As the Terrace Family, we commit our energies to forming young men of faith and learning who will make a difference.

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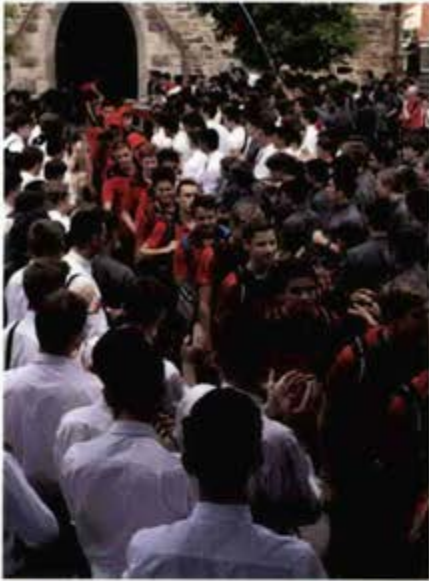

Principal



This year has been another significant and successful year for our great College. It does not seem as though any time has passed since I presented my previous College Yearbook report. The last twelve months have gone very quickly and I am pleased with what has occurred over this time.

At the centre of St Joseph's College, Gregory Terrace is the fact that we are a Catholic boys' school in the tradition of our Founder, Blessed Edmund Rice. We continue to be proud of our history as a Christian Brothers' College and that the touchstones of:

- Gospel Spirituality
- Liberating Education
- Inclusive Community, and
- Justice and Solidarity

form the nucleus and provide the direction for what we do and how we go about enacting our vision.

It would be fair to say that 2016 has very much been a year of strategic development and detailing our future directions.

In 2016, two significant and strategic documents were produced and endorsed. The first of these documents was the College's Strategic Plan, titled *GT 2020: Join the Journey*. The plan identified the five key areas of:

1. Faith and Mission
2. Teaching and Learning
3. Atmosphere of Care
4. Co-Curricular Programs
5. Governance and Stewardship

The Strategic Plan provides key initiatives in each of these areas that

will guide the strategic directions for the College over the next five years. My thanks to those involved in the development of this plan, in particular the staff who were instrumental in producing this document. I am confident that *GT2020* will guide the College well over the coming years.

The second key document developed this year has been the College Master Plan. The completion of this document has been the culmination of a significant amount of work over the last eighteen months. The Master Plan provides a blueprint for the capital development of the College's facilities for the next ten years. The Master Plan is aligned with the Strategic Plan and together they ensure that key strategic directions and developments for the College are set for the future. I wish to acknowledge and thank the members of the College Master Plan Committee for the extraordinary guidance they provided in the development of this document.

As a Catholic School in the Edmund Rice tradition we must continue to be faithful to *The Charter* and enact the touchstones in all that we do. The spiritual and mission life of the College has been a central focus throughout 2016. The Retreat and Formation program, liturgical celebrations, Eddie's Van and the Big Brekkie program, along with the range of Immersion opportunities for staff and students are some of the ways in which we, as the Terrace Family, live the touchstones.

This year I had the privilege to travel to India as part of the Edmund Rice Education Beyond Borders (EREBB) Congress, which saw representatives from Edmund Rice Schools from twenty-two countries across the world join together in solidarity. Being part of this global Edmund Rice movement will continue to enrich what we do at Terrace.

As a College our core business is focussed on the provision of a high quality educational experience for all our students. The deep-seated 'Culture of Learning' at Terrace has again been very evident in 2016 and is a reflection of the strong partnership that exists between staff, students and parents.

The Year 12 results from 2015 were exceptional with thirty students receiving an OP1 with a median score of OP5. These extraordinary results have continued in 2016 with record numbers of students receiving Academic Medals at each of the Academic Assemblies during the year. Solid NAPLAN results in Years 5, 7 and 9 were again achieved and I am confident that the consistent work ethic of the Year 12 cohort will ensure that they produce strong OP results in 2016.

The educational landscape continues to change in Australia and it is important that we, as a College, evolve accordingly. The changes to the Senior School Curriculum have, and will continue to form a major focus. Our task remains to provide excellence in teaching, learning and supporting a strong partnership between staff, students and parents.

A dedicated 'Atmosphere of Care' characterises the pastoral program at Terrace. The House System, now in its twenty-fifth year is the cornerstone to this. The strong and supportive relationship that is manifested through the House System, its Tutor Groups and the Buddy program have again proved vital in 2016. The Tutor Group model will evolve in 2017 to include students from Years 5 to 12 in each Tutor Group. This change will further strengthen the pastoral relationships amongst students.

Next year will see some changes with House Deans and I wish to acknowledge the outstanding contributions made by Mrs Madonna Effeney who is retiring and Mr Adrian Pauley who, as the last of the original House Deans, steps down to pursue another role within the College. Both of these teachers have made significant contributions to the Terrace Family over an extended period of time and I offer my thanks for their commitment and service.

The provision of a holistic and inclusive education remains a key priority at Terrace. This focus is evidenced through our academic, pastoral and spiritual programs but is further enhanced by the College's extensive co-curricular programs.

The Sporting and Cultural programs of the College highlight a strong desire to provide both excellence and participatory components. The past year has seen Terrace produce outstanding co-curricular results, performances on the world stage and record numbers of student involvement. My thanks are extended to the staff, parents and Old Boys who have been involved this year. I also wish to acknowledge the outstanding contributions made by the Support Groups throughout 2016.

Whilst there have been many co-curricular highlights during 2016, the singing of *Hallelujah* at Anzac Cove and the thousands of people at Tennyson for the final round of Rugby, are amongst my personal highlights of the year.

The Terrace Family is made up of many parts – the staff, the parents and the students and it is these people that form the heart of this family. I would like to acknowledge and thank the dedicated and caring staff for their valuable contributions to Terrace during 2016. Your professional approach to your vocation as educators is key to the academic success that Terrace enjoys. I acknowledge those staff who leave Terrace this year. I thank them for their contributions over the years and wish them the very best with their future journey.

The success of any organisation is significantly influenced by the leadership team. I am very fortunate to have a team that is extraordinarily committed, highly competent and truly dedicated to all aspects of the College. I wish to thank Mr Chris Ryan, Mrs Julie Quinn, Ms Zoe Morgan, Mr Charles Brauer, Mr Adam Read and Mr Damien Fall for their support and leadership throughout 2016.

The Terrace Family is blessed with a supportive and involved parent community. Your support of your sons and the College is a key ingredient in the success of the College. I particularly thank those parents who have been involved with the various Support Groups. The generosity of your time was pivotal to the success of 2016. I thank the College Board, its committees and the College Foundation

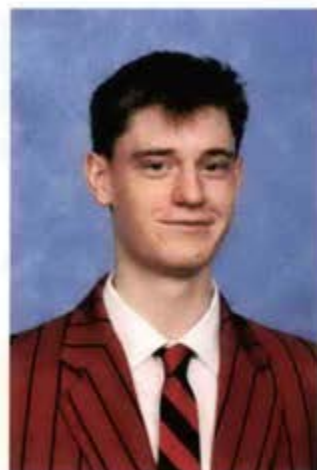

The direction and enhancement of the Faith and Mission program of the College throughout the year has been greatly influenced by renewal. The Catholic Church's Jubilee Year of Mercy, the launch of key Edmund Rice Education Australia (EREA) programs and our College's Strategic Plan *GT2020* have provided key milestones and areas of focus for the College. Most importantly, this renewal has provided a tremendous opportunity for the College's Faith and Mission to continue to be a critical component of a Terrace education, honouring the College Mission with forming young men of faith and learning.

Our Church's Jubilee Year of Mercy has called on Catholic communities around the world to consider how they are being authentic with inviting others into relationships that are built on the Gospel values of compassion and tolerance. The College's Campus Ministry and Religious Education programs have provided our students with rich experiences that foster these values, while also instilling a spirit of service whereby each young man is inspired to make a difference.

Our Campus Ministry program has focused on animating the Faith and Mission aspirations of *GT2020*. Of particular note is the strengthening of our Timor-Leste Friendship through the continuation of the Year 10 Timor-Leste Immersion, the Years 5 and 6 Lenten Appeal, the College-wide Timor Week and the introduction of the Kolega Café. The Terrace Timor Network (TTN) continues to be a vital leader of support to the Timor-Leste ministry of the Christian Brothers, Comunidade Edmund Rice (CER). Additionally, TTN provides wonderful possibilities for parents to be involved in the same Campus Ministry programs as their sons.

Also of significance, has been the further enhancement of our Edmund Rice Bursary program. Ensuring students and their families are encouraged and supported has seen the introduction of a new Teacher/Campus Minister role at the College. Mr David Tubb has led with tremendous energy and commitment to the academic and pastoral support of the students of this program.

Ensuring students have an opportunity to be critically reflective of the participation in Campus Ministry programs requires an integration with the College's curriculum. This year's Religious Education validation process has affirmed that our teachers are fulfilling the role as key stakeholders in the faith formation and education of our young men. As Head of Faculty Religious Education, Mrs Louise Cosgrove has done a tremendous job in her first year in the role of leading this validation process.

Our identity as a Catholic school in the Edmund Rice tradition has been affirmed with this year's inaugural

Edmund Rice Education Beyond Borders Congress. Recognising that we join nearly 300 schools around the world as stewards of an Edmund Rice Education has been a heartening experience for our College. An experience that will no doubt expand into growing opportunities for all members of the Terrace Family.

