No pools which makes it great for all ages. ✓ There is also a BMX track and winding pathways around the track 	<p>FREE</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ There is limited shade so remember to bring something to protect you from the sun. ✓ Suitable for all ages but keep in mind that this is a very busy place in the summer and can be quite noisy. ✓ Remember to bring your scooters or bikes if you wish to go on the BMX trail. ✓ Bring a football or a cricket set too- there is a large grassed area and that could be fun. ✓

Yanchep lagoon Day Trip & Yanchep Flying Fox Yanchep Western Australia 6035 Fyling fox: Amberton Estate, Eglinton</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Yanchep Lagoon is about an hours drive from the city. ✓ Beautiful lagoon for swimming, snorkelling, fishing and exercising. ✓ Stop off at the Flying Fox on the way back to the city. ✓ There is also a space net and a few small play features in the sand area 	<p>FREE</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ It is an hour out of the city so perhaps take a few things that you wouldn't normally worry about for a quick outing. Maybe some lunch, change of clothes, etc.. ✓ The playground is still under development so no toilets available.

Healthcote Park has a Pirate Ship Playground Duncraig Road Applecross.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Huge pirates ship, with slides, swings, cubbies and hidden holes. ✓ Beautiful views of the Swan River ✓ If the pirate ship is too big for smaller children there are other activities. 	<p>FREE</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Perhaps suited for older children as it is difficult to keep an eye on little ones. ✓ Limited car parking. Some families have to park far away and walk into the park. ✓ Has all the amenities- toilets, BBQ's, shade and picnic tables.

Hyde Park Water Park & Playground Vincent Street, North Perth</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Water Park equipped with cannons, sprays and buckets that fill up with water and tip out their contents. ✓ The playground at Hyde Park has a disabled swing and a wheel chair swing (however the City Administrator has to be contacted to unlock the swing) 	<p>FREE</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ The water park is located under a large shady tree, but the playground gets plenty of sun. There is a BBQ and large gazebo. ✓ A playground is also located about 150 meters from the water playground. There have been some reviews about the water having high chlorine content- perhaps bring some goggles or remind your children to keep their eyes closed. ✓ The playground is located near a lake, keep children in sight.

Play I-spy or tick off the animals you have spotted on the bird's posters. ✓ Beware of snakes in the summer. ✓ See the website for upcoming events like the 'Swap Safari Holiday Adventure,' please contact them for more information.
