


Fingal Head Our vision and community values

Community Values



We value our indigenous heritage and cultural connections

A place where respect for country and the stories of the land and sea are entwined in everyday life; where families have lived for generations; where ancient traditions are alive and celebrated.

What this could look like:

Collaborative festivals and celebrations of indigenous culture; welcome pack for of new residents with educational material about the cultural significance of Fingal Head; carefully designed interpretive and educational signage in public spaces.



We value our natural environment

A place where the river, the ocean, the beach, the bush, rainforest and mangroves are protected, respected and enjoyed by all. They create a physical boundary around the existing village footprint meaning there is no room for growth or expansion.

What this could look like:

Riverbank restoration or stabilisation programs, encouraging landscaping with native low water demand species on private property; increased compliance for non-approved vegetation removal.



We value our relaxed lifestyle and village character

A place that feels like you're stepping back in time to a world of peace, tranquillity and uncrowded surf; where new buildings are low scale, sustainably designed and blend in with the leafy surroundings.

What this could look like:

Minimising additional commercial uses within the village; adherence to the 2 storey character height limit; modification to floor space ratio or boundary setback controls.



We value our community

A place where we are all different but we celebrate the common threads that bring us together; a place where you see familiar faces all the time, people look out for each other, kids can play safely and dog owners respect the rules.

What this could look like:

Community engagement and community led social events, improved accessibility and facilities in public open spaces; encouraging increased membership of the residents association.



We value respect from visitors

A place where visitors respect our home by doing the right thing — driving safely, parking where they are should, putting rubbish in the bin, not camping on the beach or in the bush.

What this could look like:

Education campaigns and signage targeting visitors to Fingal Head; increased ranger patrols; better designed car parking and visitor facilities.
