- Actively support the Christian ethos of an Anglican School
- Other duties as required

- A passion for effective teaching and learning
- An interest in working with adolescents
- The ability to differentiate the teaching program to address students' learning styles and varied academic needs;
- A willingness to participate in curriculum development and professional development
- Expertise or interest in the emotional, social and physical development of adolescents
- Experience in the meaningful integration of Information and Communications Technology (ICT) into the curriculum
- Experience in teaching students with special learning needs
- An area of interest that would contribute to the school's co-curricular program if required
