Enrolment Procedure

How to enrol:

1. Complete Application Form (one form for each student) either online or paper application form.
2. Return Application Form together with:
 - Birth Certificate
 - Immunization records (for Kindergarten and Prep students only)
 - Evidence of citizenship/visa status if applicable
 - 2 most recent school reports
 - NAPLAN results if applicable (Year 3, 5, 7 or 9)
 - Court orders / parenting agreement if applicable
 - \$110.00 application fee
3. Upon processing, a receipt will be issued and returned to you with a covering letter.
4. If the enrolment is for the current year (and a place is available) you will be contacted for an enrolment interview at which time both the student and parents attend. It will be necessary to supply the latest copy of school report at the interview if not already supplied with the Application Form.
5. If the enrolment is for the following year, enrolment interviews will commence during Term 1.
6. If enrolment is for future years, you will be contacted the year prior to commencement for an enrolment interview.
7. The interview will generally be held with the Dean or Head of College.
8. Within two weeks of the interview, an email will advise if a place is being offered.
9. If a place is offered, an Enrolment Contract be completed and returned together with an Enrolment Bond paid within 14 days to secure the position. The bond is refundable as per the Fees Policy. The Fees Policy will be issued with the Enrolment Contract. A receipt will then be issued. Once the Bond and completed Enrolment Contract have been received by the college, the enrolment is confirmed.
10. If the place is being offered for the following year, an information pack including uniform price list, stationery lists etc will be forwarded in Term 4.
11. It is school policy that any sibling students wishing to enrol will be given priority on any *waiting list*. However, siblings are not automatically enrolled. Parents need to complete an application form for each sibling, attend an enrolment interview and complete an enrolment contract for each child.

- Flat Fee \$43.30

The Flat Fee applies regardless of the length of time the child attends the session.

Vacation Care prices do not include excursion/incursion costs. (Refer vacation care program for further information.)

Late fees apply for any student collected after 6.00pm. (Refer OSHC parent handbook.)

OSHC fees will be invoiced separately to school fees by the Finance Office.

Application Fee

A non-refundable application fee of \$110 per child is payable to the College upon submission of an Enrolment application.

Enrolment Bond Fee

When a place is offered, parents are required to sign an Enrolment Contract and pay an enrolment bond. The enrolment bond is refundable to the original payer when the last student in the family leaves the College, after all accounts have been finalised, and hire books, library books and all College resources have been returned.

Enrolment Bond for Kindergarten to Year 12 is \$500.00 per student

It is important to note that the enrolment bond **will be forfeited** if the student's enrolment is cancelled before commencement at the College, or if a student is withdrawn without one term's notice in writing to the College.

The enrolment bond must be paid prior to the student commencing.

Other Sundry Charges

- Printing costs are charged directly to students my student account. Top up of accounts can be made at www.mystudentaccount.com.au
- Other charges may apply throughout the year for special activities although the College endeavours to keep them to a minimum.
- Co-curricular charges may also apply depending on activities chosen. Details will be provided at the time.

General Conditions

- Tuition fees are effective from 1 January 2018 and will remain until such time as they are changed by the College Board of Directors. The Board reserves the right to change fees at any time.
- The parents/guardians who have signed the enrolment contract with the College are joint and severally liable for the student's fees, and any other associated costs, unless a court order specifies differently. Copies of any relevant court orders or any documents stating alternate parenting or financial responsibilities must be provided to the College.
- College fees are issued at the beginning of each Semester and are due and payable by the due dates listed on the fees account.
- Overdue fees will be subject to an account service fee and interest in accordance with College policy.
- The College may grant an extension of time for payment in exceptional circumstances outside the parents' control. A request for extension of time for payment shall be made in writing to the Business Manager prior to the due date.
- A student shall not be allowed to commence a new Semester at the College if the College fees for the previous Semester have not been paid. The College may terminate the enrolment of a student if fees remain unpaid.
- The College reserves the right to withhold College reports and/or Year 12 certificates if fees remain unpaid at the end of Semester.

Withdrawal of Students

Parents must give a minimum of one full term's notice, in writing, to the College prior to the withdrawal date. If withdrawal is to be effective at the end of the school year, written notice must be given by the end of Term 3.

If parents fails to given written notice as required, it is College policy that the parent will be charged for the subsequent term's fees.

GST

Most of the College's fees and charges are not subject to the Goods and Services Tax (GST). Any applicable charges will incur GST and will be specifically identified on the account.

Playgroup

Playgroup is held each Thursday and Friday morning during school term time from 8.30am to 10.30am in the Junior School. Children aged from birth to school age are most welcome to attend with parents, carers or other family members. There is a joining of \$25 per family and then the cost is \$5 per family each session.

Playgroup provides a safe environment which enables your child to play with other children and participate in new play experiences whilst increasing their social and communication skills.

Children attending Playgroup develop new friendships and learn simple rules and routines which assist with the transition into Kindy and Prep in future years. Playgroup also provides an opportunity for parents and caregivers to share ideas, information and experiences.

