Ross Laurie suggests:

Drawing materials, pencils, charcoal, pastels and paper.
odourless solvent
gel medium
wax
refined linseed oil

A range of colours (all types of paint) with attention to earth colours:

burnt sienna
burnt and raw umber
Terre verte
yellow ochre
red ochre or venetian red
black
titanium white and zinc white(mixing white)
A range of other colours including reds, yellows and blues.

A range of brushes, a palette and some tins for mixing in.

Clean up rags and painting clothes!

Bring plenty of support materials, canvases of different sizes and paper and to work on during the 3 day period.

The Willoughby Arts Centre provides professionally equipped studio space and some essential equipment for classes. There are three large painting and drawing studios, as well as ceramics, printmaking, jewellery and sculpture studios. Students are expected to provide their own art materials and consumables.

We ask that you please bring your own cup. There are cafes nearby but you may prefer to bring your own food. We have a fridge and microwave for you to use and a sunny courtyard with seating. It is policy that no food or drink is to be made in the studios or consumed near Work Health & Safety sensitive materials.

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Library Over three hundred library books are available to students during class for reference. Members have borrowing rights to the library.

Public Transport Metro bus 120, is a prepaid High frequency service that connects Chatswood with Bondi Junction via Town Hall. Metrobuses depart every 10 minutes during morning and afternoon peak periods, every 15 minutes during the day and every 20 minutes at night and on weekends. 120 and 115 buses run frequently from Chatswood, via North Sydney, Martin Place and Kingsford. Buses stop on the corner of Penshurst & Laurel Streets, 100 metres from the centre.