The Faith and Mission program of the College owes much thanks to members of the Terrace Family. As College Chaplain and dear friend, Fr Gerard Hall's ongoing humble and empowering presence is a true asset of the College. A sincere thank you is extended to Fr Gerard Hall, Fr Chris Ketsore, Fr James O'Donahue and the Very Reverend Dr David Pascoe for their ongoing support of our College liturgies. Campus Ministry



Our College motto, *Servire Deo Sapere* (to serve God is to be wise) is a powerful and challenging statement that captures the heart of Catholic education in the Edmund Rice tradition. There are many opportunities to connect to this wisdom in various aspects of the school as students grow in their journey at Terrace. Opportunities that put the College motto into practice are available through Campus Ministry and include the Big Brekkie program, retreats and a variety of service initiatives.

Every morning a team of staff and students meet at 6.15am to prepare a meal to share with the local homeless community at Wickham Park. Throughout the year we engage with our homeless friends through a simple hot meal and conversation. Our Senior students continue to be outstanding ambassadors of this program and their genuine presence helps to break down stereotypes of homelessness. Big Brekkie happens five mornings a week throughout the year due to the dedicated staff, Old Boys and parents who generously give their time and energy.

The four Year 12 Kairos retreats continue to be a highlight of the Terrace experience for our Senior men. Places on these voluntary three-day

retreats are highly sought after and the learning continues to unfold for our young men throughout the year. There are a further 31 retreats that provide an opportunity for all students to become more aware of their relationship with self, others and God. Our Years 11 and 12 students generously invest time in preparing personal stories and running small groups for the Years 7 and 8 retreats; a Terrace tradition which promotes authentic reflection for all involved. I would like to thank the Outdoor Education team for their week-long program and debrief model, which is a catalyst for this reflection, as well as the House Deans for their weekly commitment. I am particularly grateful for the enormous investment made by the following staff in sharing personal reflections and acting as leaders on Kairos retreats in 2016: Mr Anthony Baruksopulo, Mr Glenn Cameron, Dr Michael Carroll, Mrs Louise Cosgrove, Mr Ken Hainstock, Mr Rob Johnson, Mr David Mandall, Mr Will Marshall, Mr Anthony O'Shea, Mr Rob Sweeper and Mr David Tubb.

The opportunities for our young men to engage with the wider community have continued to grow in 2016.

Many of these initiatives, House Friendship Groups, Lenten Appeal, Timor-Leste, India and Matthew 25 Immersions, Edmund Rice Camps (Head to Heart), Blanket and Food Bank Food Drive and ERA for Change, only run due to the generosity of staff, for which I am very grateful.

Terrace Timor *Network*



The year 2016 has been one of consolidation and sustainability for the Terrace Timor Network, against a backdrop of evolution of the people of Timor and the organisations committed to walking beside them.

Kolega Coffee continued its evolution as several schools in Queensland launched 'Kolega Cafés', student run coffee shops serving delicious Timorese Coffee. Enthusiastic students at Nudgee College pioneered the concept, which has now been replicated at St John Fisher College and Gregory Terrace. Coffee sales through the newly revamped Justice Products webstore continue to grow, with the webstore receiving well over a thousand orders to date.

The Kolega curriculum initiative has been a tremendous success this year, engaging students in real world learning about the challenges faced in developing countries like Timor-Leste. In the context of learning about the poverty cycle in rural Timor-Leste, students have an opportunity to help break the poverty cycle - by participating

in 'being' the export market for Timorese hand crafted gift cards.

Students learn the story, become part of the story, and can change the story, one pack of cards at a time. By purchasing one pack of cards, two days of work is provided to a woman in rural East Timor. A comprehensive program with all supporting materials, and special website codes has been made available, enabling schools to quickly implement and track their successes. Schools involved include Gregory Terrace, Lourdes Hill, St Edmunds' Ipswich, St James, Stuartholme, St Edmunds' Wahroonga and St Gabriel's near Sydney.

The TTN Vanilla project, funded by the Edmund Rice Foundation, continued on its path to establishing a sustainable vanilla industry in the villages. The TTN trained local project officers have engaged with numerous community groups, established three demonstration sites, trained nearly 100 farmers in composting techniques and identified twenty new growers with suitable land and water. From desktop research with the University

of Queensland in 2014, to now its second year of a five year plan, this project is already setting the bar for community engagement and results.

Following extensive planning and fundraising, Easter of 2016 saw the first stages of construction of the Trades' Training Workshop in Taraso. This facility, a joint project with Comunidade Edmund Rice, TTN and the village of Taraso, will provide a facility and training for trades such as bricklaying, carpentry, construction and plumbing. Students will receive certifications which will enable them to find employment, as well as teaching important skills needed in the building of the future of Timor-Leste.

Some particular highlights for Terrace this year were the annual community Festa, which saw the transformation of the Treacy Court into a Timorese village, complete with the famous Timor Tavern. The College also hosted a range of ceremonies for Timor Week, including an inspiring speech by TTN's first manager in Timor, and culminating in the opening of the Terrace Kolega Cafe.

As our time at Terrace draws to a close, my wife Bernadette and I are passing the torch of TTN to a new group of wonderful volunteers who have stepped forward to lead the next chapter.

It has been a privilege and an honour to be part of the journey of changing lives over the last five years, and to everyone who has and is involved, we offer our heartfelt thanks. We are really fortunate to have such a strong team moving into these roles. The amazing vision of the founders of TTN is alive and well, and the future of the Terrace Timor Network is in safe hands.

Years 5 and 6

This year has been a year of great progress for Years 5 and 6 with more students being given the opportunity to be a part of the Terrace experience with the addition of extra classes.

The year began with Year 5 numbers increasing to 108 students across four classes and as a result an additional class colour, 5 White, was established. Mr Peter Finnegan led Year 5 and 6 for one term before he decided to move back to Melbourne to be closer to his family and we thank him for his contribution. To begin Term 3, we welcomed Mr Deen Mewburn into Year 6. Deen is a great asset to the team and has made an immediate impact and connection with the students.

Our results in the academic program were exceptionally high, demonstrated by an increase in the numbers of students attending Honours and

Exceptional Learner programs. Our Year 5 students were once again brilliant through NAPLAN, achieving 100% in elements of the overall assessment. An annual highlight is, of course, our Science Fair. The energy and dedication of students was evident through the Science Fair where a high level of research and effort was on display for the community.

One of the positive experiences of the year was our increased involvement in living the values that make us an exemplary EREA school and which connect us with this wider school network. In Term 1 Years 5 and 6 were once again instrumental in raising sufficient funds for a medical transporter to be purchased in Timor-Leste. These funds were raised through our annual Lenten Appeal which included our Lenten Walk and culminated with our Lenten Fair. In Term

The year has again proved to be one where our boys have strived to give their best efforts to achieve their maximum outcomes.

The number of medals awarded after Semester 1 results this year reached a maximum of 298, which represents almost twenty percent of the student population.

Our Seniors of 2015 scored a median OP5 and thirty boys received an OP1. This placed the cohort second in the state of Queensland, which was the highest rank Terrace has achieved over past years.

Our Naplan results, outlining expertise in numeracy and literacy, continue to be strong in comparison to the state.

We continue to prepare for the new Senior assessment system that will be introduced for Year 11 2019.

Our teaching staff continue to motivate

and inspire our boys. Their dedication and expertise are much appreciated and integral to the success of our boys.

Below are some reflections from teachers and students about their experiences at Terrace:

Teacher's reflection:

The teaching and learning activities reflected real world practices and hopefully provided students with the knowledge to make informed decisions in their life journey.

The students in Years 9 and 10 Business Education were exposed to the tumultuous world of investment, marketing, the changing nature of work, an introduction to Legal Studies and the processes involved in Accounting. The Years 11 and 12 Accounting students engaged

in accounting practices that are completed every day in both profit and not-for-profit organisations. They learnt that the financial documentation is used to fulfil the objectives of accounting and that without reliable and accurate information poor decisions are made which can impact on many stakeholders.

In June we had a number of students participate in the EcoMan program. The program provided students with an excellent opportunity to participate in a simulation as a co-director of an operating company which had been running for four years. The students then ran the company successfully for a further four years, which was simulated over a three-day period. At the end of the period the students presented relevant information in regard to share price, profit and strategic direction to the shareholders.

The boys are to be commended not only for the way that they conducted themselves during the three-day program but also on their presentation at the AGM. They answered questions from the shareholders (parents and facilitators) and were able to hold their ground with respect to their responses to some very difficult questions.

