Project Information

Purpose

The purpose of this paper is to identify experiences and questions relating to the overall SA planning system to help inform Adelaide City Council's response to the Planning Reform.

The Discussion Paper is being released for information and input, and aims to facilitate community engagement and discussion.

Background

The Expert Panel on Planning Reform has been asked to review the State's planning system and advise the State Government and Parliament on potential reforms by December 2014.

As part of the early engagement (or *Listening* phase) of Planning Reform, the Expert Panel is posing the following questions to stakeholders and the community:

Experiences? What are your experiences of the current planning system?

Questions? Based on your experiences, what questions would you like the Expert Panel to consider?

To assist in this process the Expert Panel has identified 17 planning issues for discussion. These issues are listed below and Council has grouped its experiences and questions under these headings.

Benefits of the project

The State-led Planning Reform review is a timely opportunity to take stock of the existing arrangements for planning and development control in South Australia and Adelaide and to explore ideas for improvement with community input.

The paper, one of a series prepared by Adelaide City Council, should help to identify issues and overall awareness of the Planning Reform process.

Timeline

Comments to Council the Discussion Paper are invited by 5 pm on 13 September 2013 to help Council make a submission to the Expert Panel on Planning Reform.

As submissions to the Expert Panel have an impact, we encourage you to comment directly to them as well as Council as the final recommendations to State government will be made by the independent Expert Panel.

The Expert Panel has until December 2014 to submit its





recommendations to the State government, but will be identifying the issues to be addressed during 2013.
