- participate in the school's co-curricular program if required
- actively support the Christian ethos of an Anglican School and the links with the Gungahlin Anglican Church in line with the Diocesan Ethos Statement
- other duties as required

- A relevant teaching qualification and experience teaching Senior School students.
- Have a working understanding and passion for the principles of positive education
- Good understanding of BSSS curriculum requirements
- A passion for effective teaching and learning
- An interest in working with adolescents

- A willingness to participate in curriculum development and professional development
