## 10 STEPS TO TAILORED

Classic design and beautifully tailored furnishings triumph in this elegant city apartment. Interior designer Andrea D'Cruz of RLD shares the journey.

1 A CLEAR BRIEF The owners, a busy couple who travel a lot, wanted their Sydney apartment to have a distinct Manhattan-style sophistication. "Warm, welcoming and comfortable" with an emphasis on tailored design, was the brief.

CONSIDERED LAYOUT The main living area is open-plan, with formal seating at one end, family living at the other and a partly recessed kitchen and dining zone in the centre of the space. The main bedroom suite leads off the formal area; the guestroom, study and bathrooms from the family zone. Both living areas open onto generous balconies with iconic Sydney views to the east and west.

MAKE AN ENTRANCE "Strategic use of theatrics" was Andrea's approach. "The entry foyer is unashamedly bold, setting the scene for the apartment". The custom-designed security doors resemble ornate screens. The marble sculpture by Graham Radcliffe has striking frame-like panelling as a backdrop and creates a direct focal point on entry.





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9 WALLS & WINDOWS Silk-effect
wallpaper in a deep, moody hue allows
the elegant lines of lighter-toned furniture to
star in the living spaces. Bedroom wallpaper
is contained within plaster mouldings for a
formal twist. Cosy and cocooning, the
curtains in all rooms feature a sheer inner
layer as well as a block-out layer for
controlling sun and maintaining privacy.

10 FABULOUS FLOORING The existing oak floor in the foyer and kitchen was treated with an ebony wash. A two-toned and dual-textured Wilton carpet in the living areas creates a formal border and clear definition of spaces. H&G Project by interior designer Andrea
