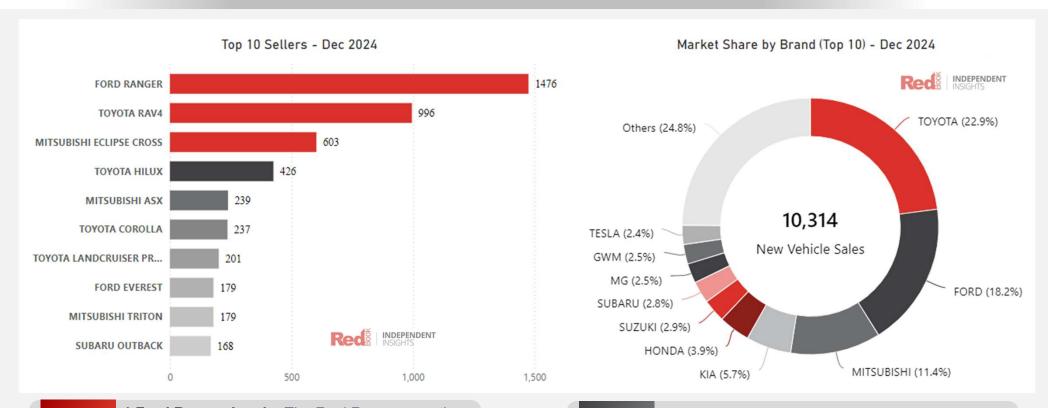
## Top Sellers & Market Share





Top Sellers **1.Ford Ranger Leads:** The Ford Ranger tops the chart with 1,476 units sold, leading the market.

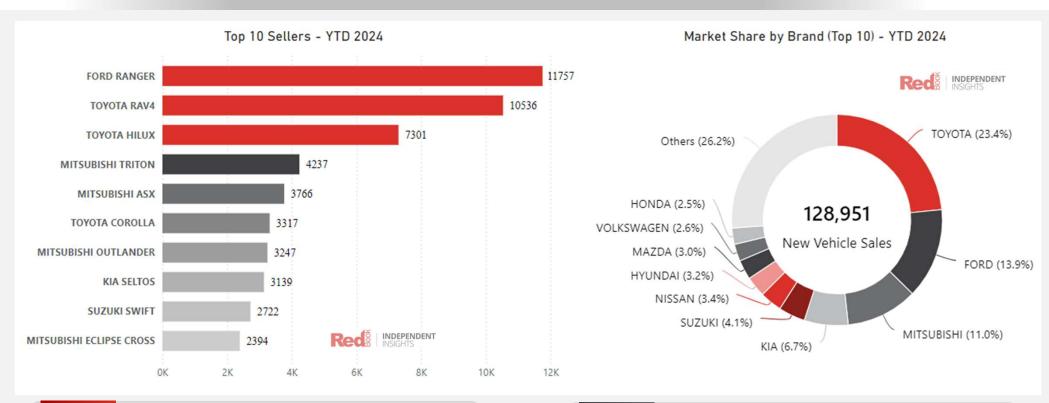
**2.Toyota RAV4 and Mitsubishi Eclipse Cross Follow:** Mitsubishi Eclipse Cross (603 units) ranks
No. 3 for the first time, overtaking Toyota Hilux.

Market Share **1.Toyota Dominates:** Toyota continues to hold the largest market share at 22.9%, despite a significant drop from 33.7% in November.

**2.Ford and Mitsubishi Compete:** Ford holds No.2 position with 18.2%, Mitsubishi follows with 11.4%.

Top Sellers **1.Utes Continue to dominate:** Since removal of Clean Car Discounts (CCD) ute registrations have returned to pre-CCD levels.

**2.Toyota RAV4 holds strong**: The Toyota RAV4 ranks No.2, showing strong performance, but supported with 34% of these going as rentals.

Market Share **1.Toyota Dominates YTD:** Toyota holds the largest market share at 23.4%, showing its continued dominance in the market.

