Helping students find sources

Some of the lessons, worksheets and assessments in *Migration Stories* require that students find their own sources, such as those listed below.

Pictorial sources

The National Archives of Australia website is an excellent place to start looking for Australian images (see above for the website address). Other images can be found at online newspaper archives, image archives such as Getty Images or at the websites listed above. Images can also be found using your preferred search engine, but make sure that these images can be identified with a date and a title. Nonfiction books, such as those listed above, may also contain useful pictorial sources.

Text sources

Primary sources

The immigration and refugee websites listed above contain transcripts and summaries of interviews with migrants and refugees. Nonfiction books, such as those listed above, may also contain useful primary text sources.

Secondary sources

The websites and nonfiction books listed above contain a lot of useful information on migration. Students' local libraries and school libraries may have additional titles.

Artefacts

Many students may have suitable artefacts relating to migration at home. Other artefacts can be found at the museums listed above. If it is not possible to visit museums, many museum websites have information about holdings.
