail corridor, with the use of a single lane closure to undertake works.
Dutton Park station	Intermittently between 2:00am Saturday 9 and 2:00am Monday 11 October 2021	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Geotechnical investigations in the rail corridor • General station and track investigations including survey and locating services.

Signage will be in place to direct motorists, pedestrians and cyclists around works areas. Please observe the directions of traffic control while passing through the area.

What to expect

During these works you may notice some intermittent disruptions such as:

- A single lane closures and shoulder closures on Annerley Road, Noble Street, and Kent Street (refer to map overleaf) for 1-2 night shifts with traffic control in place to assist motorists, pedestrians, and cyclists
- Light vehicles, trucks and machinery including truck-mounted drilling rigs, vacuum trucks, cutting equipment, small power tools, minor vibrating equipment and mobile lighting towers to light work areas at night
- Changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel
- Some noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery and equipment
- Placement of temporary fencing around construction areas.

Cross River Rail will transform the way we travel to, from, and through Brisbane in the future. But right now, construction means disruption to train services.