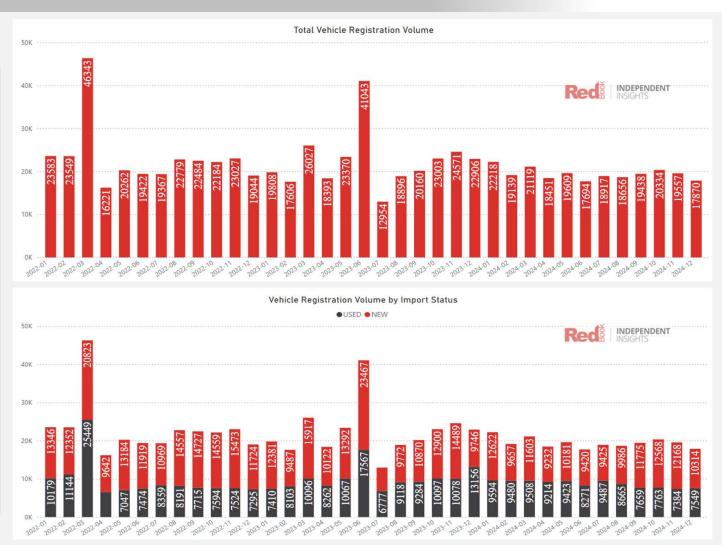
**2.Ford and Mitsubishi Compete:** Ford has a 13.9% market share, while Mitsubishi holds 11.0%, both remaining strong competitors in the market.

### NZ New Car Sales Trend



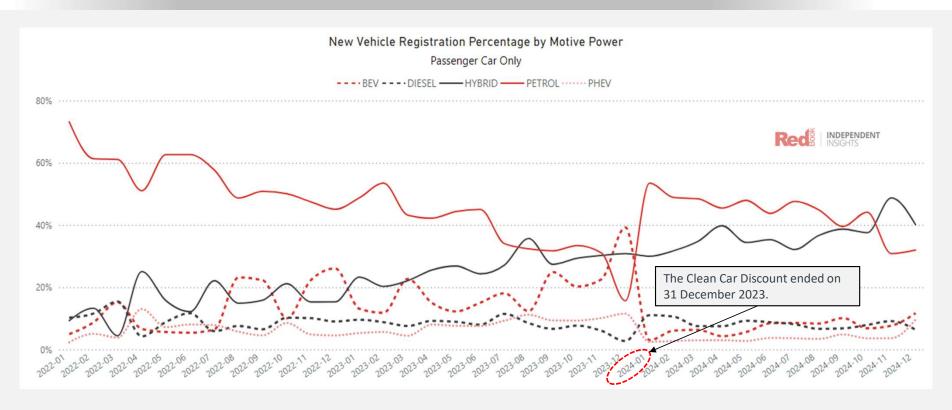
# Market Trend

- **1. Big drop –** Overall registrations dropped by 9%, with new registrations declining by 15% and used registrations increasing by 2% compared to November 24.
- **2. YTD New registrations significantly down, 13% on 2023 –** With a slight increase of 6% in December compared to the same month last year.
- **3. YTD Used registrations down by 13% on 2023 –** There was a significant drop in December (-43%) compared to last year.



