








The Carbine Club of NSW announced the winner of the Davo Award for 2025 at a luncheon at the Belle Vue Hotel in leafy Paddington on 28 November – in keeping with the racing theme of the month the winner was club member and outstanding racehorse trainer Gai Waterhouse!



GAI WATERHOUSE AO

Carbine Club of NSW member Gal Waterhouse AO stands as one of Australian thoroughbred racing's most remarkable figures. Often celebrated as the 'First Lady of Australian Racing,' Waterhouse is one of the nation's most successful and influential thoroughbred trainers. Born in 1954 to Tommy Smith, Australia's most successful trainer, Gai grew up immersed in the racing world, though her path to prominence was anything but straightforward.

After working as a model and actress in her youth, Waterhouse obtained her Sydney trainer's license in 1992, becoming one of the first women in Australia to train horses professionally. She quickly shattered expectations, winning her first Group 1 race within two years.

Waterhouse's achievements are staggering. She has trained over 160 Group 1 winners and secured more than 7,000 career victories. Her Melbourne Cup triumph with Fiorente in 2013 was particularly historic, as by doing so she became the first Australian female to train the winner of the race. She has claimed multiple Golden Slippers, Australia's richest race for two-year-olds, and dominated Sydney's racing carnival year after year. Gai has trained the winner of Sydney's Doncaster Handicap and Epsom Handicap seven times each.

Beyond the statistics, Waterhouse revolutionised thoroughbred training in Australia, introducing European preparation methods and emphasizing fitness and presentation. Her Tulloch Lodge stables became synonymous with excellence, producing champions like Pierro, Sebring, and More Joyous.

Gai Waterhouse's legacy transcends her victories. She proved that women could not only compete but dominate in racing's male-dominated world, forever changing the sport's landscape while maintaining an infectious enthusiasm that captivates fans worldwide.
