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

Australian Business Week (ABW) Enterprise Education

We are excited about our involvement in the Australian Business Week (ABW) Enterprise Education later this month. Australian Business Week (ABW) Enterprise Education programs incorporate computer-simulated business environments, along with trade displays, promotional videos, company reports and oral presentations. In the safety of a virtual world, Year 10 students will assume management roles in running a hotel chain and make decisions (good or bad!) that affect business performance. The program will replace the student's regular curriculum for a one-week period (26-30 November), allowing students to immerse themselves in the virtual business world. Because it is experiential learning, rather than a lecture, it is invaluable in encouraging teamwork and a sense of responsibility, exercising decision-making skills, and boosting confidence.

Secondary School students are on the cusp of adult life, but often a very long way from having the skills and confidence they need to negotiate life as an adult. ABW Enterprise Education programs can have a tremendous impact on these students, allowing them to experience the business world in an adult role, via a safe, simulated environment.

We are grateful for the support of this program from some prominent Sunshine Coast business leaders and supporters of the College who will join us throughout the week as Business Mentors and attend on Friday 30 November as judges.

During my Seminary years, we discussed the notion that, during worship the voices of believers here on earth join the praise of God's heavenly host. In other words: God receives continuous praise and glory from the throng of angels that surround him – intermittently, voices from our time and space add to this.

In fact, believers who have gone ahead of us, are part of this giant chorus too – something we remember in this week of All Souls Sunday.

Year 12 Valedictory Day (16 November)

Friday of next week will see the last day of school for Year 12 students. On Monday, they will spend some time together for the traditional ceremony of Cutting the Net. On Friday, they will gather for the Walk of Faith where they will be farewelled by all in the College. The Walk of Faith (commencing at 9.00am) will lead them to their Valedictory Service (their final worship time together), and then on to their Valedictory Dinner with their parents. I thank them all for the contributions that they have made to Immanuel and wish them every success in their future endeavours.

Australian Business Week – Year 10 (26-30 November)

Year 10 students will participate in a business simulation program, Australian Business Week (ABW) during week 7. The ABW program is designed to encourage independent and cooperative learning skills and to develop an enterprise mindset prior to entering the workforce or proceeding to further study. Students will be divided into teams and will spend the week:

- Managing a hotel business through a computer simulation;
- Learning from guest speakers from business and the community;
- Developing a new product/service of their own invention;
- Creating a video and trade display to advertise that product;
- Delivering a verbal and written report of the week's activities;
- Interacting with business people and teachers as facilitators.

The program simulates a two-year business cycle. Teams will be in competition and in order to succeed, students learn all the basics of business operation from profit and loss through to planning and marketing. On the last day there will be a trade display by all the companies. The program is an intensive learning experience that aims to be challenging, enjoyable and very rewarding for all involved.

Year 11 Exam Block (22-29 November)

The Year 11 examination schedule will commence part way through Week 7 and will continue into Week 8. Students will have study-at-home privileges providing that they have submitted all due work. We wish them all the very best for their final assessments.

Year 11 Servant Leadership Retreat (30 November)

On Friday 30 November, Year 11 students will participate in their servant leadership retreat. Commencing at 8.40am (immediately after Home Group) it is expected that they will attend the retreat all day. This means that they will be required to reschedule music lessons and any other commitments they have, where necessary. Students will also need to organise their morning tea, lunch, a water bottle and a pen for the day. They may wear suitable casual clothes (Home Group teachers will explain the dress requirements) and will require a hat to wear during break times. As they will spend most of the day working on the floor, it is advisable that they bring along a pillow or cushion for extra comfort. 