"The Ecoman program is one of very high value. As someone who doesn't do any curricular studies of the concepts covered in this program, it was a very valuable experience, full of useful information. It was very effectively and efficiently run by the two 'presenters', Bob and Barry, who were both very knowledgeable and helpful, as well as being approachable and friendly. A perfect combination for any such activity I think. If any other student asked me if I would recommend this program, my answer would be a resounding 'absolutely'. It is a worthwhile use of our time and the fact that we have not yet adopted Ecoman into our curriculum is yet another fault of the Australian education system. 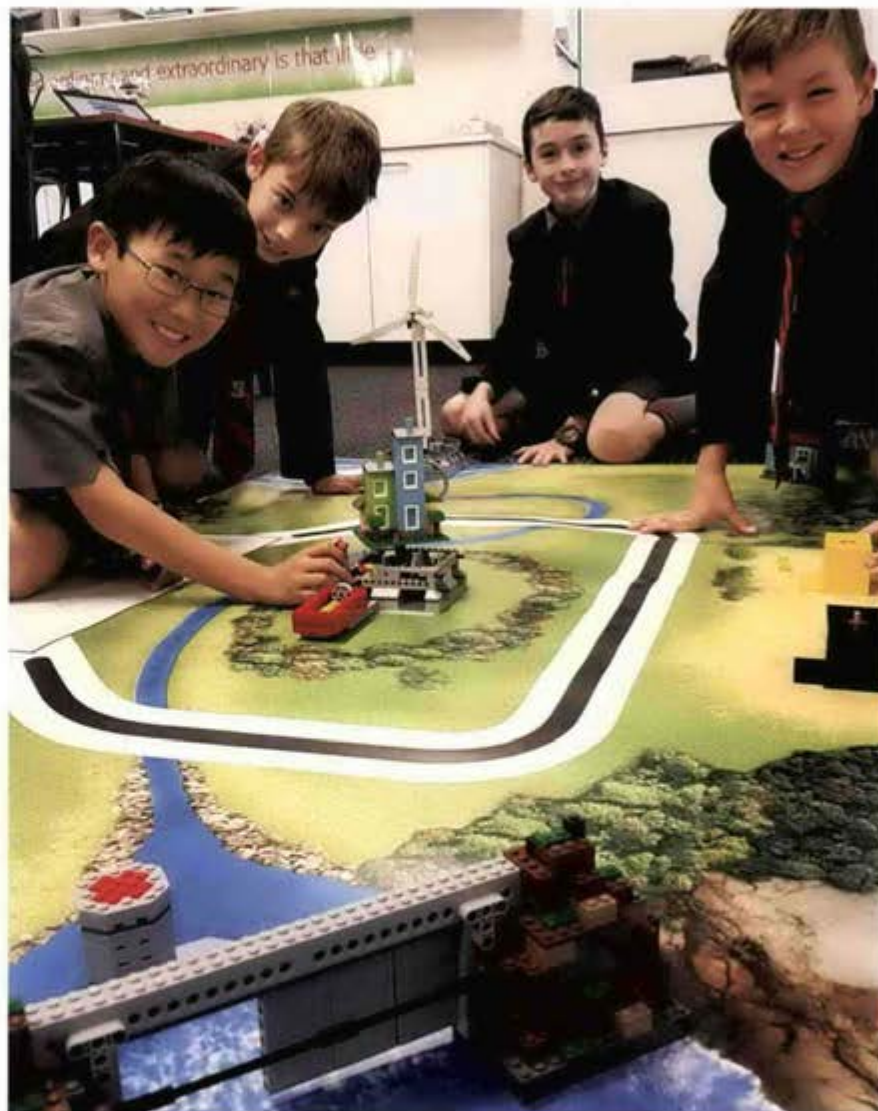
This year saw a record number of Senior students undertake the study of Economics, with 135 students completing Year 12 Economics.

Honours Classes

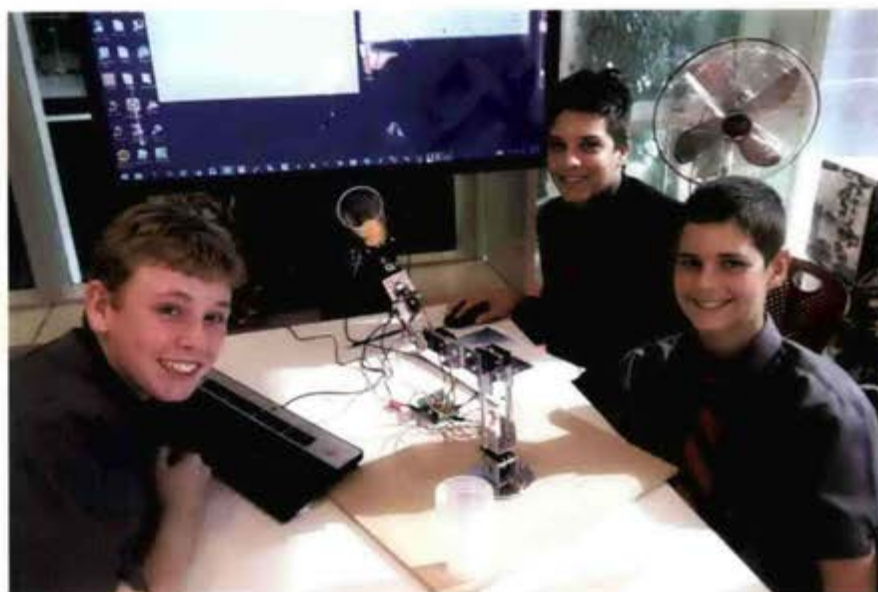
Our boys in Years 6-10 are invited to extend their thinking and learning when they demonstrate a gift or talent in an area of interest. Our Math Honours boys have achieved a great deal of success the details of which are on the Math faculty page. Our English Honours program has also provided the students who love English with an opportunity to discuss and analyse themes they are learning in class in greater detail. These programs are

travelled to Melbourne in October and performed admirably and should be proud of their achievements.

Clusters and Clubs

We provide opportunities such as All Hallows' clusters for our young men to extend themselves in further extension work. This is also the case for Year 6 students who represented Terrace at the GPS day of Academic Excellence. Our younger Terracians also had opportunities with Year 5 participating in Honours in Term 4. The Years 5 and 6 students were nominated by their teachers to contribute to the Terrace Writer's publication and there were some wonderful stories as a result of this. Our Terrabots (Terrace Lego Robotics Club) had two phases this year. The first half of the year students worked hard on building an energy efficient Green City and are in the process of programming their robots to activate the wind turbine and open the dam wall. The Terrace Human Movement faculty engages all Terracians through Health and Physical Education (Years 5-10), Physical Education (Years 11-12) and Recreation (Years 11-12).

Physical Education is an essential subject area for learning. As one of the Australian Curriculum compulsory learning areas, it helps students become competent movers, which in turn builds self-confidence and lays a foundation for participation

in lifetime physical activity. Its movement content helps improve cognitive function, which in turn promotes learning in other subject areas. It helps students learn about their abilities, aptitudes, limitations and potential. Physical Education provides opportunities for students to: develop creative and positive attitudes toward physical activity, assume more personal and social responsibility and meet performance obligations as individuals and in groups.

This year saw the Years 5-7 students engage in a variety of learning experiences with the focus on the development and refinement of movement skills such as swimming, catching, throwing, kicking and functional movement (speed and agility). In the classroom, students have worked with their teachers on topics ranging from how the body works during exercise, to nutrition and the six dimensions of health. The year was highlighted by the Year 6 Lifesaving carnival held at Mooloolaba. Here all Year 6 students utilised the lifesaving skills learnt in the pool and implemented them in an ocean environment.

The Years 8-10 Health and Physical Education program focused on promoting physical fitness and healthy body weight through examinations of anatomy, physiology and nutrition. This focus was also sustained through student engagement in a variety of team-based sports such as European handball, water polo and ultimate disc.

A large number of students chose Physical Education in Years 11 and 12. The 2016 Physical Education Seniors are to be congratulated for their effort over the year. Of the 83 Seniors, 86% attained a Very High Achievement or High Achievement in the subject.

My thanks go to the team of teachers and support staff who have designed and implemented the curriculum with passion and professionalism.

DRAMA

In 2016, Terrace Drama was a hive of constant activity. Students engaged in a wide variety of dramatic practices, from their attendance at a number of professional theatre productions with the Queensland Theatre Company,

The Drama Honours program continued in Term 4 with masterclasses on the acting processes of Michael Chekhov with professional artist David Giles. Student work was further supplemented by the wonderful support offered by other practice professional artists: Kristian Santic (Artist in Residence), Clint Bolster, Helen Stephens and Sherri Smith. GEOGRAPHY

Geography students have gained many life-long skills in their learning of both physical and human Geography. Mathematics

"Of the twenty fastest growing careers, fifteen of them require a background in." The National Mathematics and Science Institute in this quote was referring to the practice, perseverance and determination required to succeed in studying mathematics at any level. These qualities assist in improving skills and understanding which are paramount for students that thrive on learning and becoming the best student they can be. This year has seen many students showcasing outstanding improvement in their understanding of concepts but also in the broader opportunities offered at Terrace.

Terrace entered 223 students from Years 5-12 in the Australian Mathematics competition, which had a national audience of over half a million students. Terrace had nine students gain a prize, 24 attain a high distinction, 85 attain a distinction and 88 attained credits.

The Years 7 and 8 competitors Luke Ames, Tyler O'Farrell, Yang Zhang, Patrick Gleeson, Kevin Ye and Matthew Cho represented the College in the Brisbane Central district final of the QAMT Mathematics Problem Solving competition, a challenging and competitive event. There were ten schools competing in this quiz and the boys finished a creditable second in this competition.

Finally, I would like to thank the Mathematics staff for their tireless effort in supporting our students in all areas of learning Mathematics. The teachers at Terrace assist the students in improving their understanding of concepts to be 'the best students they can be'. I am confident that our students value this dedication and commitment and appreciate all the opportunities that are offered at Terrace.

The Terrace Library believes in the power of reading to ignite the imagination, develop a sense of self, and to engage with the world. Our College articulates to the students 'What you read is the measure of the man. What you read shapes the man you will become'.

Boys in Years 5-9 attend reading lessons in the library to encourage a love of reading and to influence the quality, variety and volume of books being read. A range of Book Clubs are offered to students including the combined Terrace and All Hallows' School Years 10-12, the combined Terrace and Brisbane Grammar School Years 7-9 and lunchtime book clubs.

Another significant role of the Terrace Library is to provide curriculum support in inquiry and information literacy. Many classes visit the library to learn skills about research for their particular subject and year level. The Terrace eScholar curates a large amount of research support material to help students learn and complete assessment tasks.

