












The Carbine Club of Western Australia – WAFL Grand Final Luncheon

The Carbine Club of Western Australia held its annual WAFL Grand Final luncheon on Friday 19 September in the magnificent River Room at Optus Stadium, Perth. In a preview of the highly anticipated grand final between minor premier South Fremantle and back to back grand finalist East Perth, the crowd heard from both captains and coaches who cautiously discussed tactics and their chances of raising the premiership flag.

Chairman of the WA Football Commission Ian Callahan proposed a toast to football and then Carbine Club of WA President Matt Fahey welcomed the room full of 430 guests and thanked the WA Football

Commission for their continued association with CCWA.

Matt then welcomed to the club two new CCWA members, Claremont's dual Sandover medallist Jye Bolton and ex-Claremont club Captain Mark Hann. Matt also fondly remembered John "Buzz" Parkinson and Andrew Krakouer who had both passed during the year.

MC Mark Readings managed proceedings for the day and invited the 2025 WAFL Sandover Medallist Charlie Constable (Perth Football Club) and 2025 Dhara Kerr Medallist Krstel Petrevski (Subiaco Football Club) to the stage to receive their Carbine Club of WA medals from CCWA Life Member Rick Hart.

The audience was entertained by special guest, dual North Melbourne premiership player and 2018 premiership coach of the West Coast Eagles, Adam Simpson. Adam presented in a unique back and forth with MC Mark Readings and also presented his own power point presentation, reminiscing on his journey to becoming coach of the West Coast Eagles. Following Adam, was one of Australia's finest comedians, fellow member of the Carbine Club of NSW, Vince Sorrenti. Vince had the crowd in fits of laughter with his memories of growing up, covid medical issues and lockdowns. His brand of humour was well received by all in the room.

Finally, one significant bidder won the four tickets to the 2026 Anzac Day match between Essendon and Collingwood at the MCG, kindly arranged by CCWA Life Member Graham Moss. margin, to hang on and win the 2025 flag.





