COURSE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

You must have completed Year 10 or be at least 16 to commence the course.

ENTRY IS BY ATTENDING A COURSE INFORMATION SESSION AND DRAMA WORKSHOP AUDITION:

At the beginning of the drama workshop audition, we will run through the course information, so you'll be clear about all the details, and you can ask any questions about the course. Then we will take you through a range of drama games and exercises which allow us to judge your suitability for the course. You do not need to prepare anything for this workshop, but you must be willing to participate fully on the day. At the conclusion of the workshop, we will have a one-on-one interview with you, and we'll ask you more about what you hope to get out of the course and what your aspirations are.

Within a couple of weeks we will notify you as to whether or not you have been accepted into the course.

ACCEPTANCE:

On acceptance of a place in the course, students are required to pay a deposit of \$1,000 towards course fees. This covers your first weeks in the course.

Austudy/Youth Allowance/ Abstudy: Yes, government benefits are available for this course, to eligible applicants.

QUALIFICATION:

On successful completion of the course, you will be eligible to receive a nationally recognised qualification, the 10197NAT Certificate IV in Acting for Stage and Screen. Students who do not complete the whole course are eligible for a Statement of Attainment for units completed successfully.

HOMEWORK AND ASSIGNMENTS:

In addition to the face-to-face training each week, full-time students should allow another 10 hours per week for homework tasks, learning lines, rehearsing with classmates and other related study tasks. Part-time students can opt to study on either one or two nights per week, according to their lifestyle needs. Part-time students should also ensure they have sufficient time to complete the work required.
