## That the City Culture & Community Services Committee recommends to Council that:

1. A temporary lease be granted to the organiser of Fear & Delight for the use of Rymill Park / Mullawirrapurka from Tuesday 10 February to Sunday 15 March 2015 in accordance with the Event Impact Statement contained in Attachment A to Item # on the Agenda for the City Culture & Community Services Committee on 16 December 2014.

BACKGROUND				
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- 1. To seek Council approval to grant temporary leases for events in the Park Lands.
- 2. Events align with the City of Adelaide Strategic Plan 2012-2016 as they activate the City's Park Lands and Squares, support a 'Creative City' and promote an appreciation of the City and Park Lands in improving the life and vitality of the City.

- 3. The primary objective of the Events in the Park Lands Policy and Operating Guidelines is to deliver a framework for maximising the benefits of holding events in the Park Lands by determining the most appropriate types of events and the way in which they are conducted and managed in order to minimise their impacts on the environment, general users of the Park Lands and adjacent residents.
- 4. Pursuant to the Park Lands Policy and Operating Guidelines, an Event Impact Statement identifies specific actions and operations expected during the bump in, event days and bump out of an event, including details of road closures.
- 5. Each Event Impact Statement must be considered by a resolution of Council before a temporary lease can be issued to the event organiser.

EVENT DESCRIPTION	Fear & Delight is a new event to be held during the Adelaide Fringe 2015. The event is an immersive dining, theatrical, music and swing dance experiential event. Featuring an international cast of performers, world-renowned chefs and musicians.
	The event has three experiential phases for participants which will include dinning, viewing a performance and swing dancing. Each phase will be conducted in a different part of the park and the audience will be creatively escorted by event staff through each location.
	The event will utilise the island in Rymill Park / Mullawirrapurka except for the dates when Clipsal 500 is held. On these dates, Thursday 26 February to Sunday 1 March 2015, the island activities will be relocated to another site in the park.
	The event organisers have sort permission from the Clipsal 500 event organisers for use of the island in Rymill Park / Mullawirrapurka during their declared period.
S	The event set up is scheduled to start on Monday 2 February with pull down to be completed by Wednesday 18 March 2015. The event will be licensed and have the capacity for 800 people at any one time.
EVENT ADVERTISING & PROMOTION	This event has been registered for the Adelaide Fringe 2015 and is listed in the festival program which went live on Friday 28 November 2014.
£0.	Council approval for an event requiring public consultation is only given after the consultation period has concluded and Council has had the opportunity to review any feedback submissions and

	the application.
	Council discourages any event from promotions prior to Council approval; however in some instances, particularly participation in annual festivals, there is a need for organisers to register their events by a certain date and be listed on in the festival program. This however does not constitute Council approval for the event.

NOISE MITIGATION	The event must comply with the Adelaide City Council's Event Noise Mitigation Standard Operating Procedures for Temporary Multi-day Venues. The event organiser has indicated that all amplified music will be limited to the indoor venues after 11pm.
	Administration has now been advised of the entertainment programming within the main indoor venue. The event licence will not be granted until an agreed Noise Management Plan has been signed-off by Administration. This must include a robust monitoring and reporting plan that meets the requirements set out under the ACC Event Noise Mitigation Standard Operating Procedures.
	Residents in surrounding areas will be notified by the event organiser via a mail drop at no less than two weeks prior to the event. The advice letter details the event times and contact information for complaints or queries.
LIQUOR LICENSING	A temporary liquor license will be sought from Consumer and Business Services (CBS) by the event organiser.
PARK LANDS MANAGEMENT	Impacts to the Park Lands will be managed through the event licence.
	The event organiser will be required to adhere to the Events in

	Pre and post event site meetings will take place to document the condition of the event site. The event organiser will be required to pay for any remediation costs associated with the event.
	Specifically the event has committed to undertaking the following Park Lands protection measures:

	Hand watering of the event lawn throughout the site occupation

	Access to the licenced area of Rymill Park / Mullawirrapurka will be restricted for park users from Monday 2 February to Wednesday 18 March 2015.
	During the event paths within the licenced area will remain open to park users between the hours of 6am and 6pm. After 6pm the paths will be closed for the event to ensure the safety of public and event staff. Where pathways are blocked an alternate route will be indicated.