In Term 1, a group of Year 7 students participated in the Spring Hill Young Writers Group, an immersive fantasy writing quest at the Roma Street Parklands with students from other schools in Spring Hill. These students worked collaboratively in groups to create original fantasy stories. They demonstrated an ability to work in a team, and problem solve issues that arose on the writing journey. Author Kirralee Barker inspired the students throughout the writing experience.

This year's Book Week theme, Australia: Story Country, inspired the Terrace Library to explore all things Australian. Book Week was celebrated from 1-5 August with a range of activities offered to students and parents. Four authors spoke to students about their books and the art of writing, including: Marco Glioni, Steven Herrick, Brian Falkner and Mick Elliott. The Literature Expo was an interactive morning to explore Australian Stories. Riverbend Books spoke about top reads for boys and provided a pop-up shop for book purchases. Terrace Strings played music by Australian



composers and students also engaged in activities on each of the displays. This year the Great Book Swap was a successful collaboration with the Campus Ministry, Magee and Mahoney Houses to raise funds for the Indigenous Literacy Foundation.

Windsor House was the winner of the Year 7 Inter-House Readers' Cup. The Year 8 winner was Kearney House. The Junior Classy Readers trophy was claimed by 5G. The students in these competitions read the set books and competed in rounds of trivia.

Lunchtime activities were well subscribed by students including Makerspace, Strategic Games, Book to Film Club and Book Club. We also hosted pop-up shops at lunchtimes by graphic novel specialists Zombster and Sequel. Boys could vote for the books they would like in the library collection.

The Terrace Library has been proudly recognised in the national Great School Libraries campaign, nominated for its contribution to the College community. I would like to thank the Terrace Library staff for their commitment and efforts in 2016.

The words of philosopher Ludwig Wittgenstein express a conviction shared by all members of the Languages faculty. We recognise the power of language to transform lives by equipping individuals with the skills to connect with other cultures and look deeply into their own. Our commitment to encourage students to use language to look outwards and inwards is reflected in the strength of our English, French and Japanese programs.

Students of Japanese and French have

been involved in a range of immersion activities that enhanced their classroom learning. For many, cultural immersion has taken the form of social dinners, events such as the French Film Festival and listening to guest speakers. However, given the strength of languages at Terrace, with thirty percent of the Year 12 cohort learning a language (as opposed to the national average of six percent), we offer extension activities which involve inter-cultural exchange. During the 2015 Christmas holidays, Year 11 students experienced a French Christmas with their host families in Nantes and Bondues. During the Easter break, 27 Japanese students travelled to Japan under the care of teachers Ms Kirsten Allingham, Mr Andrew Stormonth and Mrs Mary Meadows. While the boys

made trips to iconic destinations, our students were based mostly at Osaka and hosted by Terrace's partner school, Konan Boys High School. Recognising that our program is built on the generosity of parents both here and overseas, we would like to thank those Terrace families who hosted exchange students from both France and Japan over the course of 2016.

Our English results have been outstanding across all year levels. Our Seniors performed strongly in both Senior English and English Extension while our Year 7s and 9s performed well above the national average in the 2016 NAPLAN testing. With Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority's announcement of changes to senior schooling and its release of new syllabuses in the English learning area, considerable thought has been given to what these changes will mean for the way English is taught at Terrace. Work has commenced on the Middle School English program to ensure that our younger students are well prepared for the new curriculum. English teachers at Terrace are committed to providing students with learning opportunities that will sharpen their minds and their sensibilities. The excellent results of our English students are due in part to their teachers who inspire and engage them.

In closing, I would like to thank my colleagues for their efforts over the course of 2016. In particular, I would like to thank Ms Kirsten Allingham for her coordination of Japanese and Mrs Lindsay Maher for her coordination of French.

At Terrace we aim to nurture young men of faith and learning who will go on to serve the world in their lives as Old Boys. An integral part of this faith formation is their participation in the Religious Education curriculum, which occurs right across their Terrace journey. The Religious Education program across all Catholic schools in the Brisbane Diocese aims to promote religious literacy through exploration of the four key strands of sacred texts, church, beliefs and Christian life. As a Catholic school in the Edmund Rice tradition, we seek to give our students a genuine understanding of faith as an experience not only of the head, but also of the hands and the heart.

In this respect, the Religious Education program does not sit in isolation. It is inextricably entwined into the broader religious life of the College. As part of an ongoing review of our classroom teaching and learning, a significant number of assessment tasks have

been rewritten this year to reflect the boys' social justice experiences during their time at Terrace, for example participation in House Friendship Groups, the Kolega Café, Immersions and Big Brekkie for the Senior students. In this way, students can have a deep and genuine understanding of their faith in action at Terrace, in our local community and by helping our brothers and sisters overseas.

Similarly, students reflect on their experiences as part of the College's Retreat programs within the Religious Education classroom and explore how these new perspectives can be implemented into their daily lives, in their relationships with those around them, caring for themselves and for others, and how this reflects Jesus' call to love one another. Likewise, links to the students' pastoral experiences, including the Formation Program run by House Deans have been made explicit, so the boys understand

that the formation of the Terrace Gentleman is a holistic team effort among the many staff who care for them during their Terrace journey.

It is challenging, in an increasingly secular age, to design and deliver lessons in Religious Education which are relevant and engaging for our young men. Yet, if our faith as Catholics is to continue to grow, this challenge must be met with persistence and determination. I am confident that with a faculty of dedicated staff, who are committed to the care of our boys academically, pastorally and in faith formation, that we will rise to this challenge, as it is at the centre of our vocation as teachers in the Edmund Rice tradition. It is my hope that through Religious Education our young men will know what it is to truly live Jesus in our hearts, forever.

What constitutes a quality education, particularly in the Sciences, appears to be a much-discussed topic in the media at present. Should students be 'entrepreneurs'? Should they be trained for jobs and careers that don't exist yet? Should they be designing their own curriculum and teaching themselves?

Unashamedly, the Faculty of Science at Terrace seeks to provide students with a broad yet thorough grounding in the principles of Science across traditional spheres of study: Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Geology. We explore historical discoveries, the development of modern theories and the implications of research on modern technological advances. We model proper scientific investigation processes and encourage the boys to use these processes as they work to unravel the mysteries of their surrounding environment. Subsequently, boys have investigated such diverse topics as sewage treatment plants, right through to the factors that affect the magnetic braking of vehicles.

We are once again very proud of the achievements of many boys in Science this year.

To begin the year, we received news that two of our past students who studied in the faculty achieved meritorious success by being named in the top 25 students and the students

Terrace Culture had a tremendous year of firsts in 2016 with record success and growth. A big congratulations must go to all students and families, along with the staff who helped Culture get there.

The Senior Musical *PIPPIN* had the largest cast in school history with over 120 performers, musicians and crew putting on three sellout shows in a purpose built circus tent at Tennyson. *PIPPIN* was performed to over 1700 audience members. The musical staged at Tennyson brought together a triangle of co-curricular power

houses with the Circus Tent, Old Boys Grandstand and Rowing shed all lit up and visible pre and post performance.

Debating again had outstanding results throughout the GPS and QDU seasons. While we were runners up in both of these, our teams overall did very well with our 9.4 team undefeated in the GPS season. Well done to the Senior A who finished in second place, Senior B tied first, 11.3 first place, 9.1 first place, 9.3 tied first, 9.4 first place and the 8.1 first. Our QDU teams came third in the overall points tally at the finals with 13 of our 22 teams making the finals rounds.

Terrace Chess still has one of the youngest Premier Boards in the GPS competition. However, with expert coaching and a focus to raise the rankings of all players in 2016 the Premier Board was able to finish third, the highest competition finish in our twenty-year Chess history.

Music was again very strong with a fifteen per cent rise in both tuition numbers and ensemble membership. This was most notable at the Queensland Catholic Schools Music Festival where Terrace had 24 ensembles competing which was

the second highest of all Catholic schools in Queensland. Our ensembles performed very well with twelve gold, eleven silver and one bronze award.

Well done to College Vice Captain, Joseph Dwyer who represented Terrace at a local, state and national level for the Lions Youth of the Year 2016. Joseph was awarded the 2016 Lions Youth of the Year National Public Speaking champion.

An initiative for 2016 was to tap into the many students who wanted to be involved behind the scenes in performing arts operating the lights or mixing desk. Welcome, Live Production Services (LPS). LPS has already had workshops with industry professionals and begun the portfolio of those students who would like to pursue the study of this after Terrace. The ultimate goal for LPS is to run a Certificate III course allowing the students to gain entry into tertiary study and employment after school.

It has been a most enjoyable year for all aspects of Culture and planning has already begun for a bigger and better 2017.

The Gallipoli *Experience*



This year saw the conclusion to the greatest run of performances on the world stage that Terrace, if not any high school institution, has ever seen. In 2011, the Music Director of Choir Mrs Bernadette Debattista, Director of Culture Mr Neil Wharton and Mr Joe Debattista with the guidance and support of the Principal Mr Peter Chapman completed a tender application for Terrace to be contracted to supply choral services as part of the Gallipoli Dawn Services 2012 - 2016. After interviews with the Department of Veterans Affairs in Canberra, the contract was signed, sealed and delivered. To provide an enhanced choral voicing and engage the community of our sister school, Terrace joined forces with All Hallows' School to provide a blended choir of male and female voices. This opportunity has

seen the choir represent the College and country for live audiences in the thousands and a television audience, reported to be in the millions, at five Dawn Services, five Lone Pine Services, one Battle of Lone Pine Service, a world premiere of the Gallipoli Symphony at Hagia Irene in Istanbul, live TV audience and a recording for DVD sales through ABC stores as well as the Australian Premiere of the same at the Queensland Performing Arts Centre. This experience has seen approximately 100 students visit and reflect upon Terrace Old Boys who fought for 'Queen and Country' in Gallipoli 101 years ago.

