### **Bandits Camp**



A recent study of 15 year olds in 18 industrialised countries showed the success of older students correlated with the daily parental reading to children in the early primary years. For toddlers it



begins with reading, learning and saying nursery rhymes. It can then progress to picture story books often reread many times, to shared reading and even to audio books for reluctant teenagers.

Let's revisit our bookshelf, visit the library, or even download an audio book. The holidays could offer a wonderful opportunity to enjoy special time with grandparents. Let's listen, imagine, visualize and create wonderful memories all of which are important foundations to successful learning.