# New Car Sales Trend by Motive Power



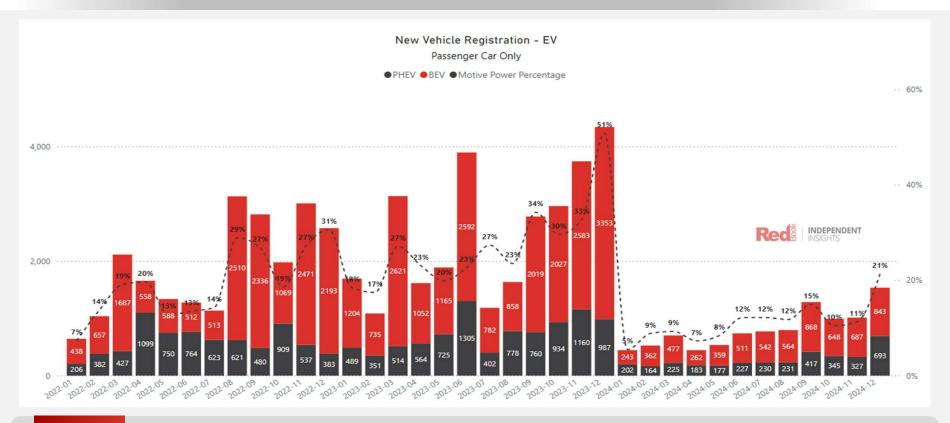


Insights

- **1.Hybrid decreases, while petrol maintains:** In December, hybrid registrations decreased significantly, while petrol registrations remained at similar levels compared to the previous month.
- **2.EV sees steady increases:** Both BEV and PHEV registrations increased compared to November, showing a steady uptrend as they recover from the huge drop due to the termination of the CCD at the end of December 2023.

# **EV New Car Sales Percentage**



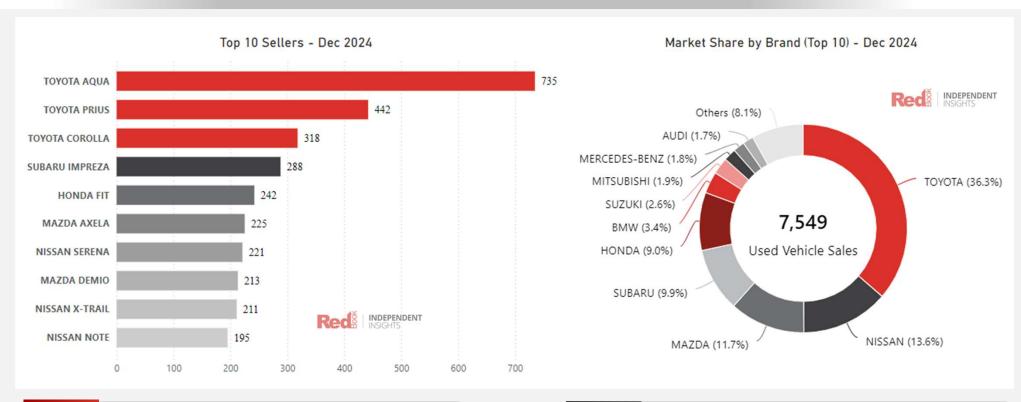


Insights

**1. EV's fight back continues**: The market share of BEVs and PHEVs has increased to 21%. The top-selling models in December include the Tesla Model Y and Model 3, BMW iX series, Kia EV9 and EV6, Volkswagen ID.5 and ID.4, BYD Atto 3 and Dolphin.

