# Content Summary - The Sudden Storm: The AANS sisters of Singapore + Radji Beach

### Part 1

- Contributors to the podcast explain their reaction to the massacre of the sisters on Bangka Island.
- 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary ceremony SA Women's Memorial Playing Fields, 2022.
- How the nurses found themselves in Singapore and Malaya.

- Vyner Brook was bombed, crippled and sank. 150 survivors made it to Bangka Island.
- The massacres of British Military personnel and Australian nurses on Radji Beach, Bangka Island.

#### Part 2

- Survivors from the Vyner Brook were imprisoned.
- Allies finally found the POWs after several weeks in September 1945 once the war had ended.
- POW's in terrible condition and evacuated initially to Singapore for treatment.
- Gender and war: the role of women and how the women POW's were presented to the media; feminising them. Women in war is problematic!
- Vivian Bullwinkel who survived the massacre on Radji Beach and how she controlled the narrative regarding the truth of what happened.
- Discussion regarding whether the nurses were raped on Radji Beach. This may have been 'covered-up'; what evidence is there to support this! The stigma attached to sexual assault at the time.
- The Japanese treatment of POW's.
- The MeToo movement needs to engage in historical cases of sexual assault.
- Australian Nurses Memorial, St Kilda Rd Melbourne and how it commemorates the nurses.
- The significance of the story and why it must be remembered.
