Unit Code	HLTAID011	Unit Name and Number	Provide first aid (R1)
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Unit Descriptor	<p>This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to provide first aid response to a casualty in line with first aid guidelines determined by the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) and other Australian national peak clinical bodies.</p> <p>The unit applies to all persons who may be required to provide a first aid response in a range of situations, including community and workplace settings.</p>
Pre-requisites	There are no prerequisite units required to be completed by learners prior to commencing this unit.
Expected Outcomes	<p>By the end of this unit, it is expected that learners will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • respond to an emergency situation, • apply appropriate first aid procedures, • communicate details of the incident, and • review the incident.
How will learners be assessed?	<p>Learners are required to complete two assessment events.</p> <p>Assessment 1: Knowledge Assessment (Written Questions)</p> <p>Assessment 2: Practical Assessments (Observations/Scenarios)</p> <p>For each assessment event learners will be assessed as being Satisfactory (S) or Not Satisfactory (NS). Where a learner may be deemed as NS the assessor will provide the opportunity for resubmission (Assessment 1) or reassessment (Assessment 2).</p>
What is needed for a learner to be deemed competent in the unit?	To be deemed competent in this unit and awarded a <i>Statement of Attainment</i> learners must achieve a satisfactory result in both assessment events.

<p>What are the assessment requirements?</p>	<p>The two assessment events require learners to undertake the following:</p> <p>Assessment 1: Knowledge Assessment</p> <p>Learners will receive a <i>Learner Knowledge Assessment Workbook</i> three weeks before they are required to attend the practical assessments. The workbook is to be completed in their own time or place of work. A <i>Learner Guide</i> will also be provided for learners to use when completing their workbook.</p> <p>Note: there may be occasions in which your trainer/assessor will offer some short workshops during the three weeks to assist you in completing your workbook. You will be advised if the opportunity is made available to you.</p> <p>The completed workbook is to be submitted one week before attending their scheduled practical assessments. Assessor will provide each learner with feedback and their assessment result.</p> <p>Note: Instructions for submission are in the <i>Learner Knowledge Assessment Workbook</i>.</p> <p>Assessment 2: Practical Assessments</p> <p>On completion and submission of the <i>Learner Knowledge Assessment Workbook</i> learners will be scheduled to attend the practical assessments.</p> <p>Practical assessments will take place in a nominated venue with the assessor who will observe the skills and knowledge demonstrated by learners when responding to a range of first aid incidents. Assessor will provide each learner with feedback and their assessment result.</p>
<p>Time allocated to each assessment event</p>	<p>Assessment 1: Knowledge Assessment</p> <p>Nominal hours to complete the assessment in a learner's own time is 6 – 7 hours.</p> <p>Assessment 2: Practical Assessments</p> <p>Nominal hours to complete the face-to-face practical assessment is 7.5 hours.</p>
