## Dear Marist Family,

### 1968: A Year to Remember

1968 was a year to remember. The anti-Vietnam War and civil rights movements in the United States, the Russian invasion of Czechoslovakia, famine in Africa and the assassinations of Robert Kennedy and Martin Luther King all represented a time of seismic social and political change across the globe. Mattel's Hot Wheels toy cars were introduced and Yale University announced it was finally going to admit female students. *Planet of the Apes* was the world's most popular film and the Beatles, once again, topped the charts with the hit single *Hey Jude*. Closer to our shores, Australia's Prime Minister Harold Holt drowned near Portsea in Victoria, Nauru declared independence from Australia, and Marist College Canberra opened its doors to 91 students in Years 4 (57) and 5 (34) for the first time. In its relatively short history, the College has grown to now educate over 1,600 boys, it employs approximately 180 staff and has in excess of 10,000 former students! Many of our graduates have made extraordinary contributions to this country and beyond, but more importantly, all those who have shared time with us have hopefully cultivated a faith in God and a sense of purpose and meaning by making the gospel values a reality in their lives.

Our Jubilee celebrations are a time to reflect on the past, look to the future and give thanks to the many Marist Brothers, staff and students who have contributed in so many ways to the mission, values and identity of the College. Despite 50 years of extraordinary change, the values and beliefs founded by the Marist Brothers remain. Our Marist values of family spirit, simplicity, love of work, mindful presence and in the way of Mary, continue to guide our community.

It is my pleasure to welcome boys, families and staff to our Jubilee year. We particularly welcome those new to our community to what we trust will be a significant relationship in the years ahead. In so many ways we begin our journey together. Beginnings always bring new challenges, which can be exciting and at times daunting. Our Year 11 and 12 students have the challenge of quickly settling back into the intensity of study while our new boys, primarily in Years 4 and 7, face the hurdles of making new friends and finding their particular areas of interest and talents. Beginnings are also an ideal time to sort out priorities, before it is too late. At no other time are boys more ready to establish routines. Whilst having a good routine may not seem as important in the early years, I believe however, that unless the patterns of study are instilled when boys are younger it will be very difficult for them to suddenly become a disciplined scholar in their final years.

I would like to thank parents for supporting the College in ensuring the boys returned to school displaying a high standard of dress and grooming.

As we journey together throughout the year, may we enjoy collegiality and friendship that are the marks of a caring community. I wish you and your son(s) a fruitful and happy year ahead.

May St Marcellin continue to watch over our boys and their families.



When considering registering, there are a couple of points which all students need to be aware of:

1. Students currently representing the College in cricket, basketball or rowing: You **must** continue to honour that training and playing commitment even if there may be an overlap with the pre-season training of your chosen winter sport. Your first priority is to your summer team. In doing this you will not be disadvantaged in your winter sport selections.
2. When choosing a winter sport remember that you are expected to attend all training sessions and all games during the season. In doing so, you are supporting your coach and your team mates.
3. College sporting teams play in an age-based competition. All boys are registered to play in their appropriate age level. The College endeavours to ensure that we maximise the participation levels during competition which may require the movement of students up an age group. The College and the clubs work together to ensure if there is a need for this to happen, it is managed appropriately.
