Clunes—great new hotspot!

Clunes has been identified as an **Emerging Hotspot** in an article featured in the **Sunday Sun 14 October 2007**.

A study by **LaTrobe University Bendigo** has identified sea and tree change hotspots using the following criteria:

High level rural or coastal amenity
Attractive landscapes

Attractive small town with great character or heritage

Location easily accessed from Melbourne or a regional centre

Local products such as wine and gourmet food

Appreciating property values

Good stock of available housing and rural lifestyle properties.

Towns identified as emerging hotspots include:

Clunes, Avoca, Yea, Euroa, Timboon, Foster, Meredith, Winchelsea, Camperdown, Terang, Peterborough, Elmore, Heathcote, Chiltern, Rochester, Dunkeld and Peshurst.

Existing hotspots:

Apollo Bay, Avenel, Bendigo, Beechworth and Ovens Valley, Daylesford, Echuca, Horsham, Leongatha, Rutherglen, Yarrawonga, Warrnambool, Mansfield, Drouin-Warragul, South Gippsland (Lakes Entrance) and Surf Coast destinations such as Torquay.

CAMERON WARD COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

CENTRAL HIGHLANDS WATER REGION RATES

In the last edition of the Clunes Community News, I invited residents to sign a petition to the Essential Services Commission objecting to the 'Water Plan 2008-2013' prepared by the Central Highlands Water Region Corporation on the basis that the proposed increase in water rates was excessive, that there was little consultation in regard to the Water Plan and that Clunes residents were expected to contribute to a capital works program from which they would derive no benefit.

Over a three week period, 225 signatures were obtained and the petition has now been forwarded to the Essential Services Commission (ESC), the statutory authority that regulates water prices. I thank those residents who took the trouble to seek out and sign the petition and will advise of the response from the ESC when it is received.

NEW WARD BOUNDARIES

The Minister for Local Government has now accepted a recommendation from the Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC) regarding the new electoral boundaries for the Hepburn Shire. The VEC had originally proposed an increase in the number of councillors from 5 to 7, to be elected across an 'unsubdivided' (no wards) municipality. Several submissions were made to the VEC (including a number from individuals and organizations in the Cameron Ward) objecting to the concept of an unsubdivided municipality on the basis that representation for the smaller towns in the municipality could be eroded.

I am pleased to advise that the VEC altered its original proposal and recommended an option that provides for 7 councillors to be elected from 5 wards. As from November 2008, the number of voters in and the area of Cameron Ward will be reduced and the ward will be represented by one councillor.

WORKINGS OF COUNCIL

In recent weeks there has been a lot of gobbledegook in various media alleging problems within the Hepburn Shire Council. This line has been taken up by the Hon. Peter Kavanagh, MLC for Western Victoria. Speaking under parliamentary privilege, Mr Kavanagh suggested that the Council was 'locked in

conflict and is in danger of becoming dysfunctional'. I can assure residents of Cameron Ward that the allegations – fuelled by a small clique of disaffected antagonists in Daylesford – have no substance at all. I have extended an invitation to Mr. Kavanagh to visit Clunes, Creswick and other small towns of the Hepburn Shire so that he can see first hand the work that is being undertaken, not only by this Council but by the many hundreds of residents and volunteers who make a valuable contribution in their communities. In this regard it is interesting to read recent Australian Bureau of Statistics data that shows that the level of Volunteerism across all age groups in Clunes is the highest in the Hepburn Shire and significantly out ranks the state average.

SCORIBREAC

150 years of local history

SCORIBREAC is a farming property just south of Clunes. Its history reflects that of the wider Clunes district. The homestead was built in the 1860s by its then owner, Alexander Nicholson, a schoolteacher born in Scotland who migrated to Australia and became a goldminer. His success on the Ballarat goldfields enabled him to purchase land at Mount Beckworth but he found it difficult to farm there so he moved to the Glendonald area. A reluctant farmer who preferred intellectual pursuits, his involvement in civic affairs led to him becoming the second President of the Shire of Ballarat.

