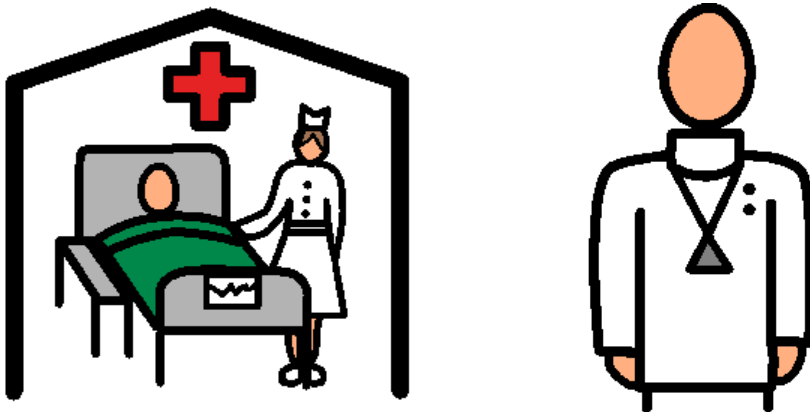


IV Access & Medications/Fluids

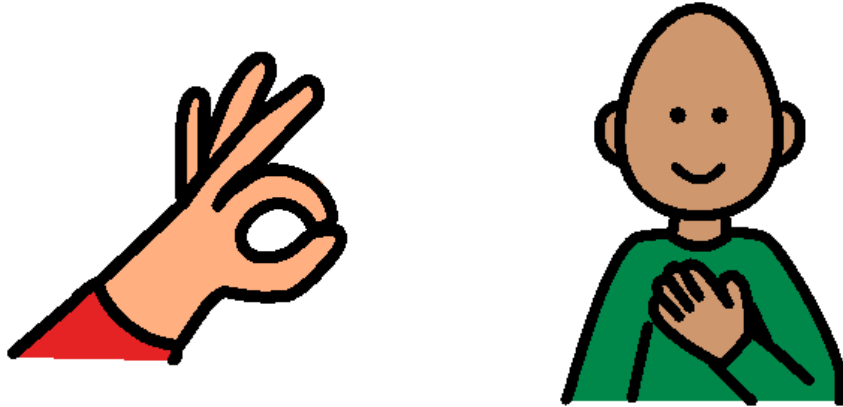
Sometimes I get sick or hurt.

This is okay because the doctor can help me feel better.



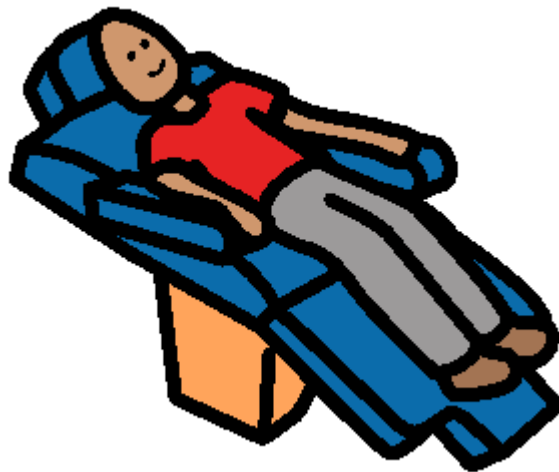
The doctor may give me medication or fluids to help me feel better.



To do this, the doctor may need to put a small plastic tube in my arm.



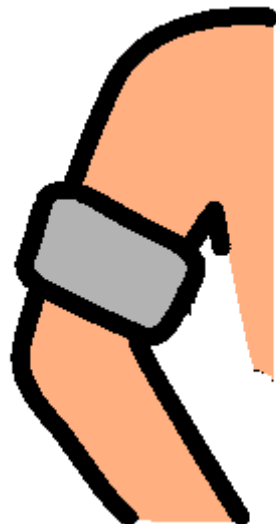
I will need to sit or lie still on the hospital bed.

The doctor will clean my arm with a cold wipe.



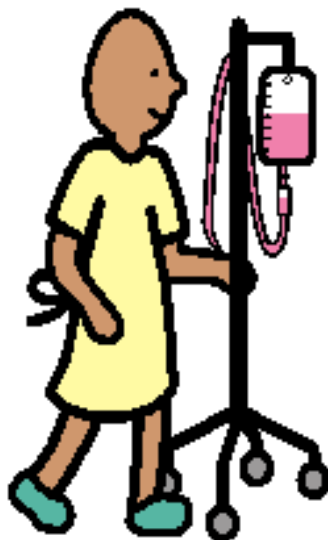
The doctor will put the small plastic tube attached to a needle in my arm. I will feel a sharp scratch. This is okay, because it won't last long.



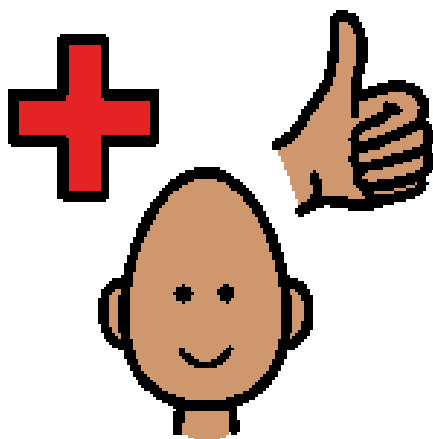
The doctor will put a bandage over the tube in my arm so it will not move.
