Overview

The unit [CHCPRT025 Identify and report children and young people at risk](#) covers the skills and knowledge required to identify children and young people who are at risk and report in line with legislative requirements. This Assessment Pathway is suitable for workers in a range of job roles providing services to children and young people including in community services and health contexts.

Delivery Mode: Assessment only pathway. The online assessments are available on our learning platform, Cloud Assess. The assessments are self-directed and designed to be convenient and flexible.

Duration: 6 weeks. You will have a maximum of 6 weeks to complete your assessment however, you can fast track this timeframe.

Pre-requisites: There are no prerequisites for this Assessment Pathway however, you will require evidence of being over 18 years of age and access to a computer and the internet.

Assessments: The course has been developed by sector specialists and most of the assessments are linked to your workplace. The assessment tasks may include questioning, case studies, third party feedback, self-reflection or workplace projects.