A celebration of his achievements, and those of his descendants, will be held at **Scoribreac on 8 December 2007**. The history of the family and the property will be explained through displays and memorabilia, and speakers will discuss topics relevant to the family, the property and the Clunes district. These include gold mining, the First World War, the two local fires in the 1940s, and social injustice.

BATHHOUSE OPEN DAY



On open day of the Hepburn Springs Bathhouse on Saturday October 6 presents a wonderful opportunity for locals and visitors to view the progress made on the \$10 million redevelopment of the facility.

The builder has made a special allowance for closer viewing of the new facilities under construction.

Displays, brochures and a walk next to the buildings will be available from 1pm until 4pm.

The Daylesford and District Municipal Band will entertain and a free BBQ will be provided.

While it will not be possible to enter the buildings under construction on this occasion the open day will provide an insight and a good view of the progress of the work.

Hepburn Shire Council CEO Victor Szwed said the redevelopment of the centre involved refurbishment of the existing heritage building for relaxation, therapy and massage and a new building comprising public pool/spa facilities, access bridge to reception and state of the art amenities.

"The tender for the operator lease is being conducted by the State Government and announcement of the new operator is expected later this year," he said.

The revitalised Bathhouse is scheduled to open early 2008.

Chairman of the Bathhouse Business & Community Liaison Committee Cr Bill McClenaghan said the open day was a great opportunity for the local community and visitors to see just how involved the construction of this facility was.

"Few buildings would be as involved to construct and unique in design as the new mineral springs facility," Cr McClenaghan said.

The Hepburn Shire Council's Drought Recovery Committee has worked with local businesses to offer farmers affected by drought the opportunity to have a break away from the farm.

Overnight stays have been donated by local Bed and Breakfast operators for farmers. (Only those from farm rateable properties are eligible.)

Bed and Breakfast overnight stays have been donated by Tuki, Cherry Tree Cottage and Old Chilli Bed & Breakfast. Farmers can nominate themselves, or a friend or neighbour.

Hepburn Shire Council Community Strengthening Coordinator Brian Dunn said the drought affected all farmers in one way or another.

"No one who lives on a farm is exempt from the hardship or worries that this devastating drought has created," Mr Dunn said. "This might be the break you need, or if you see others who could do a with a break away from the farm consider nominating them."

The Hepburn Shire Drought Recovery Committee has hosted a number of activities, opportunities and projects since implementation early this year.

A Farmers Forum attracted over 200 people, a Drought Information brochure has been produced, a bus trip for farmers was held recently and the Council's website provides drought related information.

Community Garden

If you like getting down and dirty

Clunes Neighbourhood House has opened a community garden at 67 Alliance Street. Areas have been set aside for raised beds to be built; these plots will become available to the public as resources such as sleepers, soil and mulch are donated. People with disabilities are encouraged to participate.

The community garden will use permaculture principles with workshops to be held throughout the year to help participants understand sustainable agricultural practices, without dependency upon herbicides and chemicals. A small fee will be charged to cover CNH fees.

A major benefit of having a community garden in Clunes is that it brings people together in a friendly atmosphere and relaxed surroundings to share gardening experiences and tips to build a knowledge base upon.

An alfresco area has been set aside to build a pizza oven, barbecue and dining area so people can cook what they grow too show off and share their culinary skills with their friends and family. I'm getting hungry writing this. Community gardens have many recognised physical and mental health benefits, like: seasonal nutritious food grown cheaply, light exercise in the fresh air, the opportunity for social interaction and new friendships....

It's also becoming apparent that community gardens are good for the environment too. They are more carbon friendly than supermarket produce as they don't incur fossil fuel burning via the need to transport goods hundreds and thousands of kilometres from the farm gate to your home. So think about joining us for some fun times ahead.

A friend just back from a community garden study trip to New York told me Bette Midler and other celeb's are buying old apartments in the Big Apple, then tearing em down and donating the land back to local communities to set up community gardens.
