At recent Assemblies I have spoken to students about the importance and relevance of common courtesies in our College and wider community. Regardless of what people or say or perhaps what people view via various forms of media, having the capacity to conduct oneself in a polite and courteous manner is an indication of character and emotional intelligence. 
