Unit Descriptor	This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to provide first aid response to a casualty in line with first aid guidelines determined by the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) and other Australian national peak clinical bodies. The unit applies to all persons who may be required to provide a first aid response in a range of situations, including community and workplace settings.
Pre-requisites	There are no prerequisite units required to be completed by learners prior to commencing this unit.
Expected Outcomes	 By the end of this unit, it is expected that learners will be able to: respond to an emergency situation, apply appropriate first aid procedures, communicate details of the incident, and review the incident.
How will learners be assessed?	Learners are required to complete two assessment events. Assessment 1: Knowledge Assessment (Written Questions) Assessment 2: Practical Assessments (Observations/Scenarios) For each assessment event learners will be assessed as being Satisfactory (S) or Not Satisfactory (NS). Where a learner may be deemed as NS the assessor will provide the opportunity for resubmission (Assessment 1) or reassessment (Assessment 2).
What is needed for a learner to be deemed competent in the unit?	To be deemed competent in this unit and awarded a <i>Statement of Attainment</i> learners must achieve a satisfactory result in both assessment events.
