Project Summary

The Adelaide City Council has received an application from Circus Royale for the use of Bonython Park/Tulya Wardli to enable the Circus Royale to take place from 23 September to Sunday 18 October 2015. The event set up is scheduled to start on Sunday 20 September with pull down to be completed by Monday 19 October. It is anticipated that the performances will attract up to 400 people per show. Opening hours are proposed from 10:00am to 9:00pm daily.

Project Information

Purpose

The Adelaide City Council has received an application from Circus Royale for the use of Bonython Park/Tulya Wardli to enable the Circus Royale to take place between 20 September and 19 October 2015.

Adelaide City Council's Public Communication and Consultation Policy outlines the public consultation process that must be undertaken before a temporary licence for the Park Lands may be granted for events which either:

- a) occupy ('alienate') the Park Lands for more than three event days, or
- b) significantly impact public access to a particular Park Land area for more than three days.

Description

Circus Royale have been visiting the Adelaide Park Lands since 2002.

The performances are held in a Big Top marquee. The show will run for approximately 2 hours with human and domestic animal performances.

The event set up is scheduled to start on Sunday 20 September with pull down to be completed by Monday 19 October. It is anticipated that the shows will attract up to 400 people per show. Opening hours are proposed from 10:00am to 9:00pm daily.

Event infrastructure in the Park Lands will include:

- Associated marquees, big top and tented structures
- Food Service - catering/selling vans or booths
- Staging and/or rigging
- Public address and lighting support equipment
- Temporary toilets
- Temporary fencing
- Signage for the event
- Ticket boxes
- Tiered seating
- Waste management infrastructure

- Animal enclosures
- Support or promotional vehicles

Benefits of the project

Adelaide City Council is committed to creating a vibrant city full of exciting and popular cultural and artistic events and activities.

Circuses are a popular family friendly activity with a historic connection to the Bonython park site.

Circus Royale will present entertainment not available to the public under normal circumstances.

Project Impacts

Circus Royale will be responsible for minimising impacts on the Park Lands by following Adelaide City Council's Standard Operating Procedures for Events in the Park Lands. The event will be responsible for restoring the park to its original condition at the end of the event via a structured remediation process

Frequently Asked Questions

Will access to Bonython Park/Tulya Wardli be affected during the event?

Access paths through the park will be unaffected by the event.

Will it cost to attend the event?

Yes – Please visit www.circusroyale.com for up to date costs and performance times.

How will the Park Lands be protected during their stay?

In addition to the standard requirements under the event licence, Circus Royale will be responsible for minimising impacts on the Park Lands by following Adelaide City Council's Standard Operating Procedures for Events in the Park Lands. The event will be responsible for restoring the park to its pre occupation condition at the conclusion of the event.

Specifically Circus Royale has committed to undertaking the following Park Lands protection measures:

- Implementation of a Remediation Management and Internal Traffic Management Plan to minimise impact
- Installation of infrastructure that decreases the need for some heavy vehicles to enter the site such as track matting
- Defined areas where event vehicles will not be permitted
- Animal penning areas will be moved frequently to minimise impact of grassed areas.
- Animal Management – Circuses must abide by the SA code of practice for Welfare of Animals in Circuses

Can I expect noise where I live?

All event music or announcements will be contained within the main big top marquee thus minimising sound transfer to surrounding areas.

Some minor noise is anticipated. Predicted noise levels are within accepted guidelines for an event of this nature.

Circus Royale is required to abide by a Noise Mitigation plan for this event as defined in Adelaide City Council's Event Noise Mitigation – Standard Operating Procedures as Events and Musical Festivals with a Music Component

Is parking available at the event site?

U-Park will be operating car parking at Bonython Park from 23 September to Sunday 18 October 2015. Charges for car parking will apply - \$16.00 per vehicle

Public transport options are available in the vicinity at Bonython Park/Tulya Wardli

I have already seen a poster or advertisement for this event. Has it already been approved?

Approval for an event requiring public consultation is only given after the consultation period has concluded and the event has gone through the approval process.

Adelaide City Council discourages any event from promotions prior to Council approval. In some instances, particularly national tours, there is a need for events or festivals to announce dates in each capital city. This however does not constitute approval for the event.
