This ensures that our students have the essential, early years experiences to best prepare them for their schooling years. The Pre-prep program is an important part of the International Baccalaureate (IB) Primary Year Programme (PYP) that runs through to Year 6. PYP is a highly respected curriculum framework that is renowned for being academically rigorous. It is an inquiry-based, concept-driven approach that equips our students with the skills and knowledge required for senior schooling and for the workforce of the 21st century. The College's recent authorisation as an IB World School attests to the high standards of education being provided in the Junior School. The focus of the new Head of Teaching and Learning, Mrs Coles, is to introduce an inquiry teaching and learning model to Year 7 in 2015 and to build upon the excellent educational foundations created within the Junior School.

At Calvary, our distinctive is teaching from a Biblical perspective (inquiry through faith). In being unashamedly a Christian College, we also focus on Christian discipleship through assisting our students to discover God's love, providing pastoral care, fostering character development and developing resilience. In following this year's theme, 'ibelong', we are seeking to develop a positive mindset in your children. In the next edition, I will focus on 'developing a positive mindset'. In the Chaplain's Corner, many articles will be written about how we focus on Christian discipleship. We hope that your children have had a positive start to the school year.

P&F AGMs







2. For three weeks they will meet their assigned group of students after assembly to unpack some interesting and creative skits performed by the Chaplaincy Team. The theme of each skit will be based on the last three rules of the My Life Rulz social/emotional development program.

Over the last ten years, peer mentoring programs have grown to become integral components of the College's pastoral care program. Personally I am proud of the popularity it has with students and the unique contribution it makes towards our College. What I am learning is effective teaching is not just delivered by our teachers but by all members of the community. Our students have proven to be great teachers, guides and role models to our younger students particularly in the area of social/emotional and spiritual development. In fact, many social skills, such as cyber safety and friendship skills, are better taught to younger students by their older peers.
