RE: Development Application Unit 1, J-Shed Fleet Street Fremantle: Additional Information for DA05-50221-1 (WAPC) & DA0370/15 (CoF)

This letter provides additional information requested by the Commission for their assessment of the Development Application for J-Shed, Unit 1 Fleet Street, Fremantle. On behalf of our client, Sunset Venues Pty Ltd ('Sunset') we wish to re-activate the undetermined Development Application and seek approval to commence development in accordance with previous correspondence dated 31 July 2015.

Background

The Development Application was initiated by Sunset, who were selected by the City of Fremantle as the new preferred proponent for the venue at Unit 1, J-Shed. A lease was agreed upon after a negotiation process with the City, who awarded Sunset the tender based on their draft design/vision for a Tavern and Live Music venue. The Application dated 31 July 2015, submitted to the City of Fremantle (addressed to the WAPC) included a cover letter, plans depicting the proposed development as well as a signed and completed Section 40 (Liquor License) application. Within the cover letter of the submission, justification was provided in accordance with State and Local Planning Policy.

Subsequent to the meeting at the Department of Planning on 29 March 2016, a number of items were discussed between between the DoP, Fremantle Ports, the City of Fremantle and Sunset. This letter is in response to this meeting and additional information requested by the Department.

Temporary Application Endorsement

Since the 31 July 2015 Development Application submission the following events have occurred:

- A Temporary Application was adopted by the City of Fremantle at it's Ordinary Council meeting on 14 October 2015. The item was carried (with conditions and expiry to 31 May 2017) and referred to the Statutory Planning Committee.
- A letter issued to the Department of Planning dated 23 October 2015 addressing concerns of Fremantle Ports with regards to Event and Traffic Management.
 Fremantle Ports has since advised the applicant that it supports the provided Management Plans.
- Temporary Application was received at the 24 November 2015 Statutory Planning Committee meeting and conditionally approved.

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Events at J-Shed

Post SPC endorsement, Sunset have hosted numerous Sunday Beach BBQ's and Live Music Concerts and other events at Unit 1 J-Shed in accordance with the conditions of the 24 November 2015 SPC approval. Sunset advise that no major issues/complaints have arisen from the events hosted since November 2015. The following events have occurred, along with relevant details of patron attendance numbers:







near ACROD parking as they detract from the Captains' Lane access and impact the amenity of the area. together to keep the area tidy

General Maintenance:

The wooden gate is located to the west of the Round House and to the north of the gun deck and enables access to the cliff top above the Gunners' Cottage. It is falling apart, has a padlock on it which is now useless because of the state of the gate and cannot now be shut.

Rocks Falling:

A visitor to the Round House reported rocks falling from the headland in the vicinity of the south-eastern side of the tunnel entrance. One of our Guides was standing at the front of the Round House and confirmed that there were no persons in the area seen to be throwing rocks over the cliff.



Events & Beyond - Sustainability Initiatives - 2014

Events & Beyond is committed to reducing its use of resources and production of solid waste in partnership with the food vendors and patrons of all events, festivals and markets undertaken from June 2013. This commitment is a key consideration with all new projects and events whist existing events will integrate the initiatives as efficiently as possible. Food vendors contribute to the sustainability of all events through waste reduction and resource recovery.

Sustainable Event Initiatives

Environmentally Friendly Measures include (but are not limited to):

- · Avoiding unnecessary packaging;
- · Reusing items where possible;
- Using packaging made from recyclable or compostable material;
- · Keeping the area litter free;
- Promoting use of the recycling bins at each event for both food vendors and customers.

All food vendors are notified of the above initiatives and the following recycling guidelines if bins are provided (this can vary at each event):

- · Aluminium, plastic, and glass can be recycled in recycling bins.
- · Any recyclables (including paper) contaminated with food cannot be recycled in recycling bins.
- Cardboard boxes can be placed in recycling bins, however any plastic or other material must be first removed.
- 100% biodegradable or 100% compostable packaging is required for all prepared food and beverage packaging. It is important to confirm that packaging is 100% biodegradable, not just labelled as 'degradable'.

In addition E&B's Terms & Conditions regarding Waste are as follows:

7. Waste Management & Sustainability

- 7.1 All stallholders are responsible for the storage and removal of their own rubbish (this
 can vary if suitable bins are provided in addition to the general public bins).
- 7.2 VQ Night Market requires the use of biodegradable and eco-friendly packaging/utensils at all stalls/food vans
- 7.3 "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle" is our mantra and is adopted at all times
- 7.4 General rubbish and recycle bins will be provided for PUBLIC USE ONLY (unless indicated otherwise)