Being on the world stage has allowed our choral program to perform with the Istanbul Symphony Orchestra, Istanbul Opera and Chorus, the Queensland Symphony, bands from the Australian

and New Zealand Army, Navy and Air Force as well as featuring in the single *Safety of Distance* with Australian gold ARIA Award winner and Israeli-Australian singer, songwriter Lior.

Opportunities like this come through the hard work, commitment, expertise and dedication of staff at Terrace. Ms Imogen Brown and Mrs Bernadette Debattista have been involved with all six tours from the beginning. It is their love and commitment to providing these great opportunities to the Terrace students who, joined by other staff, have provided logistics and leadership guidance through to specialist workshops and musical arrangements that continue to keep the love of Terrace alive.

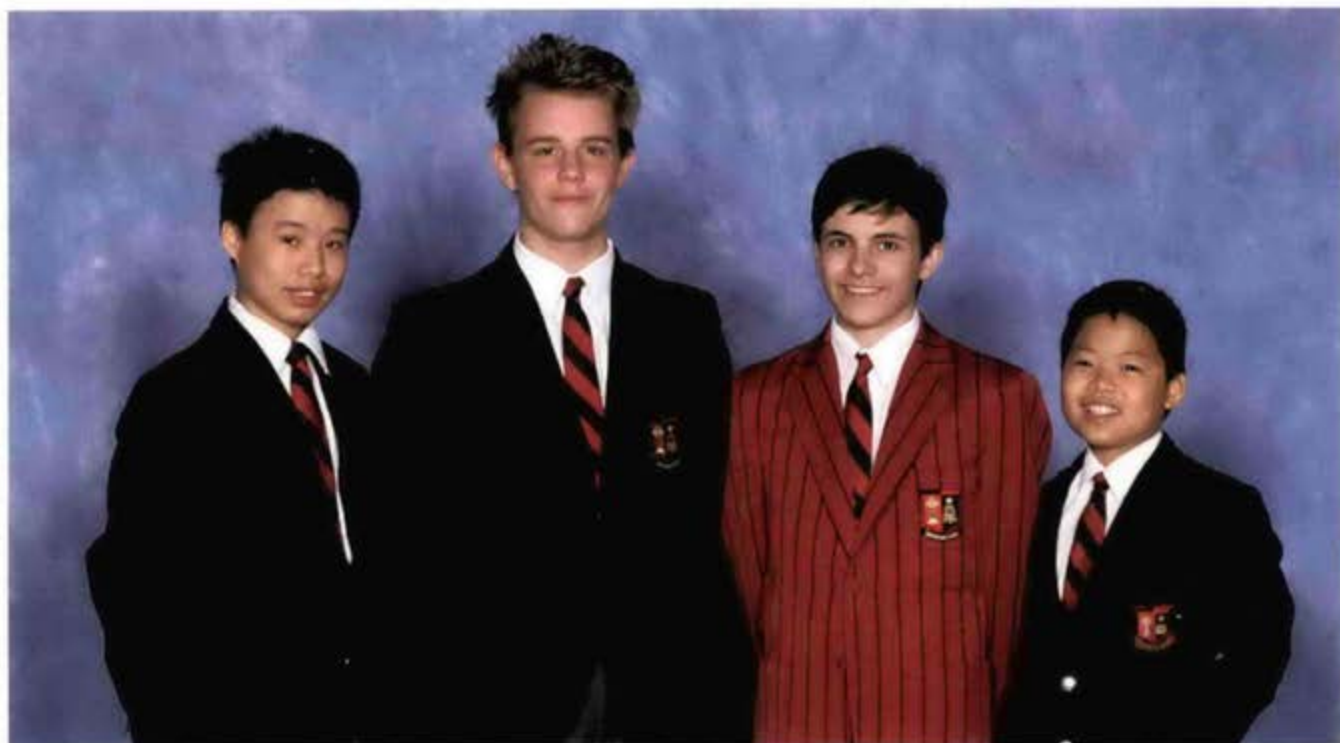

The year drew to a close with the Terrace Jazz Combo entertaining the crowd at the Parent and Son Dinner in Treacy Court. It is good to be able to take some time to reflect on what has been yet another busy and rewarding year for the staff and students involved in Terrace Music.

The Music program continues to grow and develop with greater numbers of students becoming involved and performance standards continuing to rise. In addition to seeing further growth in our current ensembles and performance schedule, we have introduced some new activities to the roster. These include our first massed marching band for the Brisbane ANZAC Day parade, Terrace Rock and the Live Production Services activity which teaches our students how to set up and operate the wide array of audio and lighting equipment we now own and use at our live performances.

Terrace Music has represented on the international stage again this year, with two major tours taking place. In April, our final tour to Turkey saw a number of our students performing at the Dawn Service at ANZAC Cove. This event was telecast to a worldwide audience and received positive feedback from the Department of Veterans Affairs as well as the wider community. During the June/July school holidays, members of the Waterford Strings and

Waterford Soloists string ensembles toured to New Zealand to take part in the Rhapsody Rotorua Music Festival, bringing home a silver medal.

Once again, I would like to acknowledge the generous support of Mr Norman Clarke, Patron of the Arts and all that he gives to our Music program, particularly in Years 5 and 6. His significant contribution allows us to continue to develop our program with increased numbers of students in these years electing to take either private or group lessons. Mr Clarke's generosity this year has provided us with a number of much needed larger instruments such as euphoniums and tubas. His regular attendance at concerts is very much appreciated and gratefully acknowledged by our students.

This year saw a record number of our ensembles performing at the Queensland Catholic Schools and Colleges Music Festival in August. Once again we received positive adjudications on all performances indicating that our ensembles are consistently performing at a high standard. This year we had 24 entries to the festival receiving eleven gold, twelve silver and one bronze award. Special awards were presented to Patrick Sharkey (Year 11), Harry David (Year 11) and Charlie Newman (Year 10) for their outstanding contributions to their ensembles.

There were many other performance opportunities throughout the year including the Winter Concert, the Percussion, Strings and Vocal Showcase, Terrace Jazz Night, Chamber Music Concerts, Open Day and the Red Thunder Drumline bringing team spirit to these College events as well as to the wider community. The Terrace Choir also performed many morning masses and liturgies throughout the year.

Thanks to this year's Music Captains, Harry Pearce (Captain) and Marco Taraborrelli (Vice Captain) for their work and support of Terrace Music throughout the year.

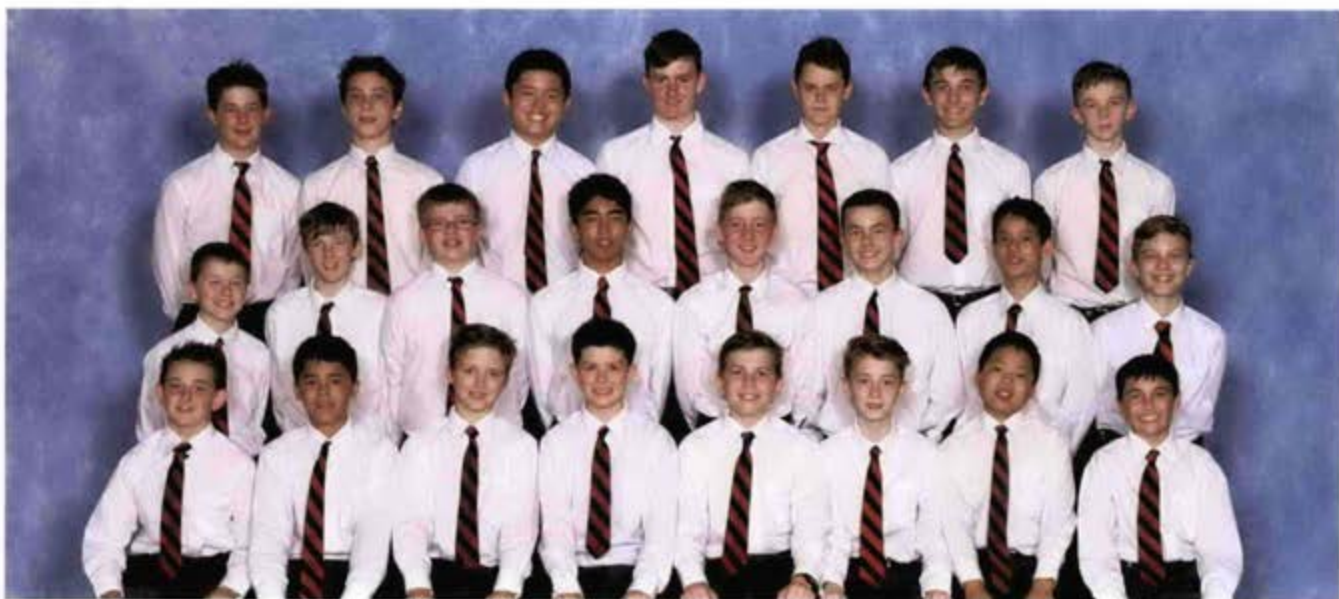

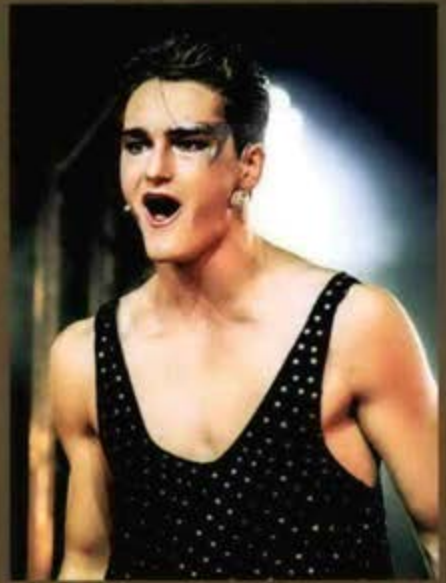

For ten days in mid-May, the playing fields at Tennyson seemed magically transformed. The Big Top went up, the set was built, the lights hung, the costumes assembled and the creatives moved in. The 2016 St Joseph's College and All Hallows' School production was in full swing. *PIPPIN* had come to town. In what is surely the biggest theatrical feast that Terrace has ever created, *Pippin* involved over 125 students onstage, in the orchestra and backstage, playing to three sold out performances of over 500 people per night.

