APPLICATION FEE

In order to register a student to be considered for enrolment, an Application for Admission Form must be completed and a fee of \$65 (GST included) paid. This fee is non-refundable and is designed to cover administration costs associated with enrolments and interviews. Please note that the acceptance by the School of an Application for Admission Form and the non-refundable processing fee does not guarantee an interview for enrolment or an offer of enrolment.

ENROLMENT FEE

Confirmation of the enrolment is dependent upon an interview at a time and date to be nominated by the School, and upon the payment of a non-refundable Enrolment Fee.

It is important to note:

1. An Enrolment Fee will be payable at the time a confirmed placement is accepted for a student entering Frederick Irwin Anglican School. This Fee when paid will be credited to the School Endowment Fund as a contribution towards the existing buildings and educational facilities **and is non-refundable**.

The Enrolment Fee will be payable at the time the first student family member is offered a placement at the School. No further Enrolment Fee will be payable for subsequent student siblings attending concurrently. For siblings not attending concurrently there may be a top-up of the Enrolment Fee or payment of a full Enrolment Fee depending on the length of time a family has not had a child attending the School.

In 2019 the following rates will apply:

- \$1,300 per family for students entering Kindergarten to Year 10
- \$650 per family for students entering Year 11
- \$325 per family for students entering Year 12

Should a family subsequently enrol a sibling in any year below Year 11, it will be necessary for a top-up payment to be made to bring the Enrolment Fee up to the Years K – 10 amount.

2. The Enrolment Fee is a commitment to the School that the student will take up the position stated in the ***formal Letter of Offer***.
3. The Enrolment Fee will not be refunded after the place has been formally accepted, unless the withdrawal results from the parent receiving an employment transfer interstate or overseas prior to the student attending the School.

NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL

The Principal *must* be given *a full term's notice in writing* prior to the withdrawal of a student from the School. In default of such notice a quarter of the Annual Tuition Fee will be charged in lieu of notice.

SCHOOL BUILDING FUND

The School has established a School Building Fund to which parents are encouraged to donate. These funds will be used to maintain and extend the School's facilities in the future.

The Fund is approved by the Australian Taxation Office, and therefore all donations over \$2 are eligible tax deductions. Enquiries should be made to the Business Manager.

All Government per capita subsidies are paid directly to the School and have been taken into account in setting the fees.

The above fees include all tuition costs OTHER THAN textbook purchase, subject levies, excursions/camps, music lessons and voluntary excursions outside normal school hours.

Some additional charges may apply for special model projects in Woodwork, Metalwork and Art.

All other charges for consumables in Home Economics, Digital Technologies, Practical Arts, Humanities & Social Science, Science, English, English Literature, Drama, and photocopying are included in the annual levies.

Excursions and Camps

The following estimates have been made of the possible additional costs for excursions and camps in 2019. This information is provided to assist families in their budgeting; however, it is *indicative only* and may vary by subject options for each secondary student when finalised in 2019.

Year 10	\$ 365
Year 11	\$ 780 (includes a camp of 4 days)
Year 12	\$ 680

Where students choose Outdoor Education as an elective subject, additional costs will be incurred due to the nature of the activities.

Other elective activities not included are Performing Arts Camp for Years 4 – 12 \$290, Year 11 Biology Camp \$180 and Year 12 Media Camp \$410.

Music Lessons – \$32.00 per half hour lesson.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING (VET) COURSES

Students undertaking VET courses will incur a certification fee applicable to the Registered Training Organisation plus any additional costs for outside activities and assessments. In 2019 certification fees will be \$150.00 per student.

GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

GST legislation provides that tuition fees incurred in education courses are GST free; however, there are some activities and expenses that will attract GST. The Term Fee Statements will identify any GST component.

PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS

Tuition Fees and charges may be paid by Cash, Cheque, Direct Debit, MasterCard, Visa Card and BPay. Cheques should be made payable to *Frederick Irwin Anglican School*. For your convenience EFTPOS facilities are available at the School Office to receive payments by mail, telephone or in person.

OVERDUE ACCOUNTS

A late payment fee of \$55 (GST included) may be charged if payment has not been received by the due date and/or alternative payment arrangements have not been made with the Business Manager. A student may not be permitted to commence a new term without the consent in writing of the Principal of the School being first obtained, unless the previous Term's Fees, Levies and Charges are paid in full.

FAMILY CONCESSION

A reduction of 20% of the Tuition Fee is made for each student member of the family concurrently attending the School, other than the eldest.

GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE

Parents are invited to contact the School Office regarding the *Secondary Assistance and Clothing Allowance Scheme*.

Secondary Assistance and Clothing Allowance Scheme: The Education Department of WA funds a High School Clothing allowance and an Additional Assistance Scheme.

Parents who hold a Department of Social Security Pensioner Health Benefit and Concession Card, Health Benefits Card or Health Care Card or Department of Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Health Benefit Card are eligible to apply.

INSURANCE

It is strongly recommended that parents check their health cover and insurance policies to ensure adequate medical, ambulance, personal property and liability insurance cover is held. The School does not accept responsibility for loss of, or damage to, personal effects and property, or for bodily injury or property damage incurred by students.

STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

All students attending this School are covered against accidental injury under a 'Student Accident Insurance Plan'. Details of benefits and costs are available from the Business Manager.

STATIONERY, BOOKS AND EQUIPMENT

Booklists are provided prior to the commencement of Term 1. Secondary Lists should be completed and purchases of new books should be made from the various retailers or the School's preferred supplier.

LEAVE

Families are strongly urged not to take family holidays or overseas trips during term time, as it causes disruption to the student's educational programme.

If it is absolutely necessary for families to take holidays during term time, it would be far more preferable if the student was absent from school at the start of the term rather than the end. This especially applies to Secondary students as an absence in Term 2 and Term 4 may interfere with the examination programme, and students will not be permitted to write examinations at another time.

The Policy states that no refund or remission of fees will be provided for the time of prolonged absence from school for reasons other than illness.

Parents need to be aware that a place will be held at the School for a student who is absent for a prolonged period of time for a reason other than illness, only if the parents pay the School Fees plus the Commonwealth and State Grants which the School would forego, and the student will not be enrolled in another school in Australia. Parents should speak with the Business Manager before making firm plans.
