Mac began his reply by observing, "It's hard to believe it was sixty years ago I walked through that door", referring to the Lodge room entrance. His speech recounted events from his time in Freemasonry; some funny, some sad, all memorable. He thanked his family and especially his wife, Judith, for her tireless support over the years. He told the story of how he and Judith hand wrote each members' notice paper before their daughter helped them to do it on a computer!

The Worshipful Master, Gordon Cameron, thanked those in attendance, delighted to see so many present to support Mac and Malcolm. Both men have been mainstays of the Lodge and the community and we congratulate them both on their well deserved awards.

CLUNES GARDENING CLUB

The year is just zooming by and here we find ourselves in October already! Hope you are enjoying the better weather (mostly) and you have been able to venture out into your gardens a bit more. It's a wonderful time in the garden right now with loads of new growth on our plants and bloomin' lovely colour displays from our flowers.

In September, 14 members of the Garden Club went to Melton for a guided tour of the Botanic Gardens. John Bentley, the gardens main curator and font of knowledge, led us around some of the 60 acres of mainly Australian native gardens which he was instrumental in establishing some 15 years ago. Some of our group had actually visited the gardens soon after they were established and were able to see the vast changes and progress over the years. The gardens are most impressive and well worth a visit!

Some jobs for October in the Garden:

- Spray roses with an organic fungicide to eliminate aphids, black spot etc. It's best to remove aphids by merely running your gloved fingers along the affected bud or branch. Any leaves with obvious black spot should be removed and disposed of in your waste bin.
- Give wattles that have finished blooming a light prune and at the same time check stems and trunk for borers.

- Deter those pesky snails which love to feast on your newly planted seedling by placing some shallow dishes of beer on the soil near the plants to trap those critters. Clean and refill the beer daily. Alternately, you can place an upturned glass jar over the seedlings at night and remove in the mornings. Good luck!
- Keep up with weeding garden beds.
- All plants should have been given a spring dose of liquid organic fertiliser by now and mulch around them should be lightly raked and 'fluffed up'.
- Top up garden beds with some organic compost in readiness to receive new vegetable seedlings.
- Remember, it is still possible to have a few more frosts here in Clunes, so be cautious about what you plant and double check with a knowledgeable 'local'.

Best flowers to plant: snapdragons, dahlias, gazanias, gerberas, marigolds, pansies, petunias, salvia, alyssium and many more!

Best vegetables to plant: zucchini, pumpkin, squash, broccoli, cabbages, cauliflowers and Brussels sprouts, potatoes, silverbeet, lettuce, spring onions and climbing beans.

CLUNES FOLK REMEMBER: The rule of thumb for Clunes is to plant tomatoes
AFTER the Clunes Agricultural Show on the
3rd Saturday of November!



VOLUNTEERING RECOGNISED IN CLUNES

People living in Clunes have always been prepared to roll their sleeves up and get involved to help out or add value to the Clunes community. COVID has dinted people's enthusiasm, made it a bit harder to connect and even just changed how groups operate. Despite this impact, the state government recently recognised the importance of volunteering in adding to the capacity of our town. Clunes Neighbourhood House secured one of only 19 grants awarded to support local partnership and innovation projects to re-engage volunteers, broaden the volunteer base, and strengthen volunteering in local communities.

Groups in Clunes have often collaborated when major events are being held or working together to address local leadership, governance and compliance issues. This collaborative approach is key to this funded project, which provides Clunes with an opportunity to roll out one of just a few place-based (whole of town) volunteering models in the country.

Rebuilding Clunes' Capacity Through Volunteering is a 6-month project funded by the State Government of Victoria, Department of Families, Fairness and Housing. It involves working directly with the CTDA, Clunes Football Netball club, Clunes Museum and Creative Creative to see if together we can reduce barriers to volunteering, work collaboratively to make it easier to volunteer, find new ways of volunteering, and showcase the different contributions volunteers make in our town. We would design this prototype to link also with volunteering in other groups in town.

The project will include four public events providing people with an opportunity to connect directly with the many community groups in Clunes.

STAY SAFE ON OUR ROADS

New, easy access, VicRoads approved webinars are now available online and at a Neighbourhood House near you.

Research shows that road accidents increase from the age of 75. Community members, families and carers can now access a free 45-minute online Safe Driver course to understand "driving health" for older drivers – available online by visiting chanh.org.au/roadsafety or you can book a computer at Clunes Neighbourhood House.

By watching the four short modules you will learn ways to reduce accidents and the severity of potential injuries. The VicRoads Safe Driver course addresses the implications of age- and health-related complications when driving and how to manage these complications to support older people to continue driving safely.

From 2019 to 2020, the medical review board made 88,400 "Fitness to Drive" decisions, with 92% of these people being able to continue to drive! Find out how older people can maintain their "driving health". If driving is no longer an option, this course introduces some of the support services available to assist older drivers with future travel plans.