PIPPIN is a journey play. It is an exploration of what a young man needs to do to lead an extraordinary life and what that actually means. It questions the morality of war, commerce, politics and romance. This is a journey that we can all understand and one of the reasons why we chose to stage the play. Very loosely based on the life of Pepin, the eldest son of Charlemagne in eighth-century France, composer and librettist Stephen Schwartz envisaged a play designed to entertain and provoke, in the end stripping away the theatrical guise to reveal the simple truth.

Everybody involved at Terrace

dreamed large in our journey to create *PIPPIN*. Inspired by the original 1972, Tony Award-winning, Bob Fosse, Broadway production (which ran for five years) and the American Repertory Theatre, multi-awarded, circus revival, the Terrace creative team were inspired to create a dazzling, dynamic *PIPPIN* filled with wit, humour, and pathos. However, our *PIPPIN* was not a copy. Our magical, vintage circus world took us back to a simpler time, filled with joy, nostalgia and designer chic. It was a collage of exuberant, whimsical, vintage and contemporary costume (thanks to the wonderful support of the Terrace Performing Arts Group), intoxicating lights and sumptuous music that fused moments of poignant acting and stunning singing with explosions of bold, vibrant dance to create a most wonderful spectacle.

James Reiser was hugely successful in creating the central character of Prince Pippin who was taunted and manipulated by all the other actors on the stage, but most significantly by the actors in the lead ensemble. They were all players in a circus who took on the roles of characters in Pippin's life, led by triple threat actors Martin

Horniak and Emily Stockwell in the provocative roles of the Lead Player. Tom Crowley's powerful presence shone as Pippin's father, Charlemagne, whilst Georgia Tucker played femme fatale, Fastrada, Pippin's stepmother. As Louis, Pippin's half-brother, Harry David sensationalised stage moments with his fantastic physical comedy, Laura Perks stole hearts as Berthe, Pippin's grandmother, whilst Jude Korab extended his powerful range as the angel of Glory, Ellen Burke's Catherine (Pippin's romantic interest), excelled with earnestness and élan in conjunction with Luke Evan's magnetic performance as the young Theo. Rounding out the Lead Ensemble were Nick Vilgan (Terrace 2016 Theatre Captain) and Lara Setafano who played myriad characters with panache and precision.

PIPPIN was an amazing experience for all involved. It provided students with a professional level opportunity to explore, create and manifest theatrical magic. It will linger in our memories with a song and a smile.

Results across all activities and the win/loss ratios were very pleasing this year, with skill development and exposure to good coaching resulting in positive performances by many of our teams.

The Championship events: Swimming, Rowing, Cross Country, Gymnastics and Track and Field are the highlights of the year, when all schools come together to compete. The atmosphere is always electric and the competition standards are exceptionally high.

The round robin competitions: Cricket, Volleyball, Football, Tennis, Basketball and Rugby are an opportunity for boys to compete weekly with their classmates, generating great friendships and learning valuable life lessons – lessons that cannot always be obtained in the classroom.

The Sport Department was very effectively managed in 2016 by Miss Georgia Power and Mrs Emma Such.

These ladies deserve great credit for their organisational and communication skills, whipping the Department into shape and keeping the community well informed. They also displayed extreme patience in managing the six full time Activity Coordinators. The focus of the season centred around quality rather than quantity and an empowering culture for the boys both on and off the water.

Crews such as the Open 3rd VIII (Fergus Power, William Low, Daniel Stack, Callum Prentis, Joseph Sheahan, Willem Bakker, Henry Roessler, Elliot Keefer, and Jerome Pham Van Khanh) showed great drive and commitment to training throughout the season, which was rewarded by a win in the Nudgee/Grammar Time Trial earlier in the season. The culture was also depicted in the formation of the Year 11 4th VIII (Hugh Schroder, William Cook, Liam Byrne, Carter Douglas, Jack McKeering, Dan Smethurst, Liam Murphy, Sam Lang, and Lachlan Kahler), with a level of depth that has not been seen since 2010. Accompanied by the College leadership of Oliver Macklin (College Vice-Captain), Liam Hegarty (House Captain), Fergus Power (House Captain), William Low (House Captain), Lucas Eckersley (House Captain), Daniel Stack (House Captain), Jethro Gifford (Vice Captain of Boats), as well as Captain of Boats, James Reiser, the Senior leadership group assisted the shed to one of its most successful seasons in recent years.

Unfortunately, this momentum did not translate on the big day, with a number of inconsistent performances

Although not consistent in performance, the positive culture within the shed was a strong point of 2016. This saw growth and positive results as there was a constant approach to how the cohort acted and performed. With the culture building strength to strength with a core group of rowers, the vision moving forward is one of exposure, with the view to engaging boys in younger years to the sport that can give back so

much. From creating teamwork skills, individual development, to academic opportunities abroad, the current offering within the Terrace program attempts to cultivate all facets of a Terrace Gentleman's development especially if engaged at an early age.

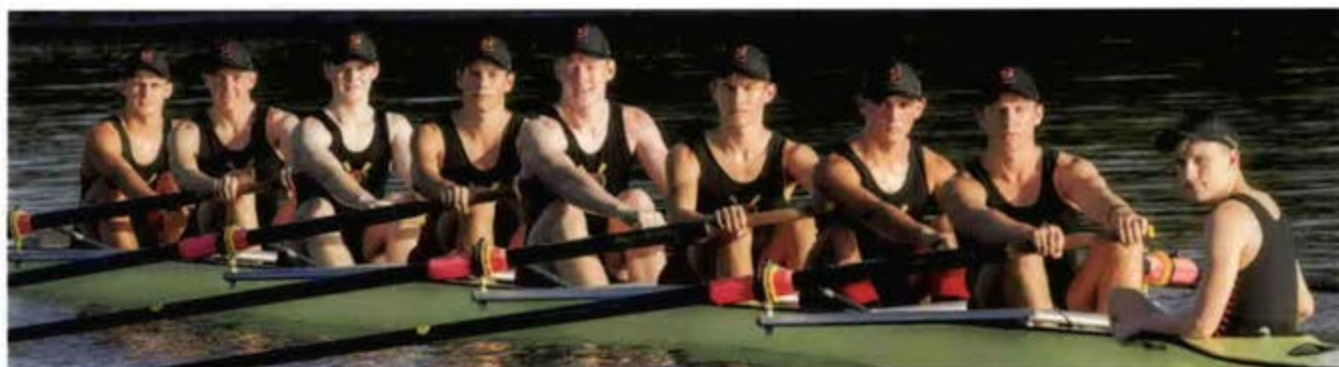

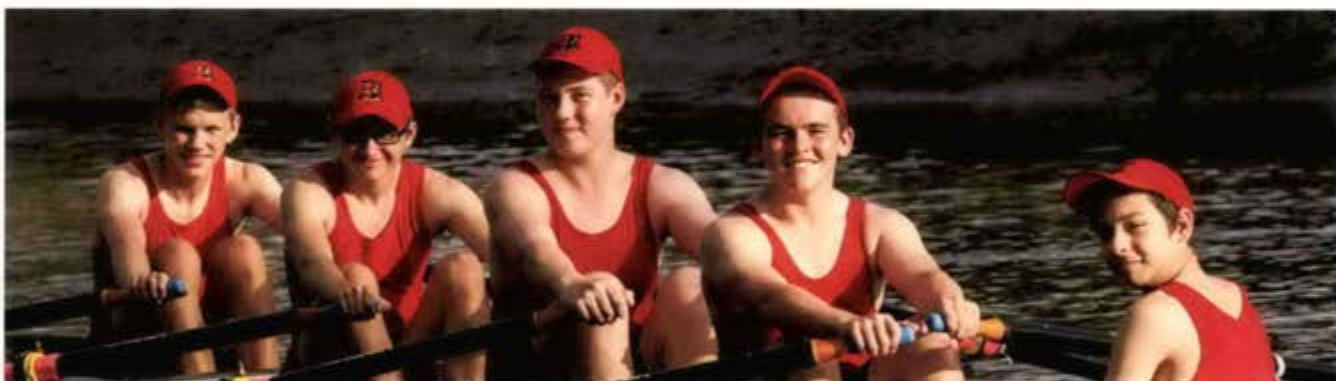

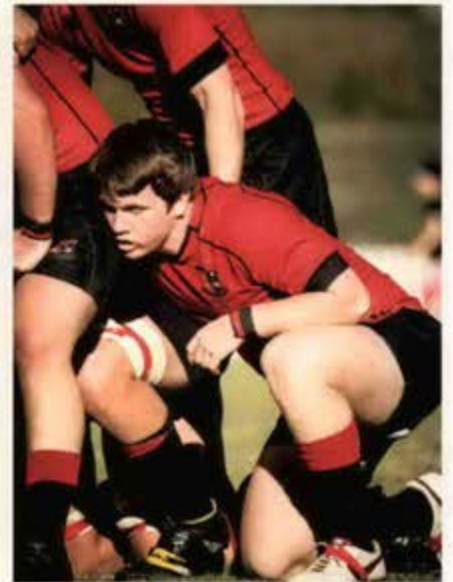

Some brilliant individual finishing by Will Eadie and Isaac Lucas were a result of constant turnover opportunities provided at the breakdown by backrowers Seamus Tweedy and Tom Kelly.