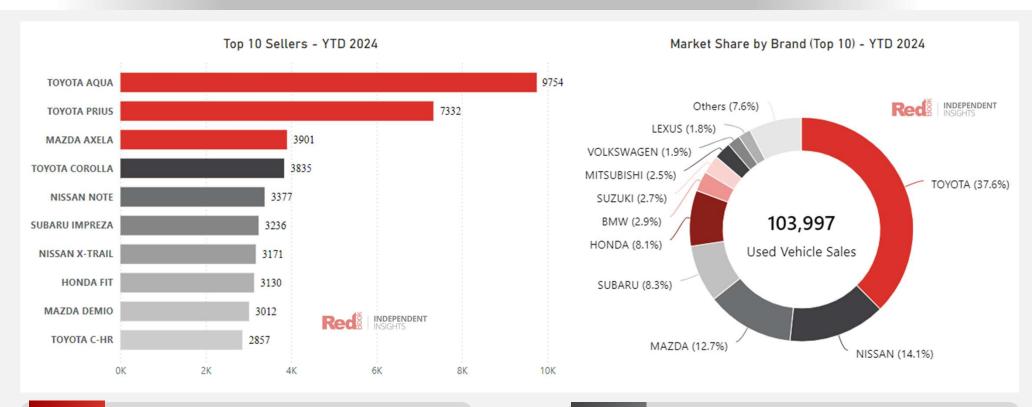

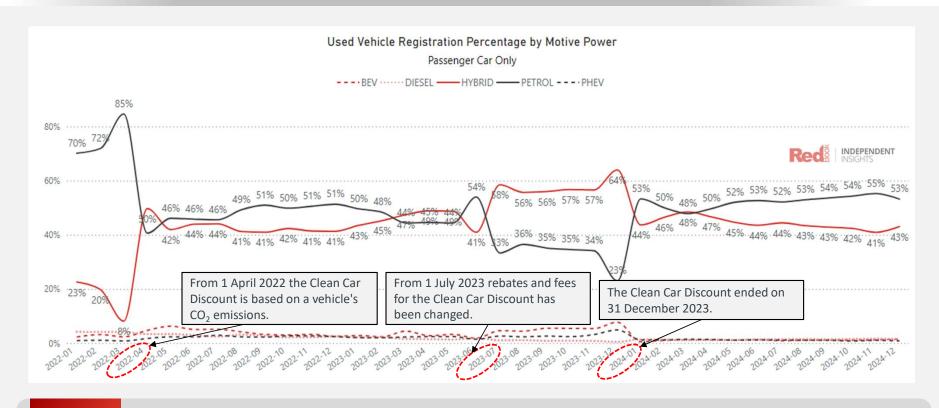

Insights

**1.Petrol holds above 53%:** down slightly from November 2024.

**2.Hybrid vehicles increase slightly to 43%:** With no incentives under the rebate scheme, hybrid registrations have been consistently falling, but December saw a slight recovery.

3.BEV and PHEV Remain Marginal: BEV and PHEV registrations continue to make up a small fraction of the total.

### **Used Vehicle Price Index**

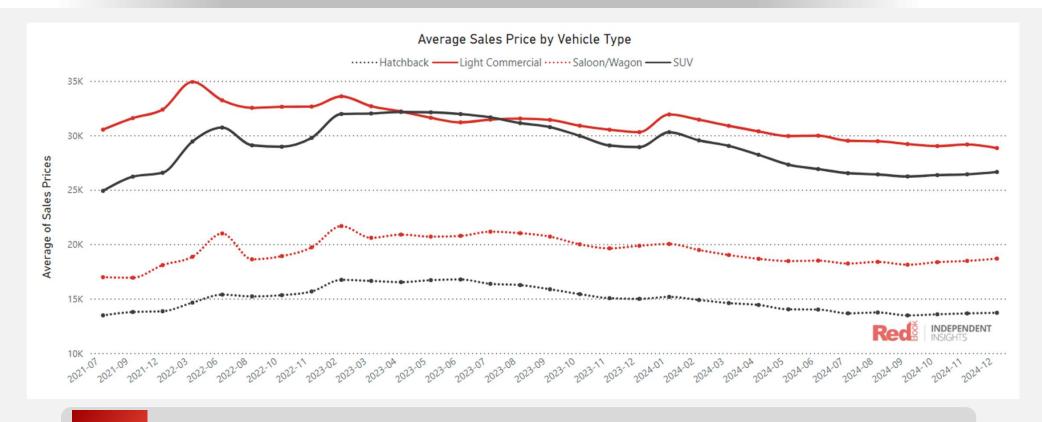




Price Index **1. Sales prices maintained:** Following a period of decline from January to September, used car values experienced a slight uptick between September and November. December remained at a similar level to November. However, the overall trend still reflects a sustained decrease compared to earlier in the year.

Price Index **1.** In December, all vehicle types showed a slight increase compared to November, except for light commercial vehicles, which continued to trend downward.
