

K2ARB COMMUNITY CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE CHAIR'S SUMMARY



CHAIR'S SUMMARY

The fourth meeting of the Kagaru to Acacia Ridge and Bromelton (K2ARB) Community Consultative Committee was held in Jimboomba on Monday, 5 August 2019.

This summary provides an overview of the committee meeting and ensures that information is shared with the community at the earliest opportunity. It is a precursor to the formal meeting record, the committee meeting minutes, which will be published on the Inland Rail website following preparation and endorsement by the committee and Chair.

The meeting was chaired by Mr John Brent and attended by 13 of the 15 local community representatives appointed as members of the committee. More than 60 observers attended the meeting.

The main purpose of the meeting was to provide a project update and general information regarding air quality investigations to be conducted.

Presentations were provided by members of the ARTC K2ARB project team, and a representative of the consultancy that will complete the baseline air quality monitoring studies.

Information provided to the committee included:

- A progress update on the project, including information regarding engineering investigations being undertaken in the rail corridor, and proposed environmental investigations.
- Information regarding the potential for members to request independent technical advice.
- A presentation regarding the process for undertaking baseline air quality investigations on the project, and the relevant standards that will be used.

Committee members requested the following actions during the meeting:

 ARTC to review the process for appointing a new Member, following the resignation of one of the CCC Members, and make a recommendation on how to proceed.

- ARTC to investigate a Member's question regarding low frequency noise, as raised at the Inland Rail Scenic Rim CCC.
- ARTC to respond to questions tabled by a Member, prior to the next meeting.
- ARTC to seek information about the Federal Government's announcement regarding the creation of a business case to explore options for development of an intermodal terminal in Brisbane.

The following actions are ongoing:


- ▶ The provision of maps of the general locations where environmental investigations will take place, once known.
- Notification to the community as to the outcome of the request to the Office of the Coordinator General on the project approval pathway.

The next meeting will be held on 4 November.
