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NON-UNIFORM DAY DRESS STANDARDS

The dress and personal grooming of students should, at all times, reflect the high standards expected by the School. Dress should be 'smart casual'.

Students are to ensure that clothing is modest and not excessively revealing or tight.

Skirts and shorts should be a reasonable length, i.e. similar length to the School sports shorts. Shoulders, midribs and chests are to be covered. Underwear should not be visible.

Images, logos and writing on any item of clothing must not be offensive.

The School's rules concerning hair, make-up and jewellery are to be observed. It is expected that students' hair styles are sensible and reflect the conservative and professional nature of the School. Hair must be neat, tidy and clean. Extreme hairstyles are not to be worn.

Shoes should be closed with low heels, and provide adequate support and protection. Trainers are preferred.

Hats should provide adequate protection from the sun. Hats may not be worn inside.

Students must wear normal uniform for Physical Education lessons, House Events and School Sport.

Any student whose appearance is contrary to the above guidelines may be sent home until such time as their appearance meets the expectations of the School.