The next game saw TSS provide their usual hostile and loud atmosphere, combined with well devised spoiler tactics, really tested our quick thinking and problem solving abilities. A brilliant try to tireless Captain Bailey Ralston to open the scoring put us in the game and calmed the nerves in what turned out to be a classic tug of war battle. Fittingly it was our breakdown that provided the penalty needed on full-time, and halfback Sam Kirk slotted it calmly to claim victory. The first time Terrace have managed an away victory against TSS this century, a great achievement.

A thrilling 74-point victory over Brisbane Grammar School provided some of the most entertaining tries of the year including a cracking solo effort from Front Rower Josh Nasser. A very disappointing loss to TGS in Toowoomba, at full time after leading the entire match, was a bitter pill to swallow, but the team reviewed it and learnt from it. After finding ourselves down 17-27 into the second half at Toowoong the following week, we

saw a determined and gutsy victory against BBC finishing the game 38-27 led by a completely dominant lineout managed by Eddie Paynter, and with Jordan Rodgers impressing with a gutsy defensive performance from fullback. The win set us up for a great final round against our traditional rivals Nudgee College.

Nudgee Day was a buzz of excitement and nerves, but amongst our group there was a well-earned sense of confidence. This was unwavering even when pouring rain arrived on kick-off. One of the best traits of our group this year was their ability to acknowledge, take ownership and learn from their mistakes and build positively on past experiences. This was evident in our final match with Harry Wilson, Harry Birgan and Byron Ralston being amongst many standout performers on the day. A final winning score of 19-15 was another historic achievement (first win since 2004) and the grandstand emptying onto the Internationals Oval in celebration after the conclusion of the match was a fitting end to such an enjoyable season.

I would like to thank Mr Tony Wall, Mr David Bick, Mr Jonathon Roussetos and Mr Tyron Mandrusiak for their tireless effort and support of our team this year. Finally, I would like to congratulate all the Seniors in their final year at Terrace. I hope you continue to play and enjoy rugby in the years to come.

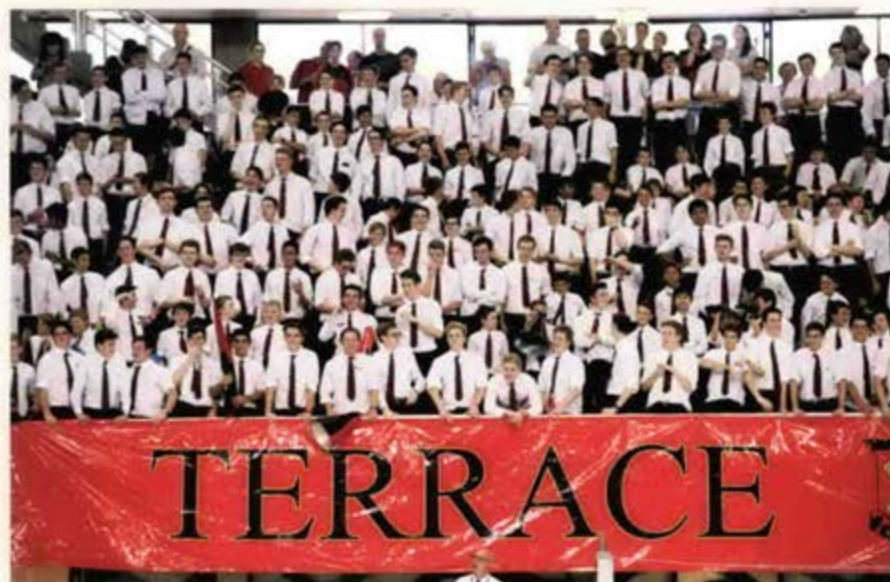

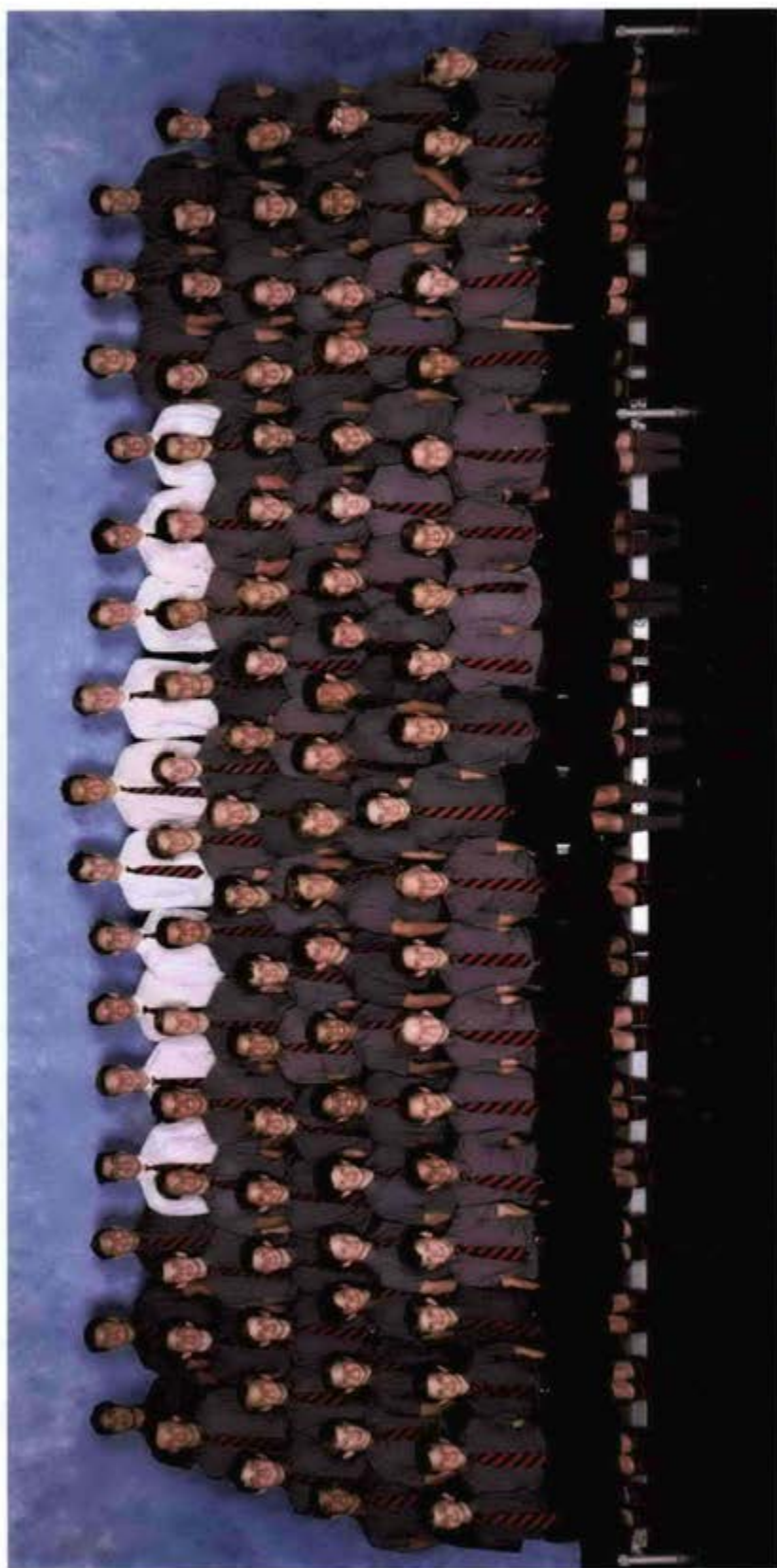

Our preseason training camps for our B-D team players were well supported and proved to be an important preparatory training tool.

