At the recent Delegates Meeting in Melbourne CCNT unveiled details of the 2024 Carbine Club International Congress to be held in Darwin in June/July next year.



#### **Congress 2024 – Some Specifics**



#### SPECIFICS:

- Taking on feedback from previous Delegates Meetings, the entire itinerary is designed around a few key events (one on each day) and then guests being able to pick and choose how much they wish to enjoy whilst in Darwin (and their itinerary is then costed accordingly). We appreciate that some people are regular travellers to the Top-End, whilst for some, it will be their first visit.
- There will be a range of accommodation options offered (at varying Price Points) all at the Mindil Beach Casino & Resort.
- There will be a Carbine Lounge that will operate at specific times throughout the five days so that there will be plenty of opportunity for fellowship and information on the next days' events.
- "Tourism Top-End" (the local Tourism Industry Association) have come on-board and there will be a dedicated website that will enable guests to choose a multitude of different touring options throughout their stay (some at no cost, and others being half or full-day itineraries).
- There will be itineraries specifically designed around partners including private champagne tours of the Paspaley Pearl Gallery, Arly Rae Crocodile Products, and many of the Top-End's Aboriginal Art Galleries.
- The "Carbine Congress Cost" will include guest's accommodation (at various Price Points), the five dedicated Carbine Events (one on each day), transfers to and from those events and the daily "Carbine Lounge - Happy Hour" (which may end up being a little longer than an hour).

There will be many opportunities to take in the range of experiences on offer in the Territory – the Club is teaming with Top End Tourism to open up opportunities, or you might even use Darwin as the kick off point for onwards travel !

# THE "CINDERELLA" STORY...

Sometimes, fairy-tale stories really do come true.

The story of Carbine's Shoe and how it came to be in the possession of The Carbine Club of Northern Territory is just that.

In 2003, Corowa resident Stuart Davie reached out to friend David Aldred with an incredible tale of how he had acquired the shoe of one of Australia's greatest racehorses.

Stuart had been gifted the shoe from a family who were related to **Jonathon Gill**, a Flemington master farrier, who was known to have always shod Carbine.

Gill had arrived in Australia from Yorkshire in 1856 and within a short period established a farrier business on Mt Alexander Road, Flemington. The obituary published in the respected Australasian newspaper on the Saturday following his death on 28 January 1900 recounted:

As he was a most expert workman, nearly all the celebrated racehorses of the past and present day were shod by him or under his supervision.

Gill's Blacksmith Shop was carried on by son Charlie Gill, who featured in local media during the Queen Elizabeth's first visit to Australia in 1954, as the old forge was still in operation and was considered a historic landmark on the route the Queen took from Essendon Airport to the city.

In that article Charlie is seen holding one of Carbine's shoes – which, according to the family, were often kept with simple identification tags in boxes and given as gifts.

From winning the Melbourne Cup in 1890 and holding the mantle as Australia's greatest racehorse; one of the shoes that graced the horse known as "Old Jack" had ultimately made its way into the possession of The Carbine Club of NT more than a century later. It ultimately was gifted by David Aldred, then CEO of the Darwin Turf Club, who passed it along with accompanying documents, onto Carbine Club NT Life Member Tony Shaw, as Aldred felt that the CCNT would be the best custodian of such a prize.

For the next few years, Tony was tasked with making an attempt to verify the shoe's authenticity and after much digging, took the shoe along to the Victorian Racing Club (VRC) in March 2006 to meet the VRC Museum Curator Kathy Peters.

Tony was granted exclusive access to the VRC Chairman's Boardroom where one of Carbine's original hooves is on display. In a scene reminiscent of the Cinderella fairy-tale, Tony found that the shoe did **indeed** fit the hoof. Sceptics might question this, however those familiar with Carbine's history are aware that Carbine's shoes were quite unique; and that he also suffered from a split hoof for the majority of his career.

According to the VRC, taking into account the manner in which the shoe was acquired, the newspaper clippings and the fact that the shoe fit, it was therefore "extremely possible" it is indeed the genuine item.

On the occasion of its 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary, The Carbine Club of NT presented the shoe to the Carbine Club (Victoria) for its display, so that others could also enjoy the story of the wonder known as "the people's horse".

(Footnote: The Shoe involves three life members - Tony Shaw did the provenance of the shoe and championed its worth to the Club, Peter Bailey more than ably put the words together and Andy Bruyn had the honour of bringing it to Melbourne with Club VP, James Herraman for the handover at the Delegates meeting).

Howard was an active member of the Carbine Club of the ACT for over 20 years and held many Senior Management Positions at IBM, Telstra, Computer Power Group, Fujitsu and Lexmark International.



However, Howard's passion was horse racing and was Chairman of Canberra Racing Club between 2002 and 2006 and deputy for 6 years over an 18-year tenure, making a significant contribution to the club over that period and being awarded Life Membership. 