Kindergarten – book early to avoid disappointment!

Our rich and diverse Curriculum is built around exploring the Foundation Learning Areas of Thinking, Communication, Sense of Self and Others, Social Living and Learning, Health and Physical Understanding, Cultural Understanding and Understanding Environments.

Canterbury College Kindergarten is government approved Kindergarten and a **registered care facility**. Each Kindergarten class has a maximum number of students with a full time teacher and teacher aide. Actual classroom hours are from 8.30am to 3.15pm however, the annual fee also covers Before School Care from 6.45am and After School Care (including afternoon tea) to 6.00pm. Vacation Care is available but subject to availability as there is a minimum number of students required to attend each day in order to offer the Vacation Care program. **Registered Care Rebates** are available and information is available from Centrelink.

Part time and Full time positions are available in Kindergarten.

There are two part time options available.

Option 1 – Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday

Option 2 - Wednesday, Thursday and Friday

Option 3 – A Monday, Tuesday class may be offered subject to availability and demand

Two Year Kindergarten Option

Please note that enrolment into Kindergarten for 2 years, followed by Prep, is now an option available to you. In order to attend Kindergarten for 2 years, children must be aged 3 prior to commencement and fully toilet trained. Please ask our Enrolments Officer for further information.

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD)

As part of our College's learning environment, all students in Years 4 – 12 are required to bring their own device (BYOD). The device is used every day. Students are required to bring the device fully charged to school each day and be responsible for its maintenance and care.

All students enrolled at Canterbury College have access to the latest version of Windows 10 for Education and the Microsoft Professional software suite from the College portal. Other software is provided based on selected subjects. Students are able to log into the Canterbury portal (my.canterbury.qld.edu.au) and select the "BYOT Software Catalogue" to install any required packages.

Many students have a computer now which will still be viable in 2018/2019. Devices with the capacity of Windows 10, 4GB RAM, 128 GB SSD and a battery life of 6 hours should still meet the students' needs. WE emphasize that many devices will be suitable with the exception being a MAC operating system.

The College is moving to a Windows only operating system. Students who currently have MAC OS devices will be required to install Windows on their device exclusively or using a dual boot method such as Apple's built in "Boot Camp". Instructions for this can be found on the College website. The College recommends partitioning 128GB of hard drive space for Windows if possible, and 64GB at minimum. The Windows 10 Education ISO is available via the College portal.

The College recommends the use of a stylus which is particularly useful for the STEM subjects. To assist those families who are purchasing or upgrading, we offer the following information.

Operating System: Windows 10
Processor: 6th Generation Intel Core i or Core m processor - Recommended 7th Gen i5
Ram: 4GB – Recommended 8GB
Hard Drive: 128GB – Recommended 256GB SSD
Battery: 6 hours usage time

While not required, devices with a solid state hard drive (SSD) and a touch screen with stylus are highly recommended. Some Senior School subjects may have more specific requirements and in these situations we suggest parents refer to the College's subject selection booklet.

Studio Program

Canterbury College is an amazing place for your children to grow - and to meet their potential in so many different ways. One of the most integrated ways Canterbury supports student development outside the classroom is through the Studio Program.

The Studio Program has 20 specialist music, dance and speech, drama and communication teachers who deliver individual and shared lessons. Our Studio Teachers engage their students within a supportive atmosphere that encourages every child to develop and meet their artistic potential.

Some key questions and answers:

When do students have their lessons?

- The Studio Program sits within the curriculum offerings of the College with lessons being delivered throughout the school day.
- In the majority of cases students have their lessons during the school day on a rotating timetable. For example, this week the lessons might be at 9.00am, next week at 10.30am, the following week at 12.00pm, then 1.30pm etc. cycling through the school day. This allows students to remain fully engaged in their subjects while being extended through studio lessons.
- All class teachers receive the weekly studio schedule and are able to support students as needed.

How are lesson times communicated?

- Students will have the next lesson time stamped in their school diary, parents will receive an email on the Friday of the preceding week advising of the lesson time, and the time is also posted outside the studio music wing.
- Studio teachers will collect students who forget their studio lessons and teach them for the remainder of their lesson time. Students in K to Year 2 will be collected from, and taken back to, their class as part of the lesson.
- Parents also receive regular updates on how their child is progressing.

How much do lessons cost and how do I pay?

- Individual lessons cost \$31.00 per lesson, and paired lessons cost \$16.50 per lesson. The lessons are billed with your School Fees account towards the end of each term

Which instruments are available?

- All, except didgeridoo (although it could be arranged).
- The main instruments we're currently most keen for students to learn are Flute, Clarinet, Trumpet and Trombone

How much practice will students need to do?

- Taking a studio lesson is to be considered the same as all other classes in that there is homework, which we call practice.
- Depending on the desired rate of progress, students will practice between 10 minutes four times a week and about two hours six days a week. The latter times are for those students looking to study music after Year 12.
- For most students, 15-20 minutes, four or five times a week will result in good progress.