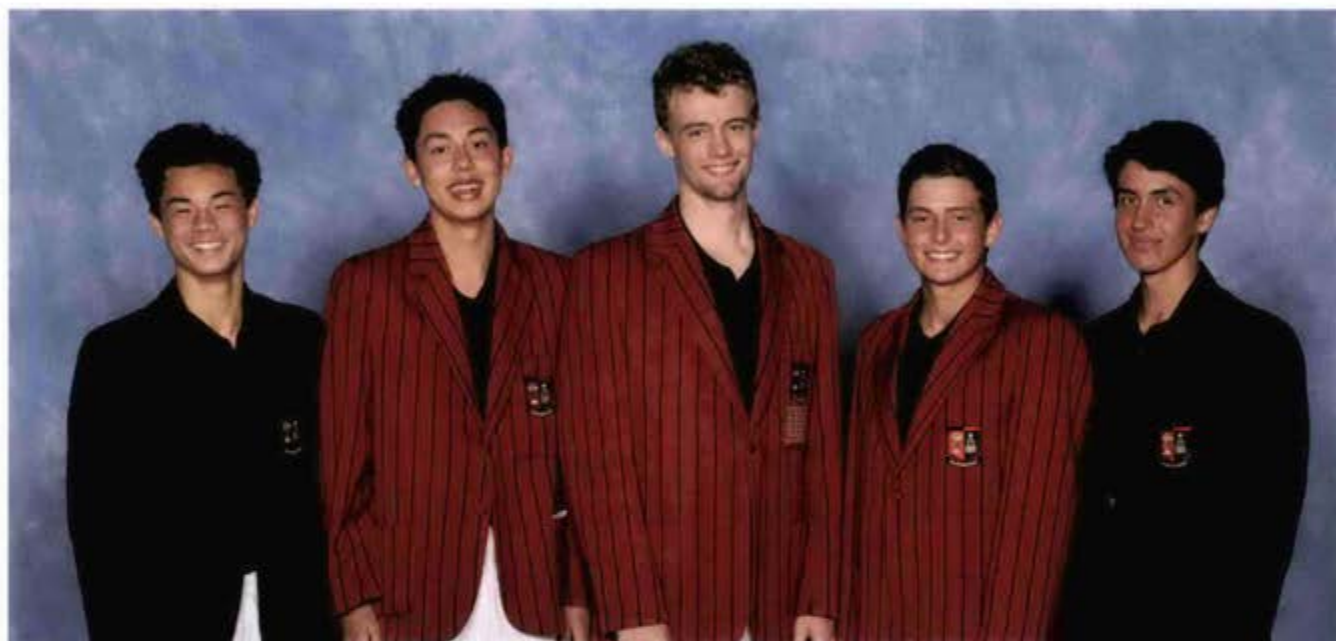

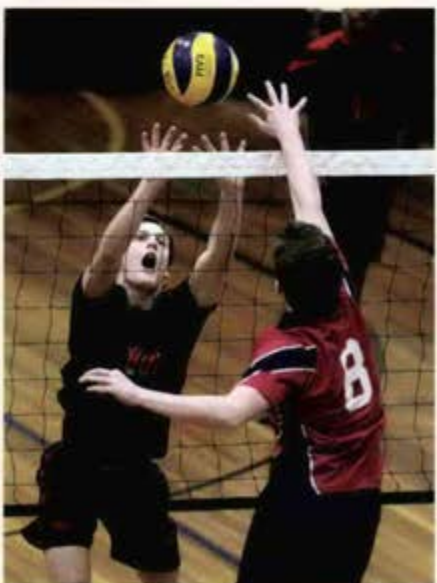

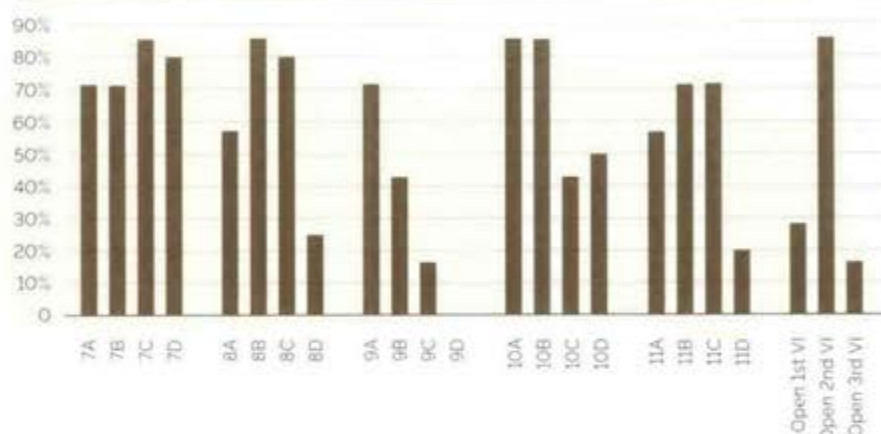
HEAD COACH

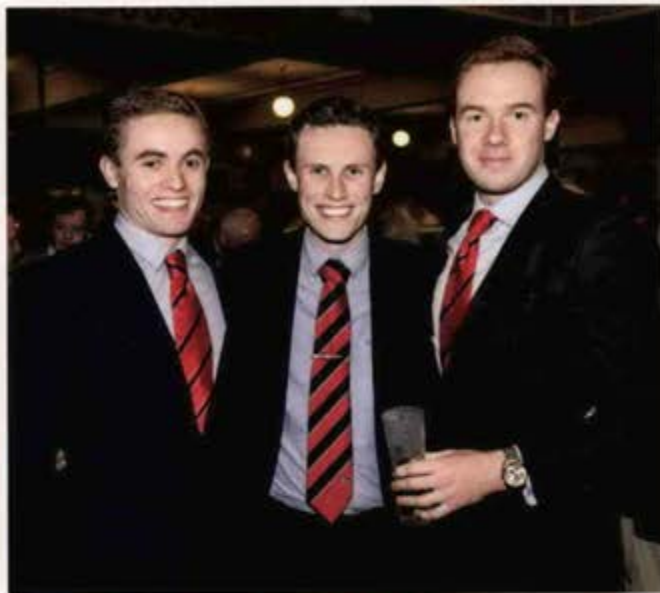

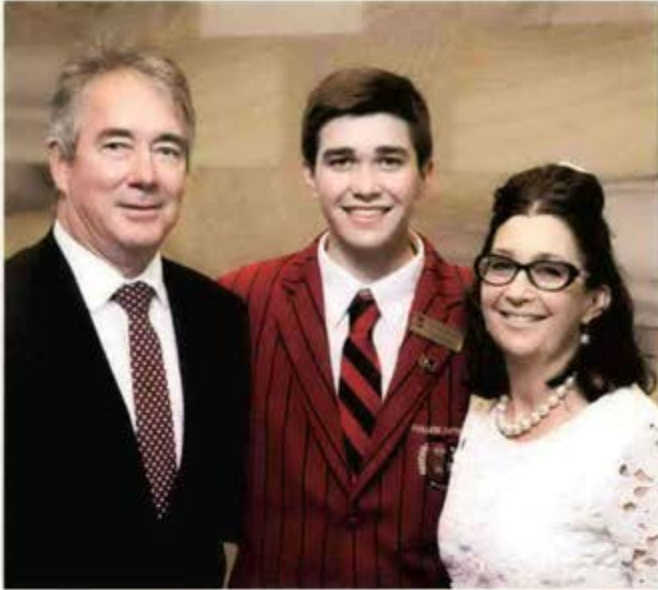

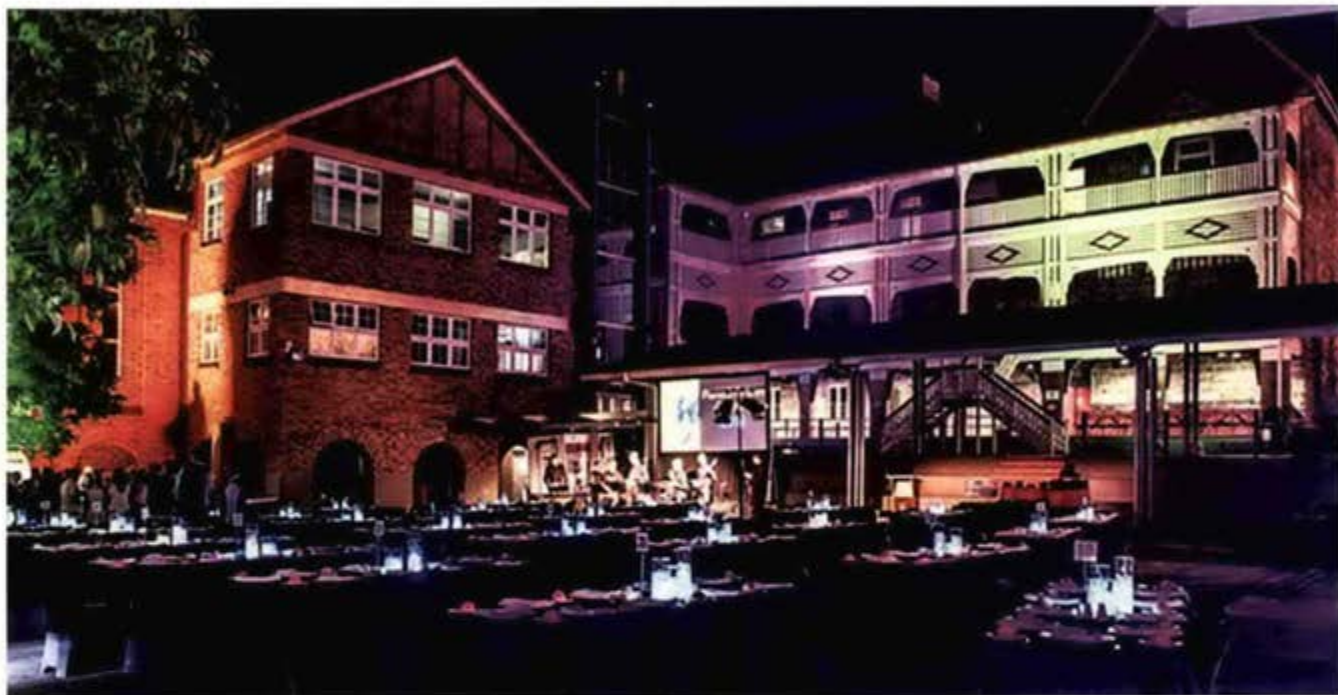

This year is the thirtieth year of the Gregory Terrace Foundation and thanks to the generosity of the parents, Old Boys and friends of the College, we have been able to continue our successful fundraising efforts and support of the College.

The Celtic Cross is a symbol of our Irish Catholic heritage. It has many layers of historical and theological meaning. Through Edmund's example, we learn that humility is education of the mind and heart, which is a pathway to God.

The book of learning symbolises the wisdom that knowledge and humility may lead to a personal relationship with Jesus Christ who, as the Greek letters of the alphabet, Alpha and Omega depict, is the beginning and the end of all things. Through Edmund's example, we learn that wisdom is education of the mind, heart and hands to make a difference which is a pathway to God.
