### *Tarndaparri Karrawirraparri Munaintya – a Dreaming Place*

#### Event Description & Management Approach

##### Event Description

For 31 nights in 2019, Adelaide Fringe will bring to life native animals and storytelling in a mesmerising projection and light show the likes of which Adelaide has never seen before. Guided by South Australian indigenous storytelling, the Adelaide Fringe will light up the riverbank, surrounding grasslands and paths. The experience will involve interactive light and sound to create an immersive world to amaze and educate. Audiences will be able to go on this free walking adventure along the river to see all the different elements.

Tarndaparri Karrawirraparri Munaintya – A Dreaming Place is the 2019 Adelaide Fringe's signature project. People of all ages and backgrounds are invited on an immersive cultural walking tour that uses stunning projections, unique techniques of Aboriginal storytelling, and native flora and fauna to engage with the River Torrens in an unforgettable way, showcasing South Australian culture.

##### Event Management Approach

The event organisers will:

- Provide a welcoming, inclusive, healthy and safe environment for event patrons and staff, adhering to national standards and legislative requirements.
- Ensure all safety and risk requirements regarding the use of the River Torrens and Karrawirra for the Adelaide Fringe event are adhered to and addressed in the risk management and safety plans.
- Manage alcohol trading and consumption in a safe and effective manner, following all South Australian legislation and Council policy.
- Maintain access along the riverfront linear path at all times.
- Develop a Noise Management Plan which will describe how the event will manage their noise emissions. This event has been categorised as an Event with a music component under the [CoA Event Noise Mitigation Standard Operating Procedures](#).
- Use best practice in waste minimization and recycling including compostable materials where possible.
- Ensure road closures are implemented according to legislated requirements and that targeted consultation with nearby stakeholders occurs in respect to the traffic impacts.
- Adhere to the operating hours of the event site.
- Utilise the hard stand pathways for large vehicle deliveries and use track matting (where appropriate) should vehicles need to drive over turf.
- Undertake practices that limit the amount of damage to the event site and take responsibility for restoring the site to the pre-event condition through the remediation process.
- Undertake consultation with all relevant stakeholders prior to the event, particularly river users.
- Publish behavioral guidelines on site during event and on website (if applicable).
